STATED MEETING

The Presbytery of Scioto Valley of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) held its two hundred forty-fifth Stated Meeting at Boulevard Presbyterian Church, Grandview Heights, Ohio, on Tuesday, November 28, 2017.

I. THE PRESBYTERY IS CALLED BY THE HOLY SPIRIT

A. Convening the Meeting

The meeting was called to order at 3:30 p.m. by moderator teaching elder Charlsie Ramsey and opened with a reading from Psalm 100 and with prayer.

B. Declaration of a Quorum and the Formation of the Roll

The stated clerk, Sally Robinson, recognized the presence of a quorum. ["The presbytery may set its own quorum, but it shall not be fewer than three teaching elders who are members of the presbytery and three ruling elder commissioners from three different congregations." (G-3.0304)] She moved that the roll be as established by the written sign-in sheets. The motion was approved. (Attachment 1)

C. Agenda

Stated clerk Sally Robinson presented the agenda for the meeting. (Attachment 2)

D. Greetings

Host pastor Preston Shealy brought greetings from the congregation, session, and staff of the Boulevard Church.

E. Committee for Presbytery Nominations Part I

Carla Mavis moved that the terms of the Moderator and Vice-Moderator be extended until July 1. The election of the Moderator and Vice-Moderator will be postponed until the May Presbytery meeting, when the new Moderator and Vice-Moderator will be ready to assume their responsibilities on July 1.

The motion was approved.

II. The Presbytery Worships God.

Worship was led by Amy House, Charlsie Ramsey, Chris Roseland, Preston Shealy, Mary Ann Stephens, and Jennifer Whitford. Rev. Chris Roseland preached on Matthew 28:16-20, and asked "Where is God Calling You?"

The Sacrament of Holy Communion was celebrated and the Necrology from 2016 was heard. Stated Clerk Rev. Sally Robinson was installed. The offering was received for the Joy Gift Offering.

New pastors and ruling elder commissioners were introduced. A motion was made to seat as a corresponding member Rev. Chris Roseland of the Presbytery of the Ohio Valley. The motion was approved.

B. Staff Reports

Executive Presbyter Dr. Jeannie Harsh reported on her work and that of the Presbytery staff. She expressed the Presbytery's thanks for congregations' financial support for the mission of the Church and commented on the state of the Presbytery and the greater Church. She encouraged greater participation in the life of the Presbytery by ruling elders.

IV. The Presbytery Celebrates Christ's Mission

A. Committee for Presbytery Nominations Part II

The Presbytery elected, via ballot, the following commissioners to the 2018 General Assembly: Ministers of Word and Sacrament Roger Au, Amy House, Justice Ofosuhene, and Ruling Elders Mark Johnson and Carla Mavis. Ruling Elder Jim Boggs was already selected as a commissioner by virtue of the office of vice moderator. After the meeting, Minister Amy House withdrew her nomination, making Alternate Robert Tolar a Commissioner.

Richard Glass, Coordinating Team Chair, nominated for membership in the Nominating Committee, Class of 2020 Ruling Elders Betty Lou Stull and Bob Bethge and Minister Don Hilkerbaumer. This slate was elected by voice vote.

Carla Mavis placed into nomination the following presbyters:

- As a member at large of the Coordinating Team, Class of 2020, Ruling Elder Carla Mavis.
- For the Commission for Church Professionals, Class of 2020, Deb Russell, Robert Martin, and Todd Tracy.
- For the Commission for Congregational Life, Jeff Schooley (Class of 2018), and Bob Armstrong (Hilliard), Mark Johnson, and Charlotte O'Neil (all Class of 2020).
- For the Commission for Nurture and Outreach, Class of 2020, Mary Gause and Peter Galbraith. There is one vacancy in this class.
- For the Commission for Presbytery Operations, Class of 2020, Roger Au and Sydney Jackson. There is one vacancy in this class.
- For the Permanent Judicial Commission, Class of 2023, Kimball Carey, Patty Moats, and Justice Ofosuhene.
- For the Committee on Representation, Justice Ofosuhene to a 2-year term and Desiree Youngblood to a 3-year term. A 1-year term remains open on this Committee.

This slate of nominees was elected by voice vote.

B. Commission for Nurture and Outreach

Mary Gause reported for the commission.

Ms. Gause made a number of announcements regarding upcoming programs held by the Commission.

Ms. Gause presented for its second reading a new Child Safety Policy, and moved its adoption. The motion, and thus the policy, was approved. The full text of this policy is in Attachment 4.

C. Commission for Church Professionals

Donald Hilkerbaumer reported for the Commission.

Commission member Ann Melick introduced Pastors Liz Wagner and Joe Fields, who are the new pastors of the Logan First Church and Waverly First Church, respectively.

George Alexander presented Rev. Gordon Johnson for recognition as Honorably Retired. A litany was read.

Mr. Hilkerbaumer moved that the Presbytery receive the transfer of Sarah Juist from the Reformed Church in America (RCA). This required a ¾ vote of the Presbytery. The motion was unanimously approved.

Kae Merold Reported for the CRE Task Force.

Rebecca Tollefson and Ann Melick presented revisions to the Presbytery's Healthy Boundaries Policy for a second reading and approval. The motion, and thus the policy, was approved, as amended. The full text of this amended policy can be found in Attachment 5.

D. Commission for Presbytery Operations

Robert Gustafson reported for the Commission.

Mr. Gustafson presented for a first reading a new Church Development Fund Policy (Attachment 6).

Mr. Gustafson presented for a second reading and approval the 2018 budget. The motion was approved (Attachment 7).

E. Commission for Congregational Life

Christine Burns reported for the Commission.

Ms. Burns presented for a first reading a new Ministry Initiative (Attachment 8), a joint initiative between the Commission for Presbytery Operations and the Commission on Congregational Life.

Ms. Burns presented a request from the Washington Court House First Church for approval to allow their Pulpit Nominating Committee to include their current temporary pastor as a candidate to become a called pastor. This request required a ³/₄ vote of Presbytery. The motion was approved, 65-4.

Vice Moderator Jim Boggs took the gavel at this point in the meeting.

F. Administrative Commission for New Albany Church

Mark Johnson reported for the Commission.

Mr. Johnson requested an extension on the time limit given to the commission, to the Presbytery's November 2018 meeting. The motion was approved by voice vote.

Attachment 4: Child Safety Policy

Child Safety Policy Presbytery of Scioto Valley

Revised and approved by the Presbytery of Scioto Valley 11/28/2017

The members of the Presbytery of Scioto Valley believe that we are called by God to create a safe place for all the children and youth in our care, nurturing, protecting, and empowering them through faith and trust. This commitment includes taking appropriate steps to reduce the risk to the young people in our care. The following policy, to be implemented for Presbytery sponsored event, is intended to minimize the risk of any of our children being subjected to sexual, physical, or mental abuse. These policies and procedures are also intended to respect the rights afforded due process to person accused of improper conduct. This policy is intended for Presbytery-sponsored events only, and shall not replace the Book of Order mandate that particular churches shall adopt their own child=protection policies and procedures according to G-3:0106.

Definitions

- 1. Child means anyone under the age of 18 and/or any adult who is developmentally disabled.
- 2. Child safety and protection means "preventing physical, mental and/or emotional injury to a child, including the prevention of sexual abuse."
- 3. Leader/Leadership means any person providing his or her time or services to the presbytery with or without compensation, including keynote speaker, music leadership, small group leader, and all other volunteer leadership or paid leadership, at events in which children or youth are in attendance or in circumstances in which he or she will come into contact with children or youth as part of the service offered.
- 4. *Chaperone and Advisor* means any person providing his or her time or services to their congregation or the presbytery, both paid and unpaid, to oversee and lead their congregation's children and youth at a presbytery sponsored activity.
- 5. *Child Care Workers* means any person providing his or her time or services to provide child care, nursery care, or babysitting for children both paid or unpaid for a Presbytery sponsored activity.
- 4. Work with children means teaching, supervising, chaperoning, or otherwise serving in a class, program, or event involving one or more children.
- 6. Activities mean classes, programs or events presented or sponsored by the presbytery.

Screening and Selection of Leadership:

- 1. All leadership must complete a consent for a criminal background check unless they can provide documentation that a background check has already been completed by their congregation or governing body. These forms will provide provided personal and confidential information necessary to preform criminal background and reference checks.
- 2. The background screening will be completed by the designated Presbytery staff person. The forms will kept on file at the Presbytery of Scioto Valley. The results will be reviewed by a Presbytery of Scioto Valley staff person, on behalf of the appropriate presbytery commission, and may be reviewed by the moderator of that committee or task group concerning the result of any background check.
- 3. Whether disclosed voluntarily or by the result of the background check, the following items will automatically disqualify a person from participating in leadership of activities involving children with the Presbytery of Scioto Valley:

 Any conviction for: murder; aggravated assault; sexual abuse; sexual assault (rape); aggravated sexual assault; injury to a child; indecency with a child; inducing sexual conduct or sexual performance with a child; possession or promotion of child pornography; the sale, distribution, or display of harmful materials or prohibited substances to a minor; employment harmful to children; or abandonment or endangerment of a child.

All other convictions or charges for any other crimes not listed above will be reviewed by the appropriate committee seeking to secure the particular employee or volunteer.

Screening and Selection Chaperones and Advisors:

- 1. The Presbytery strongly urges each local church to adopt its own screening procedure to ensure the safety and protection of its own children and youth, and requires a security background check for all chaperones and advisors of Presbytery sponsored events. The Presbytery relies on the local church session to fulfill its own responsibility to its children and youth.
- 2. All chaperones and advisors for the Presbytery of Scioto Valley activities involving children or youth are required to sign and follow a Covenant of Conduct Form. The Covenant of Conduct Form will include the safety and protection rules included in this policy and the recommendations for reporting. The Covenant of Conduct Form will also include a question about previous infractions regarding sexual misconduct.

Screening and Selection of Child Care Workers:

<u>1.</u>The Presbytery will not allow a Presbytery event involving childcare unless the host church has a child safety policy in place and meets the Presbytery set minimum guidelines below:

- a. Minimum of 2 adult (at least 18 years of age), background checked workers, CPR/First Aid Training is preferable.
- b. A sign in/out process which includes information about child allergies/special needs; includes a contact location/cell# for parent/guardian; includes a photo ID required pick up procedure.
- c. Diaper changing/bathroom procedure that follows "best practices"

When adopted, a resource packet including the above is located under "CNO" resources on the PSV webpage.

2. The screening, selection and supervision process of the child care workers will be handled by the host church, under the conditions of their child safety policy.

Safety and Protection Rules

- 1. At all times, leadership, chaperones, and advisors, to the best of their abilities, shall ensure the safety of the children and youth.
- 2. Leadership, chaperones, and advisors shall model positive and appropriate behavior.
- 3. Leadership, chaperones, and advisors shall behave respectfully toward others and the property of others.
- 4. At least two adults shall be present at activities involving children or youth.
- 5. As often as possible, make sure that an adult is not left alone in a space at these activities with a child or youth in a one on one situation. If an adult needs to be alone with a child or youth, that contact should take place in public setting, and with the knowledge of the leadership or a leader (for example: at the far end of the dining hall, or one end of the basketball court away from activities).
- 6. Leadership, chaperones, and advisors engage only in positive and appropriate forms of showing affection. The following examples are not intended to be all inclusive. Some examples of positive and appropriate forms of affection are listed below:
 - Brief hugs.
 - Pats on the shoulder or back.
 - Handshakes.
 - "High-fives" and hand slapping.
 - Verbal praise.
 - Sitting beside small children.

Some examples of inappropriate behavior with children and youth are:

• Any form of unwanted affection.

- Lengthy embraces.
- Kisses on the mouth.
- Touching bottoms, chests or genital areas other than for appropriate diapering or toileting of infants and toddlers.
- Occupying a bed with a child or youth.
- Wrestling with children or youth.
- Comments or compliments (spoken, written, or electronic, social media) that relate to physique or body development.
- Giving personal gifts or money to individual children or youth.
- 7. One adult transporting one child or youth in a vehicle shall be prohibited. One adult driver may transport two or more children or youth, or two adults may transport one child or youth.
- 8. Leadership, chaperones, advisors, and children or youth shall remain at the site of an event for the duration of the event. No child or youth shall leave an event without permission. Permission will be granted only with the express written consent of a parent or guardian.
- 9. Current emergency contact phone numbers for parents/guardians shall be available to leadership, chaperones, and advisors.
- 11. Safety concerns may infrequently require staff and volunteers to employ physical measures. Leadership, chaperones, and advisors may only employ the minimum amount of physical measures required to ensure the safety of all those involved.
- 12. Corporal punishment (e.g., spanking, hitting, kicking) and verbal and/or emotional abuse are prohibited.

Enforcing and Following the Policy

All leaders and leadership of activities with children and youth shall be aware of this policy and sign an acknowledgement of this policy and that he or she agrees to follow and enforce this policy. The acknowledgement and agreement must be submitted to the designated Presbytery staff, on behalf of the appropriate commission, and kept on file. All chaperones and advisors in their Covenant of Conduct Form must acknowledge and agree to the safety and protection rules.

Reporting Safety Concerns

If a leader or leadership is aware of any safety or protection concern involving children or youth, he or she shall report such concern as soon as possible to any of the following: Presbytery of Scioto Valley staff, Moderator of the Presbytery, or any member of the appropriate commission. If a leader or leadership has knowledge of any incident in which the above safety rules have been violated, he or she shall report such incident to any of those identified above at the earliest possible opportunity. Forms for reporting such incidents shall be available to the person reporting, who shall use them to record pertinent information, including when accidents occur, or when physical measures are required. Allegations of incidents involving violation of these safety rules shall be addressed with respect to all parties involved, and timely notification of all parental, legal, social welfare, insurance or other authorities shall be made. Opportunities for spiritual and emotional support shall be offered. All reporting shall be dealt with discreetly and tactfully, and any allegations of misconduct shall remain confidential, except for legally required reporting.

Record Keeping

A. Presbytery Staff member designated shall be responsible for maintaining the following records.

1. Consents to perform a background check and background checks performed as to a volunteer or staff member. Background checks shall be performed every five years and their date shall be recorded. An electronic log confirming that the check was done and that no issue was found, as well as hard copies of past authorization forms shall be kept in perpetuity.

- 2. Any report received of a safety concern regarding a child or youth, materials collected in the investigation of such a report, and any document constituting or describing the resolution of the report, held by the stated clerk in accessible form for at least twenty-five years.
- 3. Any report made of a safety concern regarding a child or youth made to any governmental entity, held in perpetuity.

Policy Monitoring and Review

The Commission on Nurture and Outreach shall review these guidelines and recommend changes, as necessary, to the Presbytery. Our goal is to ensure that all I leaders adhere to these guidelines and to ensure that our children are well cared for.

Attachment 5: Healthy Boundaries Policy

HEALTHY BOUNDARIES POLICY

[Approved by Presbytery, 11/28/2017] [Responsible Commission: Commission for Church Professionals]

I. <u>Introduction</u>

Psalm 119:10-16

¹⁰ I have sought you with all my heart.

Don't let me stray from any of your commandments!

¹¹ I keep your word close, in my heart, so that I won't sin against you.

¹² You, LORD, are to be blessed!

Teach me your statutes.

¹³ I will declare out loud all the rules you have spoken.

¹⁴ I rejoice in the content of your laws as if I were rejoicing over great wealth.

¹⁵ I will think about your precepts and examine all your paths.

¹⁶ I will delight in your statutes; I will not forget what you have said.

For over three decades, the Presbyterian Church (USA) has acknowledged that sexual misconduct and exploitation have existed in its churches and among its members. Policies and procedures were put in place and have lessened the number of cases. We have learned a lot. The Healthy Boundaries training presents a positive approach to our professional conduct and responsibilities.

II. Policy

The Presbytery of Scioto Valley seeks to engage church professionals of the Presbytery in understanding, teaching, and maintaining healthy boundaries in their ministries.

This Policy will:

- Identify when training takes place and who should attend; and
- Define the process for annually reviewing and updating of this policy.

A Church Professional is defined as a Minister of Word and Sacrament, a Commissioned Pastor, or a Certified Christian Educator. The policy also applies to anyone who acts on behalf of the Presbytery such as staff, retreat leaders, mission teams, and Presbytery Commission members.

III. Procedure for Healthy Boundary Training

Compliance

- All Ministers of Word and Sacrament, Commissioned Pastors, or staff of Presbytery who are actively serving in a church or on the staff of Presbytery will be expected to receive certification every three years for having attended a Healthy Boundaries training course provided by the Presbytery of Scioto Valley. Those who have transferred from another presbytery, a partner in the Formula of Agreement, or from churches uniting in Christ that offer Healthy Boundary Training will produce a certificate of completion of the training within the last two years to the Commission for Church Professionals to stay in compliance.
- Other Ministers of Word and Sacrament and Commissioned Pastors who are not actively serving are encouraged to take this training to enhance their ministries to the church.
- Anyone working on behalf of the Presbytery of Scioto Valley will be expected to complete a Healthy Boundaries training course provided by the Presbytery of Scioto Valley.
- The Commission for Church Professionals will monitor compliance.
- The Stated Clerk will maintain the records of those who have completed the course.

All new church professionals will participate in the Healthy Boundaries 101 training course provided by the Presbytery of Scioto Valley within the first eighteen months of service. By the end of the fourth year of being received by the Presbytery, these church professionals will complete Healthy Boundaries 201. Every three years after this, they will complete a Healthy Boundaries Refresher Course.

Ministers of Word and Sacrament whose Healthy Boundaries certification is over two years out of date will not be considered for election to any presbytery commission or office, will not receive attestation for Personal Information Forms filed with the Church Leadership Connection, and will have their non-compliance noted in any reference check.

The commission of a Commissioned Pastor whose Healthy Boundaries certification is over two years out of date will not be renewed at the next commission anniversary. A new commission will not be approved until the Commissioned Pastor has obtained the required Healthy Boundaries training.

Courses Offered

The courses offered by the Presbytery will be:

- Healthy Boundaries 101 (a day long course) offered at least once a year.
- Healthy Boundaries 201 (a day long course) offered at least once a year.
- Healthy Boundaries Refresher Course (a two-hour course) offered at least once a year at PIE or in conjunction with Presbytery meetings.
- Healthy Boundaries Custom Workshop may be offered for specific groups prior to their service on behalf of the Presbytery (for example: prior to a mission trip or youth retreat)

IV. Updating the Healthy Boundaries Policy

This policy will be reviewed by the Commission for Church Professionals and the Stated Clerk. Any necessary changes will be presented to the Presbytery for approval. Additionally, this Commission shall annually review resources and make these available in training and on the PSV website.

Attachment 6: Church Development Fund Policy

Church Development Fund Policy Presbytery of Scioto Valley

Adopted by Presbytery XX,XX, XXXX

Introduction:

The Church Development Fund was established by the Commission for Presbytery Operations at its November 11, 2013 meeting. It encompasses four pre-existing funds; NCD Fund (D), Church Dev Fund (D), Cong. Fund Balance (R), and Building Fund (R). The former Board of Trustees had agreed in principle to do this late in 2012, but had not taken formal action. The fund creation was retroactive to January 1, 2013. The Church Development Fund oversight is responsibility of the Commission for Presbytery Operations.

<u>Purpose:</u> The purpose of the Church Development Fund shall be to advance church development in the Presbytery consistent with the mission of Christ within the bounds of the Presbytery in accordance with Scripture and the Constitution of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), the mission and vision statement of the Presbytery, and the ongoing ministry strategy of the Presbytery and its Commissions.

Procedures:

The assets of Fund shall consist of:

- ✓ All real property, cash, and investments from the dissolution or separation of congregations and the sale of their real and personal property, as provided for in "Form of Government" (G-4.02) and the Presbytery Financial Policy (Article III.D).
- ✓ All cash and investments assigned to the Fund by action of the Presbytery or its Commission for Presbytery Operations.
- ✓ All dividends, interest and market gains on investments associated with the assets of the Fund.
- ✓ All proceeds from leases and notes issued to congregations.
- ✓ All property received or purchased for new church development.

The Fund shall be responsible for:

- ✓ All liabilities, taxes, insurance, legal fees,
- ✓ Investment costs, and all market losses on investments,
- ✓ Any other expenses necessary to acquire, maintain, defend, transfer, or dispose of any of the assets of the Fund.

Assets of the fund may be allocated to projects and programs of the Presbytery by:

- Action of the Commission on Presbytery Operations to establish or continue a program or project consistent with the purpose of the fund,
- ✓ Only if sufficient uncommitted balance of the fund remains.

The Commission for Presbytery Operations will report status of the fund to the Presbytery on a regular basis, no less than annually.

Attachment 8: The Ministry Initiatives Program

The Ministry Initiatives Program

A Program of the Presbytery of Scioto Valley administered by the Commission for Congregational Life

(Approved by CCL October 30, 2017)

<u>Introduction:</u> The Presbytery Church Development Fund was established in 2013. A Task Team was appointed to develop a policy for the use of these funds. Contingent on the approval of the policy for the Church Development Fund, this Ministry Initiative Program is proposed to be supported from the Church Development Fund.

<u>Purpose:</u> The primary purpose of the Ministries Initiative Program is to support development and initial implementation of imaginative efforts in the domain of church development and redevelopment in order to fulfill the Mission and Vision of the Presbytery of Scioto Valley.

<u>Program Assumptions:</u> As part of defining this purpose for the Ministry Initiatives Program, the following assumptions are made:

- 1. Grants are generally intended for new initiatives, redevelopment of congregations or missions, or restart situations. Attainable and measurable benchmarks will be included in all proposals.
- 2. Funds are not ordinarily available for general maintenance and upkeep on buildings, or the operation of existing programs of the congregation. Exceptions may be considered if redevelopment includes maintenance needed to support uses described in item 1.
- 3. While administered by CCL, each Commission, and the Presbytery, may apply for funds for projects that meet the criteria. Each will receive equal consideration under these guidelines.
- 4. In instances where a congregation has petitioned CCL to engage in ending their ministry, funds may be available to assist with a closing celebration.
- 5. Cooperative efforts among the congregations of the Presbytery will be encouraged, with grants in cases where these congregations may meet the criteria in assumption item 1.
- 6. CCL will establish a panel to oversee grant requests, herein named the Ministry Initiatives Board (MIB). The MIB will consist of one (1) active member from each commission, the active Vice Moderator of the Presbytery, and one (1) presbytery staff person. The Vice Moderator will serve as the MIB moderator and the staff person will serve in an advisory and non-voting capacity.
- 7. The MIB will set the timing, criteria, and process for receiving and evaluating grants. The MIB will be asked to make final determination for funding requests. Approved grants will be submitted to CCL for payment using the appropriate presbytery forms.
- 8. While requests may come from individual congregations to the various commissions, it will be the responsibility of each commission to determine eligibility, evaluate, and present recommended applications to the Ministry Initiatives Board. *Requests to the Ministry Initiatives Board must come through, and be supported by, one of the commissions or the Presbytery.*
- 9. All granted requests will be accompanied by anticipated outcomes and the requesting commission will report those outcomes to CCL.
- 10. Grants may be considered for additional program years, up to two (2), in instances when anticipated outcomes may require more long-term planning and support. However, the requesting and

supporting commission must provide all required outcome reporting to CCL. Additional years, beyond two (2), may be available, but will require a new grant request and consideration by the Ministry Initiatives Board.

Funding Assumptions:

- Initially, and for a projected period of five (5) years, an annual amount of \$150,000.00 will be included in the budget of CCL and named the Ministry Initiatives Program. Even though \$150,000.00 is allocated per year, there is no assumption that the entire annual amount will be spent in any given year if the presented and approved applications don't warrant the expenditure. The unexpended balance would be returned to the Church Development Fund for future use.
- This program will be evaluated by CPO and CCL in a period of no more four (4) years. Initial funding assumptions by CPO determined that funds are available for five (5) years at this funding level. Program assumptions may be evaluated for appropriateness by CCL as needed, or at least annually.
- If, at any time, CPO determines an adjustment is necessary to preserve the stability of the funding source(s), new allocations may be reduced or suspended.
- Should there be an unexpected opportunity consistent with the purpose of the program, the Presbytery, through a request to CPO, may approve spending more than the \$150,000 yearly limit.
