There have been many changes in the life of the church the past few years, some terrific and some not so much. But one change I see that has me concerned is the lack of understanding of what it means to be an elder in the wider church, as well as in the local congregation. This is true of our teaching elders (ministers) as well as our ruling elders. One of the ordination/installation vows we all take is a commitment to the wider church (Book of Order G-2.0301, W-4.4003e). Why, then, are so many ruling elders choosing to opt out of presbytery meetings? And why do we not have enough applicants to be a commissioner to General Assembly (GA) this coming summer? I will say more about presbytery meetings at another time. This week I want to talk about GA. This is an experience every elder, ruling or teaching, should have at least once. It will change your perspective of the church forever. I know that was true for me when I was the Theological Student Advisory Delegate from this presbytery in 1984. I had

Why do we do session record reviews? It isn't just to produce busy work for the clerks of sessions. The Book of Order specifies what records are to be kept, how they are to be kept and requires annual or biennial review by a "higher council". The Commission for Congregational Life is finishing up the reviews of 2016 session records and membership rolls. To date 45 sets of records have been reviewed. The last opportunity this year is prior already made a commitment to God, but it was at GA that I came to realize I had made a commitment to the church, as well. Our church at the GA level is amazing. This Body of Christ is so much wider and broader and higher and grander than anything we can imagine standing in the pulpit or sitting in the pew of our local church on Sunday morning. The wider connectional church is the most wondrous entity of its size that I know of. Our Presbytery Nominating Committee has extended the deadline for GA Commissioner applicants to November 15.
