EMANATIONS FROM EVIE

A Superpower

Not long ago, I read an article about kindness. The article lifted up Mother Teresa as an example of someone who was profoundly kind. When I was a young pastor serving in Sunnyvale I had the great privilege of meeting Mother Teresa. She had come to the South Bay Area on a speaking tour and the organizers of the tour wanted pastors from the area to come and sit on the stage behind her as she spoke. Though I was a junior member of the pastoral staff of the church, at the time I was the only pastor available to attend the event. I readily accepted the invitation.

Following her speech, Mother Teresa took time to individually meet and greet each of us who had made up her backdrop of local religious representatives. What I remember most about that meeting was how small and gentle and genuine the woman was.

The article on kindness said,

“We revere Mother Teresa as a great person, but as she continually said, we are not called to do great things; we are called to do ordinary things with great love. We marvel at her impact on the world, when the only power she had was her kindness. But we shouldn't marvel. Hidden in simple kindness is the power to change a situation, change a life, change the world. What is God's power in the world, even the power to create the universe, but God's overflowing kindness? All the great spiritual teachers tell us this: that loving kindness is not a little thing, or even an ordinary thing. It is a superpower.” (Steve Garnaas-Holmes, *Unfolding Light*)

The superpower of kindness. How true this is. We don't often think of kindness as a superpower but we should. Mother Teresa, with her petite demeanor and quiet voice, appeared to be anything but powerful, yet she did change lives and changed the world for many people. We have that same superpower; the ability to share God's love and care with others. The ability to be kind.

We often forget we have the power. Forget what a difference a simple act of kindness can make. Recent research has found that witnessing an act of kindness, even to a stranger, increases a person's compassion toward others. Kindness is even contagious!

You and I may not be up for sainthood any time soon but we can be bearers of God's love and grace. Where will you use your kindness superpower today?

Some went through about 36 boxes of oil and spices – separating them. Two people put together the food boxes for clients. It is always an interesting place to work.

Mojoko's Offering

The offering taken at Mojoko's Birthday Celebration was for mission projects, local and in Cameroon (e.g. to help a maternity hospital). Church and World voted that the entire offering (\$2700) be given to the

Cameroon projects. Many thanks to all who contributed to this offering.

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA)

We put in an announcement in the bulletin to request donations to help PDA with their work in the Bahamas after Hurricane Dorian. PDA tends to stay and help in various areas for the long haul, not just providing supplies and leaving. We received \$2880! Many thanks to everyone for their generosity!

"Initially, the Presbyterian Disaster Assistance is sending relief in the Bahamas is in the form of a Solidarity Grant. PDA is working with Bahamas Methodist Habitat, [ACT Alliance](#) and [Church World Service](#) in the Bahamas; and stateside, with Southeastern Presbyteries in the path of Dorian, such as the [Presbytery of Charlotte](#)." Peacemaking Offering

The peacemaking offering was taken on October 6 – Worldwide Communion Sunday. The total amount received was \$955. 25% of that is \$238.75 and with the \$137 from last year we will donate \$375.75 to the Bill Wilson Center to help local youth. Thanks to all those who donated to help make peace in the world.

November and December Activities

 - Local project – we will be asking for supplies or monetary donations for supplies to fill 12 backpacks for the homeless. The backpacks will be packed in January for Kristie to hand out to those in need.

3. Repair Projects: New stove and microwave in the kitchen; sprinklers extended to Meditation Garden and many broken heads replaced; new secure door with window for the multi-purpose room.
4. Church Sign Status: still waiting for quotes for a permanent monument-style sign.
5. Thanks to our small army of volunteers! Thanks for repair projects big and small and participating in the October work party.

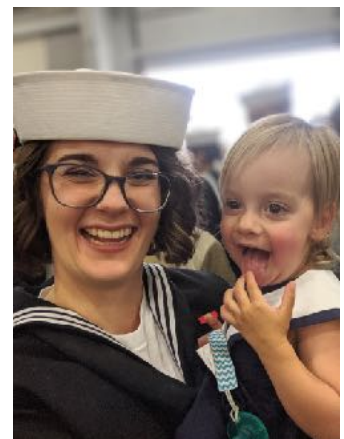
Things that Make Us Happy
