August 16 church service

Mike and Mary Louis are going to be on vacation. Rather than try to train someone else to do the livestream, or ask Mike and William to record the entire service in advance, we will give Mike and William the Sunday off. Instead of our service, we will encourage people to attend the service at First Presbyterian Church in Pikeville, KY, where Scot Robinson is pastor. They do their services in a prerecorded format that drops at 11:00 am Eastern Time. Scot and Mike will work on incorporating some DPC visitors into the service.

Refined planning for return to worship

The conversation was framed with the assumption that with the spike in cases, this will not happen before September.

- Taking temperatures. Based on advice from several people and concern for making too cumbersome a process, we agreed to not include that as part of our protocol. We will rely on masks and social distancing.
- Cleaning protocol. We will ask Paulino to do a thorough cleaning of the Sanctuary and Narthex after worship, or after any other event that may occur there (e.g., East Side Story)
- We will have ushers direct people to their seats, not just rely on bulletin placement and signage
- Signage. Two sets of signs [wait to produce until we are closer to opening, in case other factors to consider emerge]
 - At the street and/or front doors. A few simple points:
 - Church is open for worship, doors open at ____ [need to decide that detail]
 - Masks are required
 - An usher will seat you
 - Enjoy the service (or something like that)
 - o In Narthex
 - Sanitize your hands [dispenser in Narthex]
 - Please wear a mask, if you do not have one, we will provide one
 - Wait for a greeter/usher to seat you
 - Place offering in the container [need to acquire a couple to place in Narthex]
- We need to post the detail on these requirements on Facebook pages, evotion, website.
- Create a short videotape that walks people through what will happen, post it in the same places
- Music.
 - William has some great ideas for using handbells, which can be done with good distancing.
 - The cantor will sing the hymns. We need to ask Rachel Hayes her view on singing with masks on in terms of potential spread.

Lessons and Carols

Did not pick a date, but discussed it. Will pare back the lessons. William will work on a proposed outline. A lot will depend on whether we are back to face-to-face by then, or still worshipping remotely. In that case, it can be an independent recorded service.
