COOP'S CORNER

Summer Sermon and Film Series

Summer is here already. The temperature is rising. Kids are out of school. Vacations are on the horizon. What's not to like? It is also time for our Summer Worship Schedule – well, almost. This month we are starting late due to the fact that I will be in Portland from June 17th through the 25th for our denomination's biannual General Assembly. I have the honor to have been elected by our Presbytery to be one of its two minister commissioners to the assembly, where Elders and Pastors from all 172 Presbyteries, gather to discuss the direction our denomination will take over the next two years and beyond.

On Sunday, June 26th, we will start our Summer Worship AND I will give a very stimulating, thought provoking, fascinating, remarkably entertaining report *(okay, maybe I laid it on a little thick)* on my experience there!

Then starting with Friday, July 8th, I will begin my **SUMMER FILM AND SERMON SERIES**. Each week on Friday evening at 7:00 PM, we will watch a movie about *(or having to do with)* the "hero" that I will be preaching on that Sunday. Look for actual details in the pages to follow!

I've entitled my sermon series "Christian Heroes Through the Centuries." We will start with **Constantine**, the Roman Emperor who adopted the Christian faith and made Christianity the state religion in the Roman Empire, thereby legitimizing Christianity.

Then you will hear about one of my favorite saints of all time, **St. Francis of Assisi**. His is a remarkable story of going not from poverty to wealth, but the other way around. You will learn about the first man to make the bible available in the English language (*William Tyndale*) and his constant battle with the Pope. Then, we'll wind up the month of July by learning about the Father of Presbyterianism – **John Calvin** and TULIP.

In August, we will start off with **John** (not Paul) **Bunyan** (we are now all the way up to the 18th century) who wrote the classic, "Pilgrim's Progress." Bunyan is also the one who said, "You have not lived today until you have done something for someone who can never repay you." Next you will learn about **William Wilberforce**, a preacher and politician who singlehandedly stopped the slave trade from England to the Americas.

As we move into the twentieth century, we begin with **Dietrich Bonhoeffer**, a German pastor who stood up to Hitler during World War II and was martyred for what he believed.

Bonhoeffer will be followed by two of my favorites: **C.S. Lewis**, who wrote "The Screw Tape Letters" and "The Chronicles of Narnia," and then **Mother Teresa**, a true saint to the poor.

I will end my sermon series with my favorite pope of all time, the current pope of the Catholic Church, **Pope Francis.**

It is going to be a GREAT summer and we will learn a lot. I might even throw in a quiz here and there.

Have a wonderful summer, my friends, and when you get back from vacation, don't forget, we have a seat here for you!



Session meetings are open meetings where anyone can attend with the exception of infrequent personnel matters. Meetings are held the second Tuesday of each month starting at 6:59 PM.




ADULT ED MINISTRY
