

Holy Week is fast approaching. Your *Worship and Music* ministry team and I are busy planning five GREAT services, four of which I hope you attend.

First up is **Palm Sunday**, **April 9**<sup>th</sup>. I will finish my sermon series on Palm Sunday trying to understand Jesus through the lens of the writings of the Apostle Paul. Paul's whole focus is on the cross and the ensuing resurrection. Very appropriate for this time of year. Not only that, but we will also have a unique Palm Sunday parade you won't want to miss.

On **Thursday**, **April 13**<sup>th</sup>, we will hold a very special **Maundy Thursday** service in the sanctuary at 7:30 PM. Maundy Thursday is the commemoration of Jesus' last supper with his disciples before he goes out to the Garden of Gethsemane and is subsequently arrested, tried, and crucified. This is the night where Jesus institutes the sacrament of communion, which we will also observe. The service this night will be simple, but profound. If you have never been to a Maundy Thursday service before, I hope that you will make an effort to attend this one.

**Friday**, **April 14**<sup>th</sup>, is **Good Friday**. Again, at 7:30 PM we will meet together to remember the sacrifice that Jesus made for all of us. Most folks would prefer to just skip this service – I mean, who wants to have to reflect on the misery and pain that Jesus had to go through? However, if we don't, we can never fully appreciate the joy of the resurrection and the celebration of Easter.

It seems odd that we call it "Good" Friday when what happened was so horrific, however, the ultimate result is certainly good. Dave Robertson and I are still putting together the service as I write this, but if Dave is involved, you know it will be worth it. In addition, the choir sings at this service, which always adds a great deal of depth to what we do.

Okay, that's three services I count on you attending. Now, I will give you a choice on the final two. **Easter Sunrise** or **Easter Traditional**.

**Easter Sunrise** will be at 6:00 AM (some wear their pajamas) and we get to experience the sunrise during the service. I think it is the most moving of all the services during Holy Week. We meet in the courtyard, so wear something warm. And to top it all off, after the service we all go out to breakfast together.

At our **Traditional Easter Service** at 10:00 AM we encourage folks to bring a flower (don't worry if you forget, we will have extras) for the flowering of the cross. How absolutely stunning the cross looks

when it is fully adorned with flowers! The choir also will be singing some very special music, and I hear the sermon is not too bad either!

So, come to one, but hopefully, four of our services this **Holy Week**. You are only depriving yourself if you don't attend. I will be looking for you.

Be blessed this sacred time of year. And my sincere prayer is that as you join us you will deepen your relationship with the Christ who gave everything so we can live again.

#### BEYOND FASTING ... JOURNEY THROUGH LENT

Lent is not only a time for self-reflection and prayer, it is also time to put our good intentions into action. Each week between Ash Wednesday and Easter we're going to focus on an action we can take to deepen our relationship with God through Jesus Christ.

Our Lenten theme is "Who Is Jesus?" Pastor Tom will examine the views of Jesus through the eyes of the Gospels and Paul. Each week we will have a "Moment for Commitment," focusing on alternative ways of moving closer to Jesus, such as saying "thank you," serving others, reading devotions, performing random acts of kindness ...

# MOMENTS FOR COMMITMENT

**March 5** Apologize to someone – Lent is a season of repentance. Ask forgiveness or apologize to someone that you know you've wronged.

March 12 Perform Random Acts of Kindness – Do something nice or unexpected like paying for the person behind you; hand out gift or food cards; talk and really listen to someone; share the love of Jesus.

**March 19 Read a Devotional** – Worship and Music will provide URLs and copies of Lenten devotionals. Read one and meditate on it.

**March 26 Tell Others You Love Them** – Some of us struggle with those three little words "I love you." Don't assume people know. Say them to someone who needs to hear it from you.

**April 2 Serve or Visit People In Need** – Help out at a nursing/rehab facility, volunteer at a charitable organization, visit with folks in nursing facilities.

**April 9 Say "Thank You"** – Thank someone who has shaped you into the person you are either in person or by way of a note. For some, this person may not be with us any longer – write them a letter anyway.



There will be a large board at the front of the Sanctuary each week, and you are invited to come up at the end of the service and commit to an action by writing it on a PostIt® and posting it. Next week come back and put a check mark by it. At the end of Lent we will see the power we have to change ourselves, and collectively change our world.

The VILLAGE HOUSE Interfaith homeless shelter: Pastor Tom & DeLynn Coop joined by Elder Linda Buckley, attended an interfaith dinner meeting Sunday evening March 19 at St. Timothy's Lutheran Church. The Village House, in its second year of operation, is a rotating churchbased shelter program housing 12-15 carefully screened homeless women. Each month one local church, like St. Julie's, hosts the women overnight while other churches commit to daytime hosting (a safe place to hang out, shower, nap). One way STHPC could participate in this effort could be to provide dinner meals or bag lunches to SUPPORT the overnight or daytime hosting congregations. We heard some very inspirational stories of churches that took a leap of faith and discovered the congregation "gained more than the guests (the homeless women)" from this exchange.



#### The 3rd Annual Music in the Parks at STHPC

This year, STHPC will be a host venue for two Music in the Parks festivals. Dates for the festivals are **Saturdays - May 6<sup>th</sup> and May 13<sup>th</sup>**. This is a unique program where choirs and bands perform and are judged in the morning and then head to an amusement park for fun and awards. STHPC will be hosting choirs at our venue. The students will then go to Great America afterward.

Hosting Music in the Parks is not only community service; it also **brings in \$500 per event for STHPC**, plus sales made at the concessions table. However, hosting requires more than just opening our doors to the choirs; we need to staff this event as well. Robin DeJarnett is coordinating the event, but she needs some help. Here are some of the jobs you can volunteer for:



**Set up/tear down**: Prepare the sanctuary and fellowship hall for the festival before and for worship after. Some setup will happen either Thursday or Friday before.

**Sound/stage managers**: Set up and monitor the sound systems in the sanctuary and fellowship hall. Manage mics and stage crew.

**Registration**: Check in the choirs and distribute tickets. Sell extra tickets to Great America.

**Bus Greeter**: Meet the buses at the curb and direct the choirs to the entrance. Direct buses to parking on Chynoweth.

**Concessions**: Set up and sell candy, donuts, coffee, and Music in the Parks t-shirts.

**Announcer**: Announce the choirs on stage.

**Choir Guides**: Escort choirs from the bus to warm up to performance (usually students).

**Judges Care**: Provides the judges with water, pencils (if necessary), and runs any forms that may be needed (usually a student).

**Door monitors:** Make sure performances are not interrupted by people coming in and out.

Many of these jobs can be done by either adults or teens. Teens who volunteer will receive credit for their volunteer time. We will also be coordinating with Santa Teresa High School for volunteers, so some of our volunteers will already have experience working a Music in the Parks festival.



#### VISIBILITY/ SESSION NOTES.

#### Session Notes from March

- 1). Chris De La Roca was Ordained and Installed as a Deacon on March 12, 2017
- 2). STHPC must annually elect the Church Treasurer. Libby Souter was elected to extend her service and she graciously agreed.
- 3). 3D Preschool has proposed putting a trailer beyond the Fellowship Hall to be used for additional classroom space. They will pay all costs associated with this and STHPC will benefit from the increased rent to be charged (~\$2500/month). Session agreed in principal pending additional information (city planning, pre-school licensing).
- 4). The 2017 budget was reviewed and approved. We will have a balanced budget!
- 5). The paid employees performance reviews were presented and all will receive a 3.5% increase retroactive to Jan 1. The pastor's compensation package was reviewed and approved at the congregational meeting on March 19.

#### **Visibility Update**

- 1). The youth have proposed a new banner to replace the existing one (4' X 8'). In addition they have purchased 3 floating flags to be placed in the front lawn. It will be difficult for anyone driving by NOT to recognize our church!
- 2). The latest newsletters and copies of sermons are always available on the website as well as a video of the most recent sermon. Please check these out.

#### PRESBYTERIAN WOMEN

In March, our 6<sup>th</sup> lesson of the 'Who is Jesus' PW bible study had us looking at the Book of Hebrews and how Jesus was portrayed as greater than any other figure who had come before him. Hebrews demonstrated the majesty and perfection of Jesus, and also the relational, personal earthly nature of Jesus. The author of Hebrews calls us to be strong in the faith, as many at the time of the writing were in great need of assurance and comfort as they struggled in their decision to follow Christ.



Our next STHPC PW meeting will be on Tuesday, April 18 from 7:30 PM-9 PM. All women are invited to come to our PW meetings. We meet in the Multi-Purpose room at the church. At our April meeting, we will be doing lesson #7 of our PW study, 'Who is Jesus' and we will be exploring thru the lens of the non-Canonical gospels. Other stories about Jesus circulated in the early centuries of Christianity, offering us accounts of the "missing years" of Jesus and give us insight into the diversity of early Christianity.

I just received the copy of 2017/2018 PW Bible Study. It is entitled 'Cloud of Witnesses: The Community of Christ in Hebrews'. Melissa Bane Sevier is the author of this study and she was asked to approach Hebrews through the lenses of peace, peacemaking and hope and to feature stories of women who have been witnesses to faith. I am looking forward to this bible study, which we will start in the Fall.

## CONGREGATIONAL MEETING NOTES

Notes from the Annual Congregational Meeting – March 19, 2017

- 1). Total active membership as of December 2016 was 130.
- 2). 2017 budget was presented with expenses of \$297,607 and projected income of \$300,238. Surplus to be allocated to Two Month Reserve.
- 3). Pastor Tom's salary package was passed by the congregation. Salary and housing \$99,101 and benefit payments of \$51,870 (includes benefits, expenses and Study Leave, etc.) for a total of \$150,971.
- 4). Audit Committee report noted a satisfactory completion of the 2015 audit.
- 5). Cathy Williams, Dave Robertson, and Robin DeJarnett were elected to serve on the 2017 Audit Committee.
- 6). Horace Hines, Jerry McMinn, and Yvonne Miller were elected to serve on the 2017 Nominating Committee.
