## GUIDELINES FOR CRE MENTORS/SUPERVISORS Presbytery of Scioto Valley

Mentor/supervisors to Commissioned Ruling Elders (CRE) and to CRE students of the Presbytery of Scioto Valley are ordained ministers of Word and Sacrament. (G-2.1004) They partner with the CRE to "cultivate personal, professional and spiritual formation" in the CRE for service in ministry. Each CRE is required to have a mentor/supervisor. The mentor shall not come from the church where the CRE is serving. Mentor/supervisors will be assigned by the CRE Task Team at the beginning of training, and, if agreeable to both parties, will continue when the CRE is commissioned.

## It is the responsibility of the CRE to contact his/her mentor/supervisor to set up meetings. Monthly contact is encouraged for students and quarterly contact is encouraged for Commissioned Ruling Elders.

If either the mentor/supervisor or the CRE feels that a mismatch has occurred, the CRE Task Team should be notified immediately. Some personalities simply do not mesh. This does not infer any inadequacy on either part.

## MENTOR/SUPERVISOR RESPONSIBILITIES

The CRE Task Team requests that mentor/supervisors:

- Model with the CRE the kind of openness and caring which should be exhibited in ministry.
- Encourage CRE's to be committed to their own professional, personal, and spiritual growth.
- Are approachable and non-judgmental, listening carefully to the CRE and making time available when needed.
- Assist the CRE to develop appropriate coping skills.
- Willingly share their own experiences of joy, pain, frustration, humor, and moments of doubts in ministry.
- Pray with and for the CRE.
- Meet with the CRE on a regular basis. If the mentor/supervisor has not heard from her/his CRE for three months, the chair of the CRE Task Team should be contacted.
- Report to the CRE Task Team any concerns you may have about the CRE's ministry.
- The CRE Task Team requests that the mentor/supervisor pass on to the Team any ideas that might assist them in making the program more effective in the future.
