New Education Building

New Offerings for Fall



Dear GPC Family and Friends,

During the month of August, I manufactured reasons to go into different parts of the new education building. At various times during each day, I left my office to go into Warren Hall and admire that great new fellowship space. I took my laptop into the Parlor to work, and I sat for a few hours upstairs in each of the classrooms. I go into the chapel basement, and I am shocked at the metamorphosis of that space. Last December, on Christmas Eve, I walked around the skeleton of the new building, and I could not envision the finished product. Now, I cannot imagine our church without that building, and it's not even a month old! As a church, we are so grateful to God for the visioning and generosity that has resulted in our great new space.

A few weeks ago I mentioned in a sermon how our focus as a church has been on this building project for all of my time at GPC - eight years. When I arrived in 2011, Phase I had just been completed, and it was magnificent at that time. It included new offices, the new Welcome Center, a new choir room, new children's space downstairs, and the covered drop-off by the Narthex. I was so grateful to arrive just after all of the construction and to occupy the new space; but I knew from the moment I started at GPC that we had another phase to go. While Phase II wasn't on the front burner for two or three years, it was still on our minds. In 2015 we began the process of cranking up Phase II. There were meetings, visioning steps, and more meetings. We worked hard in 2016 and 2017 getting everything in place - raising awareness and raising funds -- and the last two years were spent building. For all of us, the last eight years have seen some portion of Phase II occupying a little, or a lot, of our time, energy, imagination, and labor.

So....now what?!? I've spent a lot of time praying that very question. I've been praying and dreaming and asking God what He has in store for us now. What is Phase III for GPC? It still involves building, but of a spiritual kind – which is harder and even more important than the physical building we've been doing the last few years. Now we will tackle the next building project: building up the Body of Christ that is GPC, numerically and spiritually. We want to grow the church so that more people can be in a life-changing and life-saving relationship with God through Jesus Christ. We want more people to know God, to experience forgiveness and redemption, and to have a new purpose for life in serving God in the world.



To this end, at its August meeting, the Session approved a new staff position to help us grow the church. We will soon begin the process of calling a new Associate Pastor for Evangelism and Discipleship. This will be different from the position held by Jay Howell. Our new associate pastor will be tasked with leading our church in growth. I anticipate that this pastor will come in with a track-record of success in growing a church. This new associate pastor will teach us how to be more willing to share our faith with others, and he or she will coach us on how to spread the good news of God's love with others.

We will also look to this person to guide us in continuing to provide excellent opportunities for spiritual growth through learning. GPC has such an excellent history of strong Christian education, and we will look to this person to guide us into new ways of learning and growth. We have not yet tapped deeply into new ways of learning through technology, and the possibilities are endless for how we might grow in this area. I hope our new associate pastor will provide weekly Sunday School podcasts for people who are traveling and cannot attend at GPC personally. We need Internet-based learning, and I hope he or she will lead Bible studies that challenge us when we need it - and comfort us when we need it. I hope our next associate pastor will help us grow our worship services beyond what we currently offer so that we can appeal to people who worship in different ways from what we are accustomed to.

I am already praying for this person who will join our church family/staff at some point in 2020 (I hope!). And please join me as we look forward to our future together and all that God has in store for us.

## WELCOME BACK TO THE GARDEN

On Sunday, August 4, GPC celebrated the completion of Phase II of GPC's Master Plan and the congregation was introduced to new and pleasing renovated spaces. We were also reintroduced to a very special feature of GPC's campus. Since Phase

Il construction began, the Memorial Garden has been hidden behind construction fencing with limited access. The Garden is now a prominent feature of the beautiful courtyard.

On Dedication Sunday, we had the opportunity to reacquaint ourselves with this place of beauty and comfort. The Phase II project constructed an additional columbarium wall, erected wrought iron fencing, completed the garden courtyard and provided sidewalk access to the new Warren Hall.

Phase II has brought to fruition the vision of a Memorial Garden that was planted in 2011 when the Session approved a resolution creating the Germantown Presbyterian Church Memorial Garden Association with the mission to establish a memorial garden with columbarium on our church campus for the purpose of interring the cremains of members, their families, and others as approved by the Memorial Garden Association.

Since the Memorial Garden was dedicated in March 2014, there have been 29 interments in the columbarium and 24 inscriptions on

the Memorial Wall. Subscription agreements for another 50 niches have been submitted.

In the five years since its dedication, the Memorial Garden has proven to be a place of beauty and quiet comfort to our GPC family. Its mission is to serve those who've come before us and those who follow. Generations to come will be blessed by this ministry.

# RECAP

Notes from the Bench

#### Ephesians 5:19-20

"Be filled with the Spirit, speaking to one another with psalms, hymns, and songs from the Spirit. Sing and make music from your heart to the Lord, always giving thanks to God the Father for everything, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ."

It's hard to believe that Jennifer and I have been here with you for eight months! I have joked that coming onboard at GPC in January felt rather like jumping onto a caboose when the train is already in motion. But the hospitality of this community certainly eased our transition, and we are so grateful for the way you all have embraced us.

I am excited for our new program year, and I want to make sure all are aware of the many musical opportunities GPC offers for all ages!

<u>Chancel Choir:</u> Our large adult choir, which enhances the 11:00am service with aweinspiring presentations and offers a variety of special events throughout the year. Open to high school students through adults. Rehearsals are Wednesdays 7:15-9:00pm in the choir suite (on the upper level).

Adult Handbell Choir: Open to high school students through adults. Ability to read music is helpful, but no experience required. Rehearsals are Wednesdays 6:15-7:00pm in the handbell room (on the upper level).

<u>Youth Handbell Choir:</u> For grades 6-9. This smaller ensemble, comprised primarily of ringers who have "graduated" from the children's bell choir, meets on Sundays from 4:00-4:30pm in the handbell room (on the upper level) right before youth group.

Children's Handbell Choir: Part of our "Kids Ring and Sing" ministry, this group is now open to children grades 2-5 (as opposed to 3-5 in past years). Children learn basic handbell technique and sharpen their musical skills through a variety of activities and games. Rehearses Sunday afternoons 5:30-6:30pm in the handbell room (on the upper level).

<u>Children's Choir:</u> The singing part of "Ring and Sing," our children's choir is divided into two groups - Cherub Choir for ages 4-6, and the older choir for grades 2-5. These groups, led by the expertise of Sandy Franks and Karen Cooper, meet during the school year on Sunday evenings 4:30–5:30pm.



This fall also marks the "soft launch" of some new ensemble opportunities for youth and adults.

<u>Chapel Choir:</u> A smaller choral ensemble for adults, focusing on a capella repertoire spanning the Renaissance through the present. Rehearsals TBD.

Youth Choir: Our goal will be for this group to sing in worship 2-3 times per year, offering a variety of repertoire ranging from classic hymns to more recently written songs of faith. Open to grades 6-12. Rehearsals will be as announced, likely on Sundays after 11:00 service, for 3-4 weeks leading up to performance dates.

Youth Flex Ensemble: An instrumental ensemble, comprised of the diverse range of musicians in our congregation. While aimed at grades 6-12, adults who play any instrument are welcome as well! Like (and in alternation with) the Youth Choir, this group will rehearse as announced in 3-4 week units leading up to performance dates.

## **GPC Budget Update**

Net	\$ 22,628 \$ 68,561	\$ 41,575 \$ (14,684)

Total revenue for July was \$143,818, with expenses of \$121,190. This resulted in a surplus for the month of \$22,628. Our year-to-date surplus continues to grow and stands at \$68,561 for the 7-month period and compares to a \$14,684 YTD deficit a year ago. Fear not! We have significant expenses looming for HVAC repairs which promise to eat into our surplus.

Contributions to Building Tomorrow Today were \$17,266 while construction expenses were \$298,504.

We have received approximately \$3,016,755 on pledges of \$3,747,571. That leaves about \$731,000 in pledges still to be received by May 2020. Once all our bills are paid, every dollar received will be applied to principal and interest on our credit line and will help reduce the amount of our loan to be paid in monthly payments.
