Dear GPC Family and Friends,

We have been looking forward to August 2019 for quite a long time! This month marks the beginning of our new program year inside the new Education Building that has been under construction for the better part of the last year. For various reasons, our delivery date of the building got pushed back about six months. Now it's here, and we couldn't be more grateful.

Through my office window, I had a front row seat to the whole project. I took pictures every few months as one stage gave way to the next. I watched with fascination as the old building was torn down – section by section, brick by brick. What a sad mess it was to see the building to which we had a sentimental connection torn down in just about a month's time. When the building site was empty, a Civil War historian brought his metal detector and hunting skills, and he sifted through piles of dirt and found all kinds of artifacts. He found belt buckles, combs, bullets, umbrella parts, and more. He told me that there were two different camps set up on our property –a Confederate camp first followed by a Union camp. Those soldiers from both sides left their mark and their debris in our dirt.

I remember well the day that the steel beams were delivered and the new building was framed. On that day, I finally had a vision of what the new building would look like. From that day forward, I have watched with intrigue and gratitude as our Education Building rose from the concrete slab and began to take shape. I have watched as each room has taken shape, with ducts and wires covered over by walls and paints. On several occasions (after hours), I snuck into the new building to examine the progress. One of those days was Christmas Eve, and I walked through Evans Chapel knowing that we would not have our usual Christmas Eve service in there that evening. At least once a month since then, I have walked through to get a glimpse of what would eventually come.

Now, we "have been handed the keys," and the building is open and ready for us to use and enjoy. Personally, I have such joy, relief, and excitement about this project. I have been involved in many, many meetings since 2011 about "the new building." Since the completion of Phase I in 2011, Phase II has been on the horizon. There have been many planning and visioning meetings, and there was a large fundraising effort to pay for as much of the building as possible. Finishing the project marks the end of so much planning and working by so many people, and we owe them our heartfelt thanks many times over.

I will also acknowledge that I feel a special "burden of history" as I think about our entry into this new era of GPC's life. So many faithful congregants and ministers have been



part of GPC's life since its beginning in 1838. They did their part and played their roles in keeping the church alive and well over the years. As a sign of their love for Christ and trust in God, they shepherded the church through lean and full seasons. Those who have gone before us have passed down to us a wonderful and vibrant church. We have inherited from our forbears in faith the kind of church where we can learn about God and grow in Christ. I often feel the burden of keeping this healthy church going and growing for the generations to follow, and I know that you also carry this responsibility.

I truly believe that our new Education Building will help us grow as a congregation – spiritually and numerically. We will continue to have truly life-changing programs and classes, and now we have modern spaces, accompanied by modern technology, in which we will learn and teach. Our faith will be edified and strengthened by what we learn alongside other church members week after week. We will also have more space for more people to gather in. If the new building serves only our current congregation, then we are missing the best chance for growth that we have had in a long time. We now have room to invite many new friends and family members to enjoy what we do at GPC. Quite simply put: now we have a new building, and we need to fill it up!

I believe that God has placed us to be part of GPC at this exact moment of the church's history. So many have come before us, preserving and teaching Christian discipleship, and now it is our turn to do the same. We are called to teach the faith to everyone, young and old, and God has used us to provide a wonderful new building where it can take place.

Thank you to everyone who has prayed for, supported, and looked forward to our new Education Building. May God bless GPC at this stage of our life together as a church, and may more and more people come to know Christ as a result of our church's witness to God's love.

# Compass for 2019-20 Wednesday Night Meals & Programs

You are invited to set your Compass in our God's direction and along the footpaths of Jesus the Christ to join with fellow GPC congregants on each Wednesday eve in our Compass season from September 2019 to April 2020. We will explore God's wondrous galaxy from His planet Earth in the form of Bible study and much more.

With a nod to football mania, we will "kick off" our Compass sessions on Wednesday, September 11, 2019 at 5:30pm. From 5:30pm -6:10pm, you will sample our caterer's culinary artistry (\$7 per person). Our feature program will then run from 6:15 - 7:00pm. Our focus this year is on Bible study with complementary sessions interpsersed throughout our run. Do follow the Holy Spirit to GPC's new Warren Fellowship Hall in the new education building to participate.

Our first five ventures (September 11, 18, and 25; October 2 and 9) into the panoply of Bible study will be led by Dr. Will Jones and Rev. Susan Carter Wiggins. Dr. Jones will lead off on September 11 using the text of J. Ellsworth Kalas' book entitled <u>Parables from the Backside: Bible Stories with a Twist</u>. Rev. Wiggins and Dr. Jones will use segments of that text for the following four COMPASS sessions, ending on October 9.

After Fall Break on October 16, we will welcome Donald K. McKim who will present:

October 23: "Moments with Martin Luther." In preparation for Reformation Sunday on October 27, we will consider the theological ideas Luther emphasized which were catalysts in launching the Protestant Reformation.

October 30: "Moments with Dietrich Bonhoeffer." We will examine Bonhoeffer's life and main themes in his Lutheran-based theology which have had a world-wide influence on disciples of Jesus Christ in today's world.

Then, on November 6, Dr. Jerold Teachey will present "Choosing and Implementing Music for Advent at GPC." The program will be presented by Dr. Teachey, organist Dr. Alex Benford, and selected Chancel Choir soloists. They will explore the planning of music for the Advent season, outline the historical perspective of that music and its composers and perform examples of music for Advent.

The next two weeks (November 13 and 20) will have presenters who will address historical and current Advent perspectives that explore our Christian faith and the glorious birth of our Savior, Jesus Christ. That theme will be completed at our last session before Christmas (after the Thanksgiving break) on December 4.

So, be sure to set your Compass to guide you for "the getting of Wisdom" and the fellowship of GPC saints on Wednesday evenings from September to December.

We have a winter-spring series of Bible studies and "A Gathering of Saints" planned for you beginning on January 8, 2020. Please keep your compass in fine working order.



## FRUIT OF OUR LABOR

In February I traveled to Sierra Leone to work with women with disabilities. The two-week long trip was exhilarating and challenging and served as a new marker in my life as I considered the lives of those who live outside the comforts of the United States. My heart is forever connected to women I may never see again. I received a letter this week from the leader of Accessible Hope International (previously known as Women of Hope International) offering an update after she had just made a return trip. Because GPC and its members played a vital role in sending me, I thought I would share the letter with you. Enjoy and know that God continues to use us outside the walls of 2363 S. Germantown Road!



# **SPECIAL NEEDS AT GPC**

Hi Ladies. I just got back from Sierra Leone, and what I witnessed there was SO amazing! I wanted to get with all of you and let you know that the seeds you faithfully sowed in February have borne fruit, and it was beautiful to see! Usually, in our skills training classes, we have a follow-through rate of women who go on to work in the co-op and actually make a go of their new skill, of about 35-40%. The 2 classes that went through training in Feb have more like an 80-85% follow-through rate! Most of the women you trained are actually working regularly in the co-op and just made more money in their first bulk sale than they have ever had at one time in their entire lives! They were OVERWHELMED!

Of the paper-women, all of them have stayed on, and are working almost daily. While we were there, we taught them how to do flower inclusions, and the result was SO beautiful, that we have now ordered all of our future stationery and small journals to have flower inclusions! They have developed a good system of who does what, according to their various capacities, and everyone has a role in the process that is vital. Hawa Thullah, to no one's surprise, has emerged as the Guild Leader, and runs a tight ship, overseeing the whole process and bossing everyone around.:-)

Of the jewelry-women, all of the hearing women except Zainab stayed on in the co-op. The deaf women all stopped. But then there was a large sale that came from a team that Carrie Jo brought to the Centre, and Aminata (I think?), was there when the sale took place. She wanted in on the share, and everyone at the co-op unequivocally told her that if you don't work in the guild, you don't share in the guild money. So, she determined that next time there was a sale like that - she was going to be in on it, so she started coming every day. She's the only hearing-impaired person that came back, so she isn't sharing in community as much as some, but she does belong, and has her role in the process. (Mostly she does all the hammering - maybe because it doesn't hurt her ears??) The staff is working on ensuring that the co-op women work to be more intentional about inclusion of the deaf women.

There was a trauma healing team that came to SL this month as well, and one of the trainers was actually fluent in ASL, so we were able to include 5 hearing-impaired women in that week-long training as well, and that was another point of contact for them. Sam (the gal fluent in ASL) built some good connections with them, and at the end of the week she helped us hold a meeting with those women to try to find out why they don't want to be a part of the co-op. Some of them said that they just want to make a different product. We told them that they were welcome to make another product, and sell it in the Hope Shop, as long as they were willing to agree to the terms of the co-op. And that it would be wonderful if they could teach some others to make those beaded products as well. Emelda is more of a challenge. She had 101 excuses of why she didn't want to be part of the co-op, and most of them were super flimsy (the baby cries and no-one will even tell me he's crying ...

Yeah, right, like 20 women are going to be working with a crying baby and nobody is going to say anything?? I don't think so...) It seems that she has more internal issues that are not able to be fixed by conversation, but we did urge her to consider coming to the co-op and working so that she could support herself and her baby. Some of the girls said they would consider coming to work with the others - so we'll see what happens.

Additionally, many of the women who were in the skills training classes also started Transformation Training right after we left in Feb, and they just graduated. The testimonies from them during the training assessment day were very moving. Many of the testimonies were actually more about their economic empowerment as a result of the skills training, than really about TT, but that is fine - because it all works together. You would be so surprised to see some of these women! They don't even look the same as when you last saw them! There is a new light in their eyes, and purpose in their demeanor. They come to the co-op faithfully and all of them made a significant amount of money with the product we just purchased, particularly the jewelry-makers, as they fulfilled most of the order we sent over, while the paper women did not fill the whole thing. After we paid them (the jewelry guild made over Le 6.5 million in one fell swoop, which is more money than we have ever paid to one guild in the history of the co-op!), they were blown away by the payment. Aminata (who had the little baby) and Saffiatu have recently started attending church with Ruth as well. With a large stack of money in their hands, they came up to Ruth after being paid and having the money distributed, and Aminata said, "I heard in church last week about people presenting their tithes to God. I want to do that too, but I don't know how. Could you teach me how to tithe so I can give back to God - before I end up spending or giving away all this money?" We were all in tears!

Thank you all, for investing your time, energy, prayers, and resources into these beautiful women! The products are beautiful - but the changes in their lives are far more beautiful! I am planning to send a letter out of all of the people who supported your trip, with a couple of pictures and stories of the transformation that is happening in the women's lives, as a result of their investment in your trip. I'll make sure each of you gets a copy as well. We'd love for some of those people to continue on in supporting the ongoing work in their lives by becoming Partners in Hope. If any of you wants to become a Partner in Hope with one of the women you helped equip, let us know that as well, and we'll give you first pick! :-)

We appreciate you, and your work alongside Accessible Hope for the Kingdom.



## **GPC Budget Update**

Total revenue for June was \$136,563, with expenses of \$124,562. This gave us a surplus for the month of \$12,001. Our year-to-date surplus is strong at \$46,010. Our operating budget is in the strongest position we've experienced at this time of year in at least the last 5 years. Congratulations on maintaining great stewardship thus far!

Contributions to *Building Tomorrow Today* were \$49,205 while construction expenses were \$203,722. Our credit line now stands at \$2,065,000. Some additional expenses are anticipated as the project nears completion.

We have received approximately \$2,985,439 on pledges of \$3,747,571. That leaves a little over \$762,000 in pledges still to be received by May, 2020, and it's important that we receive those pledges as planned (or a little sooner). Every dollar received will be applied to principal and interest on our credit line and will help reduce the amount of our loan to be paid in monthly payments. If you're a new member and did not participate in the original campaign, now is the perfect time to make a pledge of cash or securities to help retire the debt.


