#### MUSIC NOTES

As we celebrate All Saints Day the voluntaries and anthem present a Nashville theme. Eric Near, DPC's composer-in-residence, has written a piece for organ and brass quartet. Eric writes:

Agonizomai comes from the Greek term for conflict or struggle. The English word agony has a common origin, but the meaning has changed over time. The word is used in the New Testament many times to denote striving or effort, perhaps most noticeably in 1 Timothy 4:10 - "For it is for this we labor and strive, because we have fixed our hope on the living God, who is the Savior of all men, especially of believers."

This piece was originally written for brass quintet but has been adapted for use at DPC for organ, trumpet, horn, trombone, and tuba.

The opening voluntary and offertory anthem are composed by Nashville natives. Craig Phillips composed *Arioso* in memory of Peter and Lois Fyfe and released the score this spring. Dr. Phillips currently serves as director of music and organist at All Saints' Church, Beverly Hills, CA. Richard Webster composed *Abide With Me* in 2001 when he was choirmaster and organist at St. Luke's Episcopal Church in Evanston, IL. Mr. Webster is currently director of music and organist at Trinity Church, Copley Square, Boston. Phillips, Webster and I all studied organ and church music with Peter Fyfe, who served as choirmaster and organist at Christ Church Cathedral here in Nashville, just blocks away from DPC. Mr. Fyfe's wife, Lois, composed the descant for our opening hymn.
