OUT OF CHAOS, HOPE

Hurricane Dorian made landfall in the Bahamas as a category 5 hurricane on September 1, 2019. All of us feel great sadness about the damage this hurricane has already caused, the loss of life, destroyed homes and structures, floods and affected vegetation. Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) has provided a solidarity grant for response efforts in the Bahamas. PDA is in communication with several international response organizations, including Church World Service (CWS) and ACT Alliance, as well as National Voluntary Organizations Active in Disaster (VOAD) and Puerto Rico VOAD. In conversations with Rally on October 12, 1(ACT Alliance and CWS, we are identifying needs, local capacities and providing updated information. We understand the genuine desire to help our neighbors. As learned from previous disasters and the shared experience of many relief organizations, the best way to respond to a disaster is through monetary donations. Cash donations are the most efficient form of assistance. Unlike material donations, cash involves no transportation costs, shipping delays, or customs fees. It also enables relief organizations to spend more time providing aid by spending less time managing goods.
