

The Reason for the Season

As we begin this month of December, we also begin a new year in the Christian calendar. Advent, the season that starts the Christian year, begins (or began, depending on when you read this) on December 3rd this year.

That is the latest it can ever start, because it puts the fourth Sunday of Advent squarely on Christmas Eve. More on that later.

Most of us know that Advent is the period starting with the four Sundays that precede (and help us prepare us for) Christmas. But, to be honest, Advent suffers from neglect.

Many of us tend to skip Advent entirely and start celebrating Christmas before Thanksgiving. We get so caught up in the frenzy of secular preparations -- parties, shopping and decorating -- that we forget the true meaning of Advent.

There is a story of a little boy who was helping his father set up the Christmas decorations. As an inquisitive four-year old he barraged his father with questions. The father was so busy that he failed to pay attention to his son.

Finally, the little boy asked, "Daddy, what does ignore mean?" The father was taken aback and explained, "Ignore means not to pay attention when people talk to you."

The little boy then asked, "Why do we ignore Jesus?"

Puzzled, the father answered, "I don't think we do. Why do you say that we ignore him?"

The little boy answered, "Because that's what the Christmas carol says, O come let us **ignore** him." Do we "ignore" Christ in our preparations for Christmas? Are we so wrapped up in the busyness of the holidays that we only remember Christ on those Advent Sundays, if then?

It is so easy to do. Our culture demands from us attention on everything but Christ during these days. Our children expect us to focus on the shopping and the buying and the decorating. And we don't disappoint.

So, my invitation this Advent season is that we don't "ignore" Jesus and what he means to us.

Now I don't expect you to spend the same time on Jesus as you do on the rest of your "preparations." But, if you will just take some time each day to focus on "the reason for the season" I think you will be surprised how much more meaningful this season can be.

To assist you, we will be doing some pretty special things this Advent.

On the First Sunday of Advent, since I will be visiting my son Austin in Chicago, you will be in the hands of one of my favorite preachers and an all-around good guy, Rev. George Minerva. It is this Sunday where the Christmas tree, lit by 100's of sparkling white lights, makes its first appearance.

Then I will begin my Advent sermon series the following Sunday on the 10th of December: "Christmas Through the Eyes of Angels." We will look through the eyes of the angel who appears to Zechariah (who was to become John the Baptist's dad). In addition, we will have the children's Christmas pageant that morning. You don't want to miss that!

On the 17th we will look through the eyes of the angel who appears to first to Mary and then to Joseph. Plus, it will not only be our choir Christmas concert, but you, too, will get to sing Christmas carols, sip cider, and eat Christmas cookies after the service.

And then on the evening of the 24th – you guessed it- we will join with the heavenly chorus of angels as they proclaim our Savior's birth

Christmas Eve we will have THREE services.

The first service, at our regular time of 10:00 a.m., will be in a "Lessons and Carols" format, where we will be singing familiar carols and reading the Christmas story.

The second, at 7:30 p.m. on Christmas Eve, will be a candlelight and communion service, featuring our choir.

And the final service at 11:00 p.m., will also be a candlelight and communion service, but instead of the choir, we will have very special music from some of our choir members. It is also the service which flows past midnight into the early hour of December 25th, *Christmas* – which makes it my personal favorite. Join us, if you can stay up that late!

I will be at all three services (naturally) and I hope you will join us for at least one, hopefully two, and maybe for all three!

And ... may each of you feel the presence of the one whose birth we celebrate and may it make a difference in your lives.

May you all experience the joy, peace, hope, and love that Christ offers each of us this Advent season and always.

Welcome to "Alternative Christmas Giving". Instead of a sweater, small appliance, or a gift card, give them a gift that truly comes from the heart - the gift of helping those in need. What could be more Christ-like at Christmas? This year, we have 3 wonderful programs in need of your support.

- Contributions to our Annual Cameroon Project will supply the Bethel Orphanage in Bamenda, Cameroon, with needed supplies for the children that live there full time and those who come for a short time. This is to be in a safe, caring environment. Never underestimate the power of clean sheets, clothing, school supplies and a good meal.
- The refugees/residents of Immanuel House come to the U.S. with just the clothes on their backs. They are fleeing from political, religious, or other forms of persecution, and/or

the ravages of war. They can never go home, and they hope for a better life in America, which many see as the "land of opportunity". The house accommodates up to 14 refugees and as you can imagine, 14 people working toward independence and becoming productive citizens need a lot of support and supplies. Your contribution will go to a variety of household supplies, and even toward supporting residents as the transition from Immanuel House and into a home of their own.

 "You give a poor man a fish and you feed him for a day. You teach him to fish and you give him an occupation that will feed him for a lifetime." (Chinese proverb.). Our Youth Group project takes this a step further, and knows not everyone likes fish. Their goal is to raise \$1,300 to purchase a "Farm Bundle". It provides a deserving family chickens, goats, and other livestock, as well as vegetable and fruit seeds, plus the training to manage it all properly. This is done through the Presbyterian Church (USA) Giving Catalog. It's the gift of independence and self-sufficiently.


