I have worked for the PCUSA for 20 years. I have attended church camps, Montreat, APCE conferences, our denominational conference - GA, Synod School and many small weekend retreats. I can tell you that Triennium is THE BEST THING the PCUSA does! I

have had the privilege of attending the last 4 Triennium's. The first year I went as an Advisor/Chaperone. That is a tough job! You don't get much sleep and you have to be available for the middle of the night call from a sick teen or if someone has a faith crisis. The last 3 times I have been a Small Group Leader (SGL). I love it! A SGL teaches a group of teens, usually 15-20 teens and 2-3 adults, who are attending as Advisors. Small Group time is when we dig into the Bible and really wrestle with faith questions, doubts and "I Wonder" questions. There are no 2 kids from the same Presbytery in your group, it becomes a very safe space for the teens to ask tough questions. My favorite part about Triennium, though is Worship. Worship is an amazing, Spirit-filled time. Just imagine 5000 people, coming together in Elliott Hall of Music on Purdue's campus to sing, laugh, dance, hear scripture and listen to AWESOME, and I mean, AWESOME preaching. The kids line up outside of worship 30 minutes before the doors open and run, yes, run to their seats. They can't wait, either. I have never felt the Holy Spirit's presence more acutely than at Triennium!
