

a note from your pastor ...

This month we begin the season of Lent – a time of preparation, penitence, and reflection leading toward the events of Holy Week. On *February* 17^{th} , we will be ob-

serving Ash Wednesday with a "Drive-Thru Ash Wednesday" experience during the day, and hosting a virtual Ash Wednesday service that evening.

The "Drive-Thru Ash Wednesday" experience will take place at the church from 4pm to 6pm. Entering from Vine and exiting to Locust, you'll tune your car radios to 91.5 FM, pull under the canopy at the east entrance, and be greeted by me. I'll give a brief explanation of how things will go, come out to the car to administer the ashes and give you the communion elements, come back in to administer the elements, and send you on your way.

Once we're done there, you'll head back home and tune in at 7pm for our virtual Ash Wednesday service – available on Facebook, Zoom, and via telephone.

At that point, we'll begin a Lenten season unlike anything any of us have *ever* experienced. But just like our forebears who hid and worshipped to protect themselves from persecution, we will worship at a distance to protect our communities and ourselves. However, this does not mean that we get to take the season off from our responsibilities as the body of Christ to prepare ourselves anew for a faithfully lived life. We soldier on as the body of Christ – in whatever form we are currently able – further preparing ourselves for the moment we can all be together again.

And that time is coming.

I get my second does of the COVID vaccine on the 15th. While I am not a medical professional or an octogenarian, I was fortunate to be considered a first responder by the state of Indiana, which allowed me to get my first dose. They are continually opening the vaccine up to more and more groups. Supplies of the vaccine remain in the air, but multiple companies are developing multiple vaccines that will begin to multiply the number of people begin vaccinated. It will still be some time, but it will not be forever.

This Lenten season, you get to prepare not just for Lent, but for a new time on the other side of this pandemic. There will still be untold sorrow brought on by this virus, but we are beginning to see glimmers of hope. Let that hope carry you through this and ever day...until we meet again.

Transition vs Transformation

When my daughter graduated college with her undergraduate degree, I decided to surprise her by making t-shirts for the family. So it was time to get the old creative juices flowing. Before the cricut became popular, you could go to the craft stores and purchase a type of printer paper to create iron-on transfers. The plan was that half way through the ceremony, we

would change from our regular attire into a homemade t-shirt with a message that celebrated her special day. This was a day of transition. The day in which she would step into a new world of possibilities that would define her future.

To make a transition suggests that there has been a change of place or position. We have progressed from one phase of life into another. Some examples of what it means to transition are a toddler who has finally mastered the art of walking or taking the next strategic move in a game of chess. Or better still, for the blossoming teen getting your driver's license. Transitions allow us to move from here to there. Transitions allow us to move through stages of development. Transitions modulate the musical notes of sound and the rhythmic ups and downs in our lives.

But Christ does not desire for us to simply move through the various stages of our lives. Christ desires transformation. When we enter a state of transformation. we embark upon a process that alters us for more effective utilization is God's plan for our lives. Thus the relationship we have built leads to a change or renewal from a life that no longer conforms to the ways of the world. Transformation leads us into a life that pleases God. The Bible in the book of **Romans 12:2** it states" *And do not be conformed to this world [any longer with its superficial values and customs], but be transformed and progressively changed [as you mature spiritually] by the renewing of your mind [focusing on godly values and ethical attitudes], so that you may prove [for yourselves] what the will of God is, that which is good and acceptable and perfect [in His plan and purpose for you].*"

To achieve this level of relationship with our Lord and Savior is to be truly transformed in Christ. We are no longer slaves to this world, but forever a servant for the glory of God. **2 Corinthians 5:17** tells us "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come."

When we go through transformation, we are no longer the caterpillar. We are butterflies. We are not the house on the hill. We are the castle in the sky. We are not pigeons. We are eagles and we soar.

Take this time to ask God to allow you to soar.

- Trust God to do what you are unable to do
- Looks to the Lord for guidance
- And says, yes, to the sacred adventure that comes from a life with Christ..

In the powerful words from Thomas Merton, "My Lord God, I have no idea where I am going. I do not see the road ahead of me. I cannot know for certain where it will end. nor do I really know myself, and the fact that I think I am following your will does not mean that I am actually doing so. But I believe that the desire to please you does in fact please you. And I hope I have that desire in all that I am doing. I hope that I will never do anything apart from that desire."


