

The two political conventions are over and neither party's candidate exudes confidence. Police around the country are shooting unarmed black men and black men are shooting police. There is terrorism exploding not just here in this country, but around the world. Climate change is no longer a theory – it is here to stay. Then there's the Zika virus.

How on earth are we to respond, when many are so scared, overwhelmed, wondering if they are next? And where is God? Why does God allow such violence, bigotry, ignorance, hatred, and suffering to exist?

Someone once said, (I can't remember who – not that unusual for me!), that that's why God made us - so we could deal with all this. God will be with us ... but we need to take responsibility. Maybe they are right.

So how do we respond, because the truth is, we must respond, right? Ann Lamott, one of my favorite Christian authors, said a couple of weeks ago: "We must respond with a show of force equal to the violence and tragedies, with love force. Mercy force. Un-negotiated compassion force. Crazy caregiving to the poor and suffering, <u>including</u> ourselves.

"Patience with a deeply irritating provocative mother. Two dollar bills to the extremely annoying guy at the intersection, who you think maybe could be working, or is going to spend your money on beer.

"Jesus didn't ask the blind man what he was going to look at after he restored the man's sight. He just gave hope and sight. He just healed."

So the question might be, "Who can you give hope and sight to today?"

And maybe we also need to be willing to stand up and say, "Enough is enough!" when politicians, friends, neighbors, family spew hate, not love; prejudice, not compassion; fear, not assurance.

We are called to love God and love one another. What is so hard about that? And yet, over and over we stand pat. We complain, we say we feel bad, we think it is unjust, but still we do nothing. Maybe it isn't that real to us, because it hasn't hit home yet. Everything is happening – over there (wherever there is).

But as Christians we can't ignore it. We need to stand up and proclaim what we believe and not only proclaim it, but stand behind it and beside it and in front of it ... and then live it out.

Love God and love one another! Just do it!

# **CHURCH AND WORLD MINISTRY**

**SCHOOL BACKPACKS**: A huge thanks to all those members and "friends" of STHPC for your donations of school supplies for 3<sup>rd</sup> to 5<sup>th</sup> grade children served by our mission partner Santa Maria Urban Ministry. Although each item may be affordable to us, the total supplies, along with the backpack itself, make for a sizable gift to a low income child. Thanks to Kate Manley and our youth group for assembling and filling the 24 backpacks and to Annie Sunseri for two extra backpacks.

The annual Peacemaking Offering - to be received on October 2, World Communion Sunday, was approved by Session at their July meeting. This year's theme is "COME TO THE TABLE OF PEACE": Can God spread a table in the wilderness? We are well aware of the violence occurring on many levels: international, domestic, local (gang, workplace), and interpersonal (domestic, bullying). Our world is broken, wild, and dangerous. But even in the wilderness, God spreads a table of peace, grace, and reconciliation. Amid violence and division in

our streets, homes and schools, God's table is set —and we are invited to participate. Come September, more resources will be shared to help you understand why funds are needed and where the offering will go. As usual, 25% will go to a local organization, working towards peacemaking or global witness, 25% to our Presbytery for similar efforts, and 50% to our national church. As Pastor Tom reflected in a recent sermon, we don't want to become numb or desensitized to violent acts we hear of in the media. What can we do as Christians to find solutions? Do you know of any effective local organizations working towards peacemaking or global witness? You can talk to any Church & World Ministry team member.

# Worship and Music Dave Robertson · Elder



# EGG PUFF

9 X 13 pan 350° for 35 - 45 minutes

10 eggs 1/2 cup flour 1 pint cottage cheese 1/2 tsp salt

1 tsp baking powder 1/2 cup melted butter

1 pound cheese (Cheddar, Swiss, Jack, Pepper

Jack - grated)

and/or 1 pound cooked meat (bacon, sausage, chorizo, ham, etc.)

and/or anything else (chilies, artichoke hearts, mushrooms, favorite spicy chili, veggies, etc)

Beat eggs before adding other ingredients. Pour into 9 X 13 inch baking dish that has been sprayed with cooking spray.

Can be made up to 3 days ahead and stored unbaked in the refrigerator.

Allow to reach room temperature before placing in oven to bake.

Bake at 350° F, for 35 - 45 minutes, or until eggs are done.


