

Roofing Update and Fund: It's finally time to replace the original roof (leaky) and skylight (cracked) over our Sanctuary, offices, and classrooms. 31 years on a 30-year roof is not bad. Session has approved a contract for up to \$60,000. The work will take place in August. While we have the church assets to cover this, Session has authorized a Designated Fund ("Roofing Fund") for members who can help defray the expense. 

SESSION NOTES

The Mission Study, previously approved by the Session, was approved by the Presbytery Committee on Ministry (COM). This allowed us to form our Pastor Nominating Committee which was elected at the Congregational meeting on April 7. The members are Horace Hines, chairperson; Mary Azah; Constance Ebanda; Mike Manley, secretary; Mary Paterson; Barry Pumphrey, vice chairperson; Libby Souter, secretary; and Frank Bernstein (COM). We have been meeting weekly to fill out STHPC's Ministry Information Form (MIF). After COM approves our MIF, it will be put on the PCUSA web site in June or July to start advertising for pastor candidates.

The Session voted to change the number of elders on session from 12 to 7. We want the different ministry teams to function as committees with several members and bring any required actions to session. The ministry teams will now be Administration (Finance/Stewardship/Personnel), Buildings & Grounds, Church & World, Education (children, youth and adult), Fellowship, Membership/Visibility/Outreach, and Worship & Music.

We approved an addendum to the 3D Preschool lease that includes the rental of the trailer space and increased utilities. The monthly payments for 2019 will be \$9,424 including utilities. Copier charges are billed separately.

Session meetings are the second Tuesday of each month and open except for limited personnel matters. They start at 6:59.
