
Food for Project Outreach for October is all canned goods and frosting. Foods bins are located in the Activity Center to the left of the entry doors.


Get your deerstalker cap on - the play's afoot!

GPC's GRIEF SUPPORT MINISTRY

Grief Support Ministry - What's it all about?

<u>Consider:</u> Grief is the normal and natural emotional reaction to loss or change of any kind.... Grief is the conflicting feelings caused by the end of or change in a familiar pattern of behavior....

<u>Consider:</u> The feelings, emotions, experiences of grieving occur in no less than 40 types of significant loss - with loss through the death of a loved one being the loss we most typically associate with grief....

<u>Consider:</u> Research has shown that many people do not deal effectively with grief, and unresolved grief can and does have long-term negative effects in the work place, in relationships and in physical health....

<u>Consider:</u> Significant loss and thus, grief, eventually impacts every person....

<u>Consider:</u> It is not until someone experiences significant loss that he/she really understands how hard grief is to navigate....

<u>Consider:</u> It is in experiencing grief and loss firsthand, that one realizes how ill-equipped he/she is to navigate and work through all of the emotions, feelings, and countless manifestations associated with grief....

<u>Consider:</u> Books on grief and loss alone often do not adequately aid in helping the bereaved navigate this journey of loss and life....

Consider: Often faith alone is not enough for those

who are struggling mightily to learn how to live without their loved one....

Consider: Over 5 years ago, GPC began its Grief Support Ministry in an effort to reach out to bereaved individuals, within the GPC family and throughout the greater Memphis/ Shelby County area.

This ministry seeks to provide an emotionally and physically safe environment in which participants can, in the context of community, become better equipped with tools for effectively navigating grief's diffcult journey....

Consider: In recognition that a group setting is not always going to meet the needs of each bereaved individual, the Grief Support Ministry also offers a one-on-one setting in which the bereaved can get the help he/she needs....

Consider: The Grief Support Ministry Team: Stephanie Wall, The Grief Support Ministry leader, GPC member and former GPC staff member, Elder, Deacon, Certified Grief Support Specialist and Certified Grief Counselor, through the American Academy of Grief Counseling, The American Institute of Health Care Providers, and The Grief Recovery Institute; Beth Brock, GPC member, Elder, Deacon, Board Member of Memphis Crisis Center Linda Oakes, GPC member, Deacon, Retired Nurse St. Jude Children's Research Hospital, Hospice Volunteer....

<u>Consider:</u> If you or someone you know has experienced significant loss, through the death of a loved one, please consider participating in this ministry through the group or one-on-one setting....

Consider: The Grief Support Ministry Group meets the 2nd and 4th Thursdays of each month (except November and December - meeting only on the 2nd Thursday) at 6:00pm in the church parlor.... This ministry is open to the public....

Please come to the flower room (north side of the choir loft) and help yourself to these flowers in the cooler.



World Communion Sunday @ GPC

World Communion Sunday is a celebration observed by several Christian denominations, taking place on the first Sunday of every October, that promotes Christian unity and ecumenical cooperation. It focuses on an observance of the eucharist. The tradition was begun in 1933 by Hugh Thomson Kerr who ministered in the Shadyside Presbyterian Church. According to *Presbyterian Outlook*:

Davitt S. Bell (the late Clerk of Session and church historian at Shadyside) recalled that Dr. Kerr first conceived the notion of World Communion Sunday during his year as moderator of the General Assembly (1930). Dr. Kerr's younger son, the Rev. Dr. Donald Craig Kerr, who is pastor emeritus of the Roland Park Presbyterian Church in Baltimore, was sixteen in 1933. He has related that World Communion Sunday grew out of the Division of Stewardship at Shadyside. It was their attempt to bring churches together in a service of Christian unity—in which everyone might receive both inspiration and information, and above all, to know how important the Church of Jesus Christ is and how each congregation is interconnected one with another.

It was then adopted throughout the US Presbyterian Church in 1936 and subsequently spread to other denominations. In 1940, the Federal Council of Churches (now the National Council of Churches), led by Jesse Moren Bader, endorsed World Communion Sunday and began to promote it to Christian churches worldwide. Hurricane Dorian Relief

GPC Budget Update

GPC Financial Summary, August 2019

Total revenue for August was \$108,498 which, with expenses of \$169,830, resulted in a deficit for the month of \$61,332. Our YTD surplus remains positive at \$6,214. These results are still better than 2018 on a YTD basis, when we had an overall deficit of \$33,546. We are 2/3 of the way through 2019, and our offerings are 66% of budget while expenses are 65% of the expense budget. In short, we are exactly where we need to be at this time of year.

Contributions to *Building Tomorrow Today* were \$39,164 and construction expenses for the month were \$123,297. We have completed 72% of our 3-year campaign and have received 81% of our pledges plus almost \$300,000 in contributions that were not pledged. While we should be proud of our progress, we need all of the pledges to be paid by next May – these funds will be used to pay the few remaining expenses connected with the building project and reduce our loan balance prior to the beginning of scheduled amortization of the outstanding balance.


