Joint Meeting of the Finance and Building and History Committees June 9, 2019 at the Downtown Presbyterian Church

I. Building and History

- a. Upcoming costs:
 - i. \$1,200: Bible display case in History Room
 - ii. \$2,200: Wrought iron gate and fence repair plus locking enhancement **To** keep out the random vandals.
 - iii. \$25,000: Chapel renovation continues with wood and concrete floor, final payment on chairs **This will be the full payment completion of the chape!** Paid off!
- b. The Cohen building wants to use some of our parking lot space They would like to use 3 of our parking spaces for a dumpster for renovations to begin June 10. We will ask for a quid pro quo of parking spaces in the parking garage directly behind DPC. Anticipated construction is 2-3 months, but will it take longer and run into parking for Waffle Shop? Jimmy Cheshire and Jake Byl will review a contract with them. And anticipated start date for the dumpster might be June 17. Thanks to David Maddox for taking the lead!
- c. Renovation/placement of the nursery Mike K. will bring back a quote for the building additions for the "flower" room to open the space for the nursery. This will let the kids have a straight shot from the Sanctuary to the new location for the nursery.
- d. Stained glass for the Narthex We will investigate the costs and need to add this, perhaps for the 2020 budget. Thanks, Denny for the initial work on this.

II. Finance

- a. Finance update
 - i. Current operating account balance as of 6/8/19: \$29,410.71. (And today's count was \$11.088.67) We have some expenses coming up...do we need to draw in light of the upcoming expenses? We'll delay this until the Session meeting next week to get a better handle of the totality of the expenses. We are thinking around 30K.
 - ii. Treasurer's Report Jeff Koontz provided a useful monthly deposit analysis of the last four years to give us an idea of what trends in giving we see. There's not a lot of consistency, but our summer months aren't as bad as we thought and December isn't always the biggest giving month. David Maddox asked for this because our giving has been weak lately and he wants to do an analysis.
 - iii. The last of the Virginia Tipton Craig money \$12,200! Thanks for this! This shows the value of making a pitch in stewardship for this because it has really been a help to DPC.
- b. Libby Greer memorial notification There is a request to let the family know how many donations have come in so that they can thank them. Jimmy brought up that DPC should let families in general know when this happens so that we can add this to our best practices in communication. Pastor Mike will let Dena

- know that he wants to know when the memorials come in so that he can send a letter.
- c. Who will chair Finance and be the treasurer next year? Chuck has pondered this since the budget time will come up in the fall. It would be good to have people who are current and versed to take over in January.
- d. Miscellaneous Tom Wills and Denny have been talking about having community movie nights in the winter. Tom has the equipment this might be a good way to link with the community.

Communications Task Force

Justin Near, Holly Kellar, and Jennifer Zehnder met on June 2, 2019. We will continue discussions via email until we feel like we need to have another in-person meeting.

Many areas were covered during our first meeting.

Topics included:

- **messaging** open, affirming, missional, progressive, acknowledging our formal, traditional, and historical appearance but also showing what we look like on the inside
- **invitation** what are we specifically inviting people to do? Be sensitive to it being more than just coming to worship on Sunday morning we have and are continuing to develop lots of other entry points, all important
- audience look beyond our holes/gaps and find the group(s) most open, willing, and able to participate at DPC; identify target audiences (downtown employees, downtown residents, Nashville at-large residents), best message for each, and who is most likely to respond
- intent contemplative times kept coming up in the discussion, the need to refuel and
 recenter; possibility of designated weekday time for employees and post-service time on
 Sundays (Chapel); also discussed the need for deeper fellowship allows us to better
 know why someone is leaving before they leave rather than after, when it's too late to do
 anything
- **Twitter** need someone to spearhead; consider leveraging some sort of Friends of DPC organization or simply developing stewardship campaigns beyond our membership
- Facebook developing a more intentional strategy that is easy to enact (ex. assign
 admins a specific day of the week and specific topics, collaborate on Google Docs for
 resources, post events, share items from other groups that align with our mission, Pastor
 Mike post his letter from the eVotion); enfold organ page into public page if possible;
 work on boosting numbers on public page
 - current public page admins Richard Feaster, Nina Cardona, Michael Arwood,
 Tom Byl, Jewly Hight, Stephanie Coleman, and Claire Armbruster
 - would like to add William and Tom Wills as admins to that page

DPC Incident Report (May)

Monday, May 6, 2019 – Monday morning at first arrival found lights on first and second floors + bathrooms turned on, donation box left on bench in Fellowship Hall next to 5th Avenue door, fan and light left on in clothes closet, middle 5th Avenue door left unbolted again.

Man inside alley fence screamed obscenities and threatened to rape the office manager. Construction workers walking past parking lot intervened. Person is new to the area. White male, thirties, thinning brown hair, wearing jeans and white t-shirt, carrying a lot of bags and a red sleeping bag

Three youths around 12 years old went through parking lot trying to break into cars. Members attending meeting in Brew Room saw them.

Tuesday, May 7, 2019 – Alley gate was ripped off hinges. Contacted Premier to see if security camera on Cohen Building still works. Contractors kept leaving alley door propped open even though they were given temporary access codes.

Wednesday, May 8, 2019 – Contributor left Fellowship Hall doors unattended during distribution including both doors leading up to Sanctuary, and chain was not pulled past bathrooms. People coming into the building were not all Contributor Vendors. Caught 5 people smoking on premises including a volunteer who has been told twice already and a vendor right outside the open Fellowship Hall doors took one step onto the sidewalk and said she was on public property refusing to move. Inner and outer doors to Contributor office are being kept open even though the air conditioning is on and the Contributor office gets really loud. They have been asked repeatedly to keep the inner door closed. Employees from 5/3 building called because vendors were completely blocking 5th Avenue sidewalk, and they had to walk in the street to get to work. Tom Wills was told about the blocked sidewalk.

Saturday, May 9, 2019 – Incident during Saturday breakfast. Man (whose name is Cory) was being verbally abusive to volunteers outside clothes closet. After he went outside a fight broke out between him and another guest.

Monday, May 13, 2019 – Tim Donahow (who attacked office manager) and Cory (who got in fight on Saturday) were sitting 10 feet apart outside church office. Flags out front were ripped down and city garbage can was thrown over church fence on 5th Avenue.

Tuesday, May 14, 2019 – Donahow and Cory were both on the church property again today. Parking lot was full of illegal parkers. All stickered and moved in a couple hours.

Thursday, May 16, 2019 – No smoking sign was ripped off fence and thrown at building along with garbage. Dog poop was left right in front of alley gate. Artists and Contributor volunteers had multiple cars in the lot today. People with business at the church had to pay to park in garages.

Friday, May 17, 2019 – Car illegally parked in lot. Driver parked and jumped in waiting car in alley. Car was towed by Baileys and was possibly stolen.

Saturday, May 18, 2019 – Cory tried to come to Saturday breakfast. Pastor Mike told him to leave.

Monday, May 20, 2019 – Red statue on 5th Avenue was pulled down. Lots of garbage was left on office entrance landing on 5th Avenue. No smoking sign was badly bent. Person tried to rip it off the fence again, but the zip ties held. Vendor for the Contributor came to the AA meeting and left after 10 minutes. Paulino caught him searching rooms. He became very angry when Paulino told him to leave. Volunteers for the Contributor have been notified and Tom Wills will be informed. His name is Derrick Youngblood Walker.

Tuesday, May 21, 2019 – Homeless man came to office door and tried to force his way in demanding food, because he saw other people coming into the building so he knew we were feeding today. The group he saw was AA. His language was most inappropriate. Artist did not move their button, so last person out of the building did not set alarm. Reminder was sent to artists and David Maddox about moving the buttons.

Thursday, May 23, 2019 – Parking lot was full of tourist golf carts blocking entrance for disabled guests attending memorial. Tourists were taking pictures of mural on Viridian wall. When asked to move one of the cart drivers started to insult the office manager and DPC in a very loud voice. Finally some of the tourists on the carts demanded the drivers leave the parking lot.

Friday, May 24, 2019 – Two no smoking signs were cut off fence. Man who got in fight during Saturday breakfast (Cory) was passed out on the stoop right in front of church office doors. Michael Korak removed him.

Tuesday, May 28, 2019 – Contributor vendor, Derrick Walker, who came to AA then snuck out to rummage through the church tried to come in the office again. He was told he was not allowed in the church and to go to the Contributor's office. The volunteers told him to come to the Contributors office only. Man was passed out on stoop in front of church office. Michael Korak removed him.

Thursday, May 30, 2019 – Scooter thrown over fence... again. Reported to Hub Nashville along with scooter in back area of church that is still there from Wednesday. Two homeless including Cory were sleeping in front of the church office doors at 2:30p.m. Mike and

Michael were off and Paulino was gone, so outer glass doors were locked. Viridian was cleaning balcony area above mural and blasted concrete and debris onto office manager's car in parking lot. Manager of the Viridian has been informed.

DPC Incident Report (June)

Monday, June 3, 2019 – Signs ripped off fence again. Scooters blocking entrance to Fellowship Hall and dumped on stairs leading to church office. Reported to HUB Nashville for removal. Homeless sleeping on ledge by red statue. Three separate homeless groups demanded to see the pastor to learn how to pray. They are coming into town for the CMAs and are targeting churches.

Tuesday, June 4, 2019 – Fence jumper on Church Street. He went down the alley from the parking lot after being told the gates were locked and jumped the fence by the big pot. His clothes got caught on the fence. Cory was passed out on middle 5th Avenue landing. Fellowship Hall door was left unlocked and homeless person came inside and started to go up to the Sanctuary. Office Manager saw him on the cameras and got him out of the building then locked the doors. Contributor had car parked in lot again after being told multiple times they do not have parking privileges. They were told to move. Lot was at capacity with people and employees preparing for evening concert.

Wednesday, June 5, 2019 – Contributor blocked sidewalk on 5th Avenue again, smoked inside fence after walking past the no smoking signs, and were caught past the chain by the bathrooms. Most of the people who are informed of the smoking policy have been wonderful. There were two today who were very rude, and were not wearing Contributor badges. The Contributor is not doing enough to control the people who are there for food or training, but are not officially vendors. The people past the chain all used Tom Wills as an excuse for roaming in the back building. Toilets were full of paper towels in women's restroom after Contributor distribution. Multiple scooters were dumped in back alley between church fence and parking garage. Reported to HUB Nashville for removal.

Friday, June 7, 2019 – Drunk people on Viridian balconies were throwing bottle caps and garbage onto cars in church parking lot. Viridian management has been informed. Fight between two homeless outside church office on 5th Avenue. Police came after the fight was over.

Tuesday, June 11, 2019 – Viridian residents are still throwing garbage into church parking lot. Contractor from Viridian was trying to break into water faucet on side of church. Church faucet has a lock on it, so the contractor stole water from the Cohen Building instead. Cohen Building and Viridian management has been informed. Tim Donahow was removed from parking lot.
