We enjoyed a wonderful intimacy in the Chapel that feels very different from the "big room." The smaller space certainly put us in closer physical proximity; we might describe the feeling as "comfortably full." It also put us closer together aurally - we could hear each other better and consequently sing and do liturgy with greater confidence, volume and enthusiasm. Of course much of that has to do with William's pre-worship singing workshops that have gone a long way to building our enthusiasm and confidence in singing. And while it may be a less tangible measure, we also experienced a spiritual and emotional intimacy that flows out of simply sitting close to other people.

Our hope is that you'll want to continue to worship close to those folks whose voices and spirits have surrounded you this summer. Like all new efforts, we know this will take some getting used to. So after a few weeks we'll evaluate how things are working and refine our practice.

And we are not simply going to let empty pews sit fallow. The Worship & Arts committee is working on ways we can transform parts of the sanctuary into spaces for prayer and meditation, art projects, kid-friendly zones and more.

Our summer worship in the Chapel was amazing! Let's do everything we can to continue that extraordinary enthusiasm in the Sanctuary and have a great fall!
