CHURCH AND WORLD MINISTRY

A Different Type of Giving - Alternative Christmas

The Alternative Christmas projects were very successful due to everyone's generosity. The first project was to help the Cameroon refugees in the Anglophone area of the country. There is a non-profit, Association of the Deaf and Vulnerable, which helps those who have been abandoned as families have fled to the forest or across the border to Nigeria. You provided \$1120 to help them.

The youth chose 5 projects from the PCUSA giving catalog. They were: bags of moringa seeds, bunk beds for children, families of chickens, container gardens, and community irrigation water pumps. You provided \$1885, which surpassed their goal of \$1600. These projects will help many people!

The 12 backpacks for the homeless will be finished on Sunday, Jan. 12th. The C&W committee worked on them Jan. 9 to get things in order. We have \$234 left in our budget to help provide supplies we might be missing.

JOY Offering

We received \$815 for the Joy Offering on December 22. 50% of this offering goes to help students at "Presbyterian-related schools and colleges equipping communities of color". The other 50% goes to "assist current and retired church workers and their families with critical financial needs."





This was a busy fall for the choir as we participated in the Hymn Sing concert at Advent Lutheran Church in October, collaborated with the Trinity Presbyterian Church choir in November, and prepared lots and lots (and lots) of music for Advent and Christmas. It was so much fun for Evie and I to collaborate putting together the "Great Joy" cantata in December that we are planning on two more services of music and the spoken word this spring. On Sunday, February 16th, we will hold another Hymn Sing Sunday like we had over the summer. This time, though, the choir will pick their favorite hymns. We will all sing them together and share stories about them. Later in the spring, we are thinking about another music service that might feature a musical style we don't often hear in worship. Stay tuned!

One of my musical goals for the choir this spring is to continue to explore the music of other eras and cultures. Our pianist, Tiffany Shi, expressed an interest in singing something by a Russian composer, so we will be singing an anthem we have in our library by the great early 19th-century composer Dmitri Bortniansky. (Luckily for the director and choir, the anthem is in English.) We will also look at music from Latin America and new music by contemporary female composers.

Do you have any musical goals for the New Year? Maybe one of them is to do some more singing and try out singing in the choir! Would you consider making a short-term commitment by joining the choir to sing just during Lent and Holy Week? Lent starts on Sunday, March 1st and concludes with Easter Sunday on April 12th. I'd be happy to talk to you if you have any questions.

Enjoy the rest of the holiday season, and I'll see you in worship!
