Presbyterian Women (PW) in the PresbyteryWinter Gathering, February 22, Fredericktown First PC

About 40 Women from churches around the presbytery gathered on February 22 at the First PC in Fredericktown for the PW Winter Gathering. This Gathering focused on the empowerment of women and girls and Black History Month. After opening devotions remembering the 19th amendment and the business meeting, Beth Kocheiser, keynote speaker, presented a pictorial and story account of her USA Mission Experience to the Fingerlakes region. She visited 17 churches in the Fingerlakes region, all important points of light and hope in the abolitionist and suffragette movements of which Presbyterians have been so much a part. After a lunch with soup and fellowship, there were breakout workshops led by Betty Kennedy and Trevor Martin and Uriel Grimaldo, of the Mid-Ohio Worker's Association. The Mid-Ohio Workers Association (MWA) is a free and voluntary unincorporated association of temporary, service, domestic and other lowpaid workers in central Ohio that has joined together with people from all walks of life-- students, clergy, small businesses and others--to build solutions to poverty conditions. Their presentation included a tribute to the work of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Afternoon worship was led by Pastor Christine Burns.
