#### **THOUGHTS DURING THE PANDEMIC...** *The Reverend Mark Gauen, Presbytery Moderator*

I was talking with a pastor colleague of mine the other day and she mentioned that the church is going through quite a transition in these times. The comment caught my attention because she is right. Her comment made me realize that our churches are all in an interim time right now. Usually we use that term when there is a pastoral change at a church. In most or our churches the pastor is not changing, but the ministry is. And that makes it an "Interim" time, or, a "Transitional" time.

I'm discovering that many of the skills that I learned as an interim pastor are the ones that I am applying to my ministry now: grieving what has passed, maintaining the essentials, discovering the church's true identity, envisioning the future, and developing the church's leadership. In one way or another, all of us are doing these things during this interim time. In many ways, what we are doing now will determine the future of the church even when the pandemic is just a memory. We are all wrestling with how to do our ministries in times like this, and in that wrestling, we are discovering the deeper issues of who we are and what God has called us to be.

One of the things I enjoyed about interim ministry was watching a church grow through the challenging experience of an interim time. I am finding that same sense of satisfaction as I watch my church and the other churches of the Presbytery grow in new and exciting ways. We may be wandering in a pandemic wilderness right now, but in this wilderness, we are developing the faith communities of bright and promising future.

centers may remain closed to visitors. Inclusion in family vacations and milestone celebrations may exclude older members, as families try to care for their loved ones. When worship resumes, older members may not feel safe in attending. Our Older Adult Task Team offers suggestions from three separate categories to help you continue to care for these individuals.

#### Sunday Worship:

- We have seen an increase in homebound worship attendance since many of our churches have gone to online worship. Consider continuing online worship in companionship with your in-person worship.
- Identify those who need help with whatever way your church is doing Sunday worship and attempt to assist them to worship, either through caregivers or by mailing bulletins and sermons.
- If a person has worshiped alone at home, perhaps a Deacon or Elder could phone in the afternoon with a friendly hello?
- Memorial Services may need to be done via Zoom. Be prepared to remember that Older Adults may mourn "lifetime friends" and need our support.

# **Everyday Loneliness:**

- Many churches have organized Care Groups or Teams, headed by Deacons, Elders or Stephen Ministers. Refresh or re-evaluate after three months, do these need refreshing or reevaluating?
  \*A care team zoom meeting for worship and sharing of ideas?
  \*Do any of the groups need a change in leadership?
- Offer a Zoom "Fellowship Time" to any member over "65", or any select group (circle etc.)
- Encourage older members to call old friends and stay in communication with one another.
- Is there a fund whereby a hot, surprise meal might be delivered to someone in need of a surprise?
- Remember to do card showers or drive by recognitions for birthdays and anniversaries.
- Some residential facilities are now allowing porch visits. Set up deacons or care team members to vist with social distancing and masks.

\*Suggestions for Care Team leaders: Vary the means of communication: cards, phone calls, e-mail sharing of church news, etc. What to say: Share any good news, send a Scripture or short prayer, share a poem or book, share life stories of members.

• Youth groups are doing safe distancing or Zoom meetings. How can young people connect?

\*Design cards to send to older members: Paintings, drawings, messages

\*A teenager might enjoy having a prayer partner. Just a call once a week to share and check in with someone who lives alone.

\*During summer months, set up pen pal connections.

#### A Gift from the Synod of the Covenant... A Sabbath for Pastors Interim Synod Executive Prepares Worship Service

The Synod of the Covenant (which includes this presbytery) wants to offer our pastors and worship leaders a Sabbath from worship preparation and leadership in recognition of faithful ministry in this challenging time. Interim Synod Executive Reverend Chip Hardwick is coordinating a service based on Romans 6:12-23, one of the lectionary passages for June 28th. You'll be able to download the worship service as either the whole service (which will involve liturgists from throughout the Synod), or just the scripture and sermon. You could use this service on 6/28, or any time afterwards.

Of course, there is no requirement to use the service! The Synod is offering it with hopes that our pastors and churches will receive it as a gift to enjoy a Sabbath Sunday. \*Via phone can they help people learn Zoom, Facebook or Live Streaming for worship services and other gatherings?

• Remember Older Adults are often those in the "at risk" category who have always been active, involved, even current leaders, and now are completely isolated. How can they be the helpers? (Make caring phone calls, Chair a care group, Write a prayer or devotion to be used in worship or as a midweek devotional, use an interest or skill to prepare a program for circle, for the youth, to be used at a future time.)

\*Someone may have a special craft or skill such as sewing, quilting, painting. Does the church need more masks? Is a liturgical piece needed for the church? A banner? A stole?

### **Physical and Medical Support:**

- At this point, three months into isolation, a letter from the pastor listing some highlights of the church, naming regrets, (ex. home communion or in home visits are impossible).
- Include in the above or in a separate mailing, a questionnaire with addressed envelope. Assess current needs (ex. Is your grocery or prescription plan working? Do you need additional help?)
- Gather volunteers (healthy retirees and others) who are willing to check on each person.
- Pro-bono help: Is there anyone who is struggling with taxes, bills, paper work, due to isolation from family members? Is there a retired attorney, banker, someone who would willingly (and legally) provide pro-bono help for this person? 211 is also a great resource to help needs.
- Pay attention in these days, to any signs of stress related to news reports. Encourage trust in their faith and God's care, but listen to worries and concerns.
