
Executive Summary

- 414 completed surveys of 801 invitations
- Majority of respondents were **female**
- •70% of respondents had 2 or less family member attendees
- Sunday worship has seen almost no drop-off
- 33% of respondents are willing to return immediately with some precautions
- 2:1 online to in-person worship
- Parents place a high priority on most precautions for children's and youth

R&R Survey Respondent Demographics


Two-thirds of survey respondents are female.




Respondents cluster into middle-age and younger seniors.

30% of respondents have 3 or more family members who attend WPC




How many in your household attend

Do you have school-age children who attend Westminster services or programs?




The elementary school group dominates among respondents with school-age children.

Sunday worship has seen almost no drop-off since COVID, with frequency of attendance unchanged.


Please indicate which program or ministry you have been involved in both pre- and post-COVID 19. Check all that apply.

Please indicate your average attendance of services both pre- and post-COVID-19.



Activities for older members have seen similar drop-offs.






Returning to Worship



People are almost universally willing to take a number of precautions in worship.


What precautions would you be willing to take when you return to a worship service? Select all that apply:

And there is surprisingly little variation by age.



Returning to Worship


Masks and hand sanitizer are key to people feeling comfortable returning to church, as are the availability of a vaccine or treatment for COVID.





Would you be willing to attend a service:





Attend worship in-person most of the time


Split time between in-person worship and online worship

Looking six months ahead, people likely to attend mostly online worship outnumber those likely to attend mostly in-person worship by almost two-to-one ...





Attend online worship most of the time




