

Dear GPC Members and Friends,

We are blessed to be part of one of the most dynamic seasons in the history Germantown Presbyterian Church. I am so grateful for each and every person who is part of the GPC family. Together we are growing in healthy and important ways. I am so thankful for this past year, even as I eagerly anticipate all that 2019 will bring for our church and community.

The closer the building moves to completion, the more excited we are for what this building will mean for our church and for our whole community.

GPC is growing in our understanding that while our church members support and maintain our facilities, our buildings are great tools for inviting people into our sphere of influence. In this day and age, when many churches are decreasing in numbers and support, healthy churches open themselves up for community groups and meetings of many kinds. For example, in addition to the many church groups that use our facilities, we invite many life-saving support groups (such Alcoholics Anonymous and the National Alliance on Mental Health) to meet regularly in our building. We believe that we are contributing to a person's salvation and to a better community by having these groups under our umbrella. It is part of our mission to give these groups grace in the form of a place to meet free of charge. We also have several neighborhood associations, garden clubs, hobby-based clubs, and community organizations that meet in our buildings. Our hope is that by inviting people into our architectural space, they will feel welcomed into the spiritual space that is Christ's church. Through our hospitality, people will experience Christ's welcoming personality.

Part of the renewed dynamism in our church is our belief that God is calling us to grow in several ways.

Most importantly, we want people to grow spiritiually in their life-saving and life-changing relationship with God through Jesus Christ. People are hungry for solid, spiritual food, and when they receive it, they are spiritually nourished and grow. It is hard to quantify and measure spiritual growth. It happens slowly over time as we carefully cultivate the seeds of faith that the Holy Spirit plants in our hearts. It

> takes deliberate effort on our part, and one of the church's main responsibilities is to provide occasions and resources for people to grow in their relationship with God.


> > In addition to the spiritual growth of

personality. of the church. The GPC leadership is discerning how God wants to grow our church numerically. Over the course of this past fall, we have been focusing on the meaning and purpose of evangelism. We have been studying trends in churches in North America, and we have listened to many personal accounts of church decline and growth. In late November, a few Elders and I attended an evangelism workshop at one of the fastest-growing churches in our area. We have two new Evangelism Task Forces made up of Elders, staff, and lay-people that are focusing on "internal" and "external" evangelism. We have a small group of people that are in the fledgling stages of determining if GPC can numerically grow by adding a third worship service in addition to our two morning services. I am praying for the Holy Spirit to guide and direct us as we seek to increase the membership of GPC in significant ways in 2019.

#### WELCOME, ALEX

I am pleased to introduce Dr. Alex. Benford who has been hired to replace Carolyn Mason as our Organist and Director of Handbell Choirs as of January 1. Dr. Benford (Alex) comes to us as an experienced church musician, organist, conductor, and staff coach. We are excited to have Alex join our staff.

Alex Benford recently completed his Doctor of Musical Arts degree in organ performance at the University of Alabama where he studied organ and harpsichord with Dr. Faythe Freese. As a graduate assistant, Dr. Benford served as accompanist for the choral ensembles and as University Carilloneur at the Denny Chimes. He held the William Henderson Organ Fellowship at Grace Presbyterian Church for three years where he was also Director of Handbell Choirs. In addition to solo recitals, concert appearances have included choral masterworks such as the Duruflé Requiem, Benjamin Britten's Rejoice in the Lamb, and Leonard Bernstein's Chichester Psalms. Alex has appeared on Georgia Public Broadcasting's Georgia Traveler demonstrating the Albert

Schweitzer Memorial organ in Spivey Hall, and one of his recital performances was featured on WABE's



Atlanta Music Scene.

Dr. Benford also holds a Master of Music degree in collaborative piano from the University of Tennessee, Knoxville. During his eleven-year tenure as Staff Coach/Pianist at Clayton State University in Morrow, Georgia, he conducted numerous opera productions and performed on the Spivey Hall stage upwards of 100 times as either organist, pianist, conductor, collaborator, or chamber musician. He has coached on the staff of the Harrower Summer Opera Workshop at Georgia State University and has served as coach with the University of Miami School of Music in Salzburg, Austria.




Men's Lunch Devotions

#### Presbyterian Women Welcome Melissa Farrar from Hope House

At the January 15 Gathering, Melissa Farrar from Hope House will share her work. She is a Licensed Clinical Social Worker graduating from the University of Tennessee's College of Social Work. Melissa has over 18 years of experience providing individual, group, and play therapy for people experiencing trauma. Melissa has been the Director of Social Services at Hope House for 2 years.

Melissa will give a brief overview of what HIV is, how it is contracted as well as prevention efforts in effect that stop the spread of HIV. She will go over the resources offered by Hope House to those infected or affected by HIV. Lastly, she will address the stigma within the community that is still present and still impacts those living with HIV and will discuss how we can help decrease this stigma.



#### LET'S FOLLOW THEIR EXAMPLE


What is it like to be in a room of over 100 individuals with special needs as they lay hands on and pray over a package of food they have assembled to pass on to someone who is homeless? Words fail me. It's humbling. It's inspiring. It's spiritual.

On Friday, November 30, GPC was once again the host location for the JoyLife901 Breakfast Club. Breakfast Club meets on a weekly basis and is comprised of individuals with special needs who assemble for the purpose of eating breakfast and then breaking open the Word and studying together in a safe and appropriate environment. We had 86 participants in attendance, 6 from the JoyLife leadership team, and then an additional 10 GPC volunteers cooking and serving for a grand total of 102 on campus.

The devotional time was spent hearing a modern re-telling of The Good Samaritan as we looked at the question "Who is our neighbor?" And then the devotional time was followed by the participants working on a Food-For-A-Day Project. They assembled packages to pass out the next time they encountered an individual who was homeless. The package consisted of the necessary elements to supply three meals for a day on the streets. After

the packages were assembled, they laid hand on the packages and its contents and prayed over and for the individual that would receive it. Nothing speaks volumes like having 100+ people praying for our unsheltered neighbors.

If you would like to learn how to make a Food-For-A-Day package, please see the recipe below. Meanwhile, we could all take a lesson from those who are differently abled and are still willing to offer up a prayer on behalf of someone they have yet to meet. Let's follow their example!



1 cellophane or brown paper lunch bag 1 pop-top can of soup or chili or ravioli (if selecting a soup, choose one that does not require water to be added)

1 fruit or apple sauce cup


1 granola bar

1 package of cheese/peanut butter crackers

A plastic spoon or fork

Short length of string or ribbon

Place all items in the bag and tie top closed with string. (The granola bar will be the breakfast, the fruit cup and crackers the lunch, and the soup will serve as supper.) Pray over the completed package asking God to afford you the opportunity to make the difference in the life of someone with a true need. Ask Him to begin even now to meet all the needs of that individual. Then place the package in your vehicle and then pay close attention as you allow God to show you who needs to receive it.








#### **AMPLIFY'S GRAND PERFORMANCE**

AMPlify is the music arm of our special needs ministry and is open to those in the community with cognitive or developmental delays or physical disabilities. Music instruction is offered using the Orff approach and the very gifted Noel Wilkins leads the class. There is a morning class for adult musicians and then an afternoon class for children who are still in school. This semester we had 24 individuals on our rolls learning how to amplify their hearts, voices, and witness for the glory of the God! The performance was followed by a small reception for the friends, family, and guests in attendance complete with refreshments and a hands-on instrument table of many of the instruments introduced during the course of the semester. #### WHAT IS A PARAKLETE?

Parakletos is the Greek word for "encourager," "advocate," or "helper." In the book of John chapters 14-16, Jesus refers to God sending an Encourager to be with us forever in the form of the Holy Spirit. In Children and Youth Ministry we are mindful of the need for our youth to be encouraged and supported. We are working to foster an environment where GPC youth feel welcomed, encouraged, and cared for by not only adult leaders such as Sunday school teachers but also by their peers.

On December 2 our current 5th graders had the opportunity to visit junior high Sunday School. This is one event in a year-long *Bridge Program* to help transition our 5th graders over to the GPC Youth program. During this Sunday School hour each 5th-grader was paired with a junior high "Paraklete," otherwise known as his/her "encourager" for the year.

Throughout the January - May semester 5th graders will have the opportunity to eat breakfast monthly with his/her Paraklete, visit a Sunday night Youth fellowship meeting as well as a Wednesday night Chick-Fil-A meeting. It is our hope that the 5th-graders AND Parakletes will develop the necessary skills of getting to know a new friend, encouraging that friend in participation, and fostering a positive and welcoming youth environment. 

Total revenue for November was \$112,615 and expenses were \$116,061, producing a deficit for the month of \$3,446. On a Year-to-Date basis, we're about equal to where we were last year, running a deficit of just under \$20,000. This is not unusual, and we'll be fine if pledges for 2018 are completed in December. If there's any question about where you stand on your pledge, please call Fred Turverey or Debbi Schweizer in the church office (901.754.5195).

We are in sight of our goal for pledges in 2019, but need every pledge to achieve success. If you haven't already made your financial commitment for 2019, please turn your pledge in as soon as possible.

Contributions to *Building Tomorrow Today* for October were \$68,986 and construction expenses were \$587,036. We borrowed an additional \$335,000 to cover the shortfall, which brought our total debt so far to \$885,000. Construction is moving at a rapid pace now, with completion of the building anticipated in the Spring of 2019.
