A Message from Bishop Trimble...

"For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free—and we were all made to drink of one Spirit. Indeed, the body does not consist of one member but of many." -1 Corinthians 12:12-14 (NRSV)

United Methodists are all over the world, and many of us call Indiana our home. We are "Living as those who are sent to share the life-changing love of Jesus Christ in our mission field." We are liturgical, contemporary, charismatic, traditional. We are urban, rural, suburban, young, and old. We care deeply for the lost, the least, the lonely, the hungry, and the hurting.

We are a holy communion of different races, ethnicities, cultures, and perspectives united by the Holy Spirit, called and driven by the mission of Christ, bearing the good news of an unmerited grace that changes lives and transforms communities.

These are the words of John Wesley from the Character of a Methodist. Rooted in scripture, centered in Christ, The United Methodist Church while united in essentials is not fearful of change nor the ministry of reconciliation or the challenge to adapt to a new season. COVID-19 has taught us that a pandemic cannot stop the mission, and we celebrate reaching people who previously had not come to our church buildings.

All of our members, clergy, and local churches will continue to have a home in the future United Methodist Church, whether they consider themselves centrist, liberal, evangelical, progressive, conservative, or just plain old people-loving, Bible-loving Christians. Some of us are relatively new to the Church, and some of us are lifelong United Methodists too busy singing "Lord I want to be a Christian in my heart" to sign up for a promised "Global Methodist Church" or another newly-organized church where human sexuality and local church independence is no longer a matter of disagreement.

At some point in the future, local churches will decide their desired allegiance. I pray all will be led by prayer and honest discernment, not charts and narratives about a new church that grants more independence and less connectional mission.

In this protracted season of uncertainty, I am not uncertain as to how we should treat one another. We treat one another with dignity and respect as reflected in our Christian Guidelines #10 "Allow the fruit of the Spirit to permeate our way of interacting with others: Love, Joy, Peace, Patience, Kindness, Generosity, Faithfulness, Gentleness and Self-Control."

Yes, we are clear about the main thing, and our vision is not clouded. We want to support and grow fruitful leaders, vibrant congregations, faithful disciples of Jesus, who are transforming the world. The United Methodist Church in Indiana will continue to be part of the UMC movement that is a Church confident in what God has done in Christ Jesus for all humankind and committed to personal and social salvation/transformation.

As we pay attention to our mission as the "main thing," we realize it gives direction to other missional commitments:

- Helping persons grow in their Christian discipleship as we mature and multiply disciples
- Investing in Children Matter Most
- Dismantling the powers of fear, racism, and scarcity
- Living with Holy Spirit power as missional, accountable, called, baptized community connected in shared mission and ministry

May we be ever mindful that the Church exists for others. In our state of Indiana, nearly 4 million have no church home. Let us live out our mission by making disciples for Jesus Christ. The harvest is plentiful, friends. "God put everything under Christ's feet and made him head of everything in the church, which is his body. His body, the church, is the fullness of Christ, who fills everything in every way." -Ephesians 1:22-23 (CEB)

Apply to Serve as Equalization Member for Annual Conference

Lay members in addition to local church lay leaders and lay representatives to Annual Conference are needed to achieve a balance between clergy and laity at each year's Annual Conference Session (as required by the UMC Book of Discipline). These additional voting members to Annual Conference are called Equalization Members. This year's Indiana Annual Conference Session will be held June 9-11, 2022 (location to be determined). The theme will be Love God, Love Neighbor (Matthew 22:36-40).

Each layperson who is interested in participating as a voting Equalization Member for the Indiana United Methodist Annual Conference Session is required to complete a Willingness to Serve form. Forms for the 2022 Annual Conference Session are now open for completion and submission online. Forms must be submitted online no later than February 2 at 11:59pm ET/10:59pm CT.

Covid-19 Safety Protocols Update







The omicron variant is surging in our region, and the virus now has affected many families in our congregation, prompting some reminders and changes to the church's Covid-19 safety protocols:

- Masks are required in the building at all times for everyone age 2 and above. If you do not arrive with a mask, one will be provided. Wearing a mask provides a layer of protection for others as well as for yourself. This is especially important when you are around individuals who are unvaccinated, especially children under age 5 who are not yet eligible for the vaccine.
- If you have **cold or flu-like symptoms**, please stay home to avoid spreading your germs to others. Do not settle for a self-diagnosis; assume you may be infected with Covid until an antigen or PCR test proves otherwise.
- If you or someone in your family **tests positive for Covid**, notify the church office so we can perform as much contact tracing as possible to protect others.
- Fellowship and refreshments in the parlor following the 10:30 worship service has been temporarily suspended, at least through the end of January. This decision will be revisited when the positivity rate in our area begins to decline.
- Many committees and groups that resumed in-person meetings in 2021 may be temporarily shifting to Zoom or cancelling meetings. Check the Sunday bulletin and contact your group's leadership or the church office if you have questions.

Hope is the Thing with Feathers



Hope is the thing with feathers
That perches in the soul,
And sings the tune without the words,
And never stops at all...

"Hope is the little bird inside us that refuses to be silenced... It is what sustains us. It's the thing that won't give up..." (A. Kava) Hope is listening to that small, still voice that whispers in your ear saving to you that no

matter what life brings your way "I will be with you."

The scripture shows that young David heard that small, still voice. When he faced Goliath, he had no concern for his opponent's enormous size and brute strength. Goliath's armor alone weighed 5000 shekels which in today's terms would be equivalent to about 125 pounds. Maybe others could be intimidated, but no, not him. He only knew that this man mocked the Israelites and sought to defy the armies of God. David wasn't having it. His response to Saul was, "Let no one lose heart on account of this Philistine; your servant will go and fight him." 1 Samuel 17:32b While tending his sheep whether confronted by lions or bears, the Lord protected David from danger. He was equally certain that the Lord would be with him on this day. David endeavored to claim victory not for himself, but for his people and his God.

Just like David, we cannot allow the bird' within to be silenced. In 2021, we've added words to our vocabulary like covid, omicron, and long-hauler. We've had professional athletes who lived in a "bubble" which can best be defined as an area within which sports teams stayed isolated from the public during the playing season to prevent exposure to covid. Or perhaps the term "doomscroller" which refers to a person who has become obsessed with following bad news. All are terms rooted in some type of negative reference.

So, where does this all leave us?

It leaves us on a path of hope. Jesus spoke these words, "I am with you always, even unto the end of the world..." **Matthew 28: 20b** While **Psalms 73: 23-26** reminds us that "(you, oh Lord) hold me by my right hand. You guide me with your counsel, and afterward you will take me into glory. Whom have I in heaven but you? And earth has nothing I desire besides you. My flesh and my heart may fail, but God is the strength of my heart and my portion forever."

Hope places grace, mercy, and forgiveness within reach of each one of us. God knows our struggles including those that occurred long ago. His desire is to make us whole. That is precisely what He does. God is just a whisper away. All we need to do is open our hearts to Him. God is the cool breeze that blows on a hot summer day. He is the fire that warms the soul when the snow falls fast and deep. He is the light that divides the dark corners of the heart when despair seeks a place to abide. So, where do we find an answer? The answer is in the soft whisper of a dove, in the flutter of his wings, perched in the soul, singing a tune without words.

Dare to pray a simple prayer:

"Create in me a clean heart, O God; and renew a right spirit within me. Cast me not away from thy presence; and take not your holy spirit from me." Amen








The Transfiguration of Jesus
