Minimum Compensation Guidelines for 2019 For Pastors and Congregations...

For the first time in several years, there is a change in the pulpit supply rate. Churches who seek pastors to fill the pulpit will need to plan to compensate \$150.00 for a single service on a Sunday and \$200.00 for two services on a Sunday, plus the IRS mileage rate.

A full-time minister of Word and Sacrament will have a minimum salary and housing of \$49,300 and a full-time CRE (Commissioned Ruling Elder), \$39,440. For a complete listing of compensation guidelines, please go to: <u>www.psvonline.org</u> and search for... "Minimum Terms of Call 2019".

POAMN recently sponsored a regional conference on Older Adults at the Worthington Presbyterian Church. Over 100 adults from across the country came to this conference on "The Best of Times: God's Call in the Third Thirty of Life". In the midst of abundant fellowship, inspiring worship and keynote, the participants enjoyed a variety of workshops on aging and older adult issues. Thanks to the hard working planning team made up of members of the Scioto Valley Older Adult Ministry and regional planners from POAMN, this was an interesting and informative conference for all!

The Presbyterian Church (USA) designates the first Sunday in May each year (May 5, 2019) as Older Adult Sunday, a day of honoring and celebrating those oldest saints within PCUSA congregations across the nation. Out of Chaos - Hope. Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) is offering immediate aid to the communities impacted by Hurricane Michael. This joins responses already underway for those impacted by Hurricane Florence, Typhoon Mangkhut, and other international disasters that have suffered a lack of media coverage.

Hurricane Michael struck the Florida panhandle with devastating winds and storm surge, causing loss of life. The storm then cut a path across the southeast, moving through the same areas impacted by Hurricane Florence just a few weeks ago.

PDA is deploying teams to affected presbyteries. Emergency aid, assistance in the development of a short-term response plan, as well as a ministry of presence will be the priorities of the initial response.

Meanwhile, areas impacted by Mangkhut and Florence have received aid and support through the gifts of Presbyterians like you. In humility, with God and your continued support, we will continue to help draw hope out of the chaos, together.

Last week I wrote about connections. This week I want to answer a question/complaint I hear frequently, "Why do we have to do all this statistical stuff? What would Jesus think about what the church has become?" I can't possibly answer the second question, but I do know that the Apostle Paul thought that the image of the church as Christ's body was so important that he wrote about it several times. During my time in Chicago earlier in the month I attended two workshops on statistical work and began to realize that it is our statistics and records that act as the sinew that keeps the parts of the body together. It is our records and statistics that keep churches connected to each other, that keep churches connected to Presbytery, Synod, and General Assembly, and that keep us connected to one another, past, present and future. Think about it. Has anyone ever come to your church looking for an ancestor's Baptismal or marriage record? Has anyone ever needed their own Baptismal record to prove citizenship? Has anyone ever done research in your church using old session records or minutes? All this statistical stuff is what helps the parts of the body of Christ do the mission of the church, and I, for one, am so glad to be a part of it.
