Shekinah is a Hebrew word that means "dwelling" or "settling" and denotes the dwelling or settling of the divine presence. In Judiasm, in the presence of the Shekinah the divine connection to God is more readily perceivable. In some sources and parts of the Jewish tradition, the Shekinah represents the feminine attributes of the presence of God.

- L: O Shekinah, yours is the feminine face of the Holy, the luminous moon who lights up the night as we travel from captivity to liberation;
- P: the pillar of fire who guides our way home, the cloud hovering over the mountain peaks, living sign that the drought is over.
- L: You are the indwelling presence of the Divine. Whenever we gather to praise the One, you are here in our midst.
- P: When we cry out for justice, you make our hearts tender.

- L: When we stand with those on the margins, you make our legs strong.
- P: When we create works of art, and parent our children, and harvest our gardens, you guide and sustain us.
- L: You restore balance in our relationships and wholeness to our fragmented souls. You are the song of our homecoming.
- P: Be with us now as we navigate this landscape of mystery. Help us. May we remember you and lift you up. May we recognize your face in everything and everyone.

The LORD said to Moses, "I'll do exactly what you've asked because you have my special approval, and I know you by name."


Moses said, "Please show me your glorious presence."

The LORD said, "I'll make all my goodness pass in front of you, and I'll proclaim before you the name, 'The LORD.' I will be kind to whomever I wish to be kind, and I will have compassion to whomever I wish to be compassionate. But," the LORD said, "you can't see my face because no one can see me and live." The LORD said, "Here is a place near me where you will stand beside the rock. As my glorious presence passes by, I'll set you in a cleft in the rock, and I'll cover you with my hand until I've passed by. Then I'll take away my hand, and you will see my back, but my face won't be visible."



As the tune hints, this text is derived from images in the writings of the English medieval mystic, Julian of Norwich. In 1393 she wrote down and account of her sixteen remarkable visions experienced twenty years earlier; they formed the basis of her theology of God's love.

Though scholars discredit the story that this hymn was written when the author found shelter under a large rock during a thunderstorm, the popular appeal of that conjecture perhaps lies in the energy of this plea and the vividness of its imagery drawn from many biblical sources.

After writing the first stanza of his "Christian Good-bye," the author sent it to two composers, one celebrated and one unknown, to see how each would set it. This is the second person's tune, which the author found more effective and used for the hymn's first publication.
