COOP'S CORNER

The Next Four Years

The surprise, the shock, the elation, the disappointment (choose your emotion) has begun to die down a bit following Donald Trump's election as the next President of the United States.

Whether you were devastated or delighted, the result is the same. The question is, how are we, as people of faith, going to live out the next four years?

And so, here's what I hope we will be, or at the very least strive to be, in this, our church family.

True confession: much of what follows I have adapted from a sermon that my good friend, Rev. Irene Pak, a Korean American, and pastor at Stone Church, preached shortly following the election.

In this family, we will continue to stand up for the homeless, the poor, and the oppressed.

In this family, we will stand up for the rights of women and we will continue to defend the rights of our gay/lesbian/transgender members, friends, and family. And in this family, we will stand up for the rights of those who are differently abled.

In this family, we can be unashamedly Christian and proclaim that we love Jesus AND we can love and protect the freedom of religion among all of our neighbors – especially our Muslim brothers and sisters.

In this family, we will not be afraid. Okay, maybe there will be times when we will be afraid, but that will not keep us from speaking up when we see injustice.

That injustice can be when a woman is being cat called. That injustice can be when you hear someone yelling racial slurs or telling someone to go back home to where they're from. (which happened to my friend, in Willow Glen of all places.)

We acknowledge that injustice is any form of bullying or belittling of any child of God ... even one with whom we disagree.

And although we may have different views on how to handle illegal immigration, in this our church family we will strive to ensure that families are not torn apart. And that those who are law abiding, tax paying, and productive members of our society are treated fairly and with respect.

In this family, we need to learn to say that Black Lives Matter. Not because for one second we believe that all lives do not matter. Of course we believe that. But we need to learn how to say that black

lives matter, because right now in this country, if you are black or even brown, it is the truth that in the opinion of many, your lives are <u>not</u> as important; that you have been and are currently being targeted. And so, you live with more fear than those of us who are white.

We need to learn how to affirm that we hear our neighbors, friends, and family who tell us that they do not feel like they can walk through life in this country in the same way I do.

Finally, in this family, we will protect one another and keep each other safe. That does not mean we will not disagree or be conflict free. Conflict is not the enemy.

But as the Rev. Aimee Moiso recently shared: "The real question is how we will engage conflict and division in this hour. We do not have to give up our principles and integrity in order to keep the peace or acquiesce to false unity for some unnamed higher good. Conflict is here anyway. We need to decide who we want to be in the midst of it."

I have hope for the future. My hope, though, does not exist in a man (or woman). It exists in my faith in Jesus Christ.

And so, in the next four years, if you are tired, afraid, or weary, know that you can always come here to Santa Teresa Hills to gain some strength for your souls because the power and love of God through the life of Jesus is alive here, now, and always.

And we will always proclaim the two great commandments that this church stands on: Love of God and love of our neighbor (ALL OF THEM!).

Be blessed, my friends. And I look forward to seeing you on Sunday!

Cristadelphian Center for the Blind and Handicapped-a rehabilitation center for the disabled in Cameroon, needs a new water tank. We have helped them in the past and they still need our support.

Immanuel House-our Presbytery-sponsored home for vetted refugees. Although we had told the Congregation recently, of Immanuel House's request for a computer, they need some basic

furniture-such as dressers-for the residents' rooms so our gifts will go towards furniture.

Presbyterian USA Giving Catalog: Our own Youth Group, has chosen to raise funds for a WELL. Their goal is \$2,000 for the well and \$500 for accompanying water-related items. This will go to a village in a developing country. To give a well, is like "giving [the village] a fishing pole, rather than fish" with the benefits of safer drinking water and saving women the long walk to haul water jugs.

CHRISTMAS JOY OFFERING

The annual Christmas Joy Offering (Presbyterian Church USA) will be received on December 20. These funds are divided in half: with 50% going to retired Presbyterian clergy, staff and families in need, and the other 50% to racial ethnic education and leadership development. 
Session notes from November


