A Prayer for Wisdom and Strength...



God of Wisdom and Strength, we are a broken people, too often couched in the traditions that have oppressed our sisters and brothers.

We have become trapped in systems of racism preventing your people from the opportunities you have promised all of us. We have embraced our self-serving ways and left behind those who People of the church, what better time to have those prophetic words afflict your soul than in a place of safety where you can reflect?

And what better time for each and all of us to silence ourselves and listen than when we must refrain from lifting our song?

God has always seemed to have a clever way - from the tower of Babel to the temple courts - of refocusing our efforts to what we are truly called to do. It would seem that moment is upon us again. What message would it be to our culture to proclaim that our doors will remain shut until "thy Kingdom come, thy will be done" isn't simply theological window dressing but truly believed and enacted?

I doubt any of us have the ability - or perhaps more cynically, courage - to do so, and it must be our work of confession to determine which is true. But I believe moving forward without placing the needs of the oppressed front and center comes at our peril. The words of God through Amos still ring true as he spoke in a land eerily similar to ours: without the roar of the waters of justice, God reviles our worship. And after all the hard work to get to where we can reopen, how awful it would be for our lack of vision and action to be the thing that prevents God from hearing our prayers?

So, then, let us seek to be a balm to others first over our own comforts. Let us see this time as *Kairos* and be diligent in being the church that is present to where God would call us. If we can do so, I believe that the church may begin to be the place we've prayed it so often to be.
