Lancaster First Presbyterian Church - "All Things Work for Good," Paul wrote!

We, First Presbyterian Church in Lancaster, cancelled worship on March 15. The menacing reality of Corvid-19 was no longer to be ignored. One week later we began live stream worship via YouTube and Facebook. A lively worship team of a dozen brought inspiring worship to the people of God in exile from the sanctuary. Our virtual worship extended to worshipers in twelve states. The average number of views was 500, tripling our worshipers, physically separated but united in spirit.

Humanity's extremity is God's opportunity. What could not be accomplished in a decade was achieved in just a few months. New video cameras were installed. New computer hardware and software were introduced. Music was transformed from traditional to a blended mix including a more modern style. Large screen monitors are being installed.

If I had asked our older members a year ago what they would think about live streaming our worship, they would have asked, "Why?" Now during the pandemic, we receive emails and text messages weekly thanking us for this virtual offering of worship.

Two months ago I established the *Great Return Task Force* to plan and prepare for our eventual return to public sanctuary worship, albeit under COVID-19 safe practices. While many are now returning to Sunday sanctuary worship, we are committed to continuing live stream worship for our shut-ins and our new worship friends across the country.

"All things work for good," Paul wrote. God has used this wilderness of the coronavirus to transform our worship services and lead us into new ministries.

PSV CONGREGATIONS ARE BECOMING MATTHEW 25 CONGREGATIONS...

Congratulations to the 9 congregations of the Presbytery of Scioto Valley who have applied for and have been designated as Matthew 25 churches within the PC (USA). These congregations have answered the call to accept the Matthew 25 invitation. Matthew 25:31-46 calls all of us to actively engage in the world around us, so our faith comes alive and we wake up to new possibilities. Convicted by this passage, both the 222nd and 223rd General Assemblies (2016 and 2018) exhorted the PC(USA) to act boldly and compassionately to serve people who are hungry, oppressed, imprisoned or poor. By accepting the Matthew 25 invitation, you can help your church and our denomination become a more relevant presence in the world. We recognize Christ's urgent call to be a church of action, where God's love, justice and mercy shine forth and are contagious.



And we will rejoice as our re-energized faith unites all Presbyterians for a common and holy purpose: our common identity to do mission.

West Berlin Presbyterian Church in Delaware, First Presbyterian Church in Waverly, Overbrook Presbyterian Church in Columbus, First Presbyterian Church in Athens, First Presbyterian Church in Grove City, Plain City Presbyterian Church, Condit Presbyterian Church, First Presbyterian Church in London and Broad Street Presbyterian Church in Columbus have all heard the invitation and responded, committing themselves to this common mission. And you can join them.

Each of our congregations across the denomination are unique in character and context. Some are in rural areas where poverty and oppression may look very different than an inner-city church. While not every church may have communities that exhibit all three focus areas, every church is surely in a situation where they are dealing with one. Perhaps your church is in need of revitalization as a missional force in the community such as Building Congregational Vitality. Maybe you have a deep desire to join others in Identifying and Dismantling Structural Racism. Still others are inspired to help find the causes of and Eradicate Systemic Poverty. While not every church can make the same affect, it is our common responsibility as human beings and Christians to work to restore equality and bring justice to every sibling everywhere. Joining with others in this common mission is an opportunity to share in making a real difference in lives.

To PSV Friends and Colleagues...Thoughts from your Executive Presbyter, Jeannie Harsh

These are extraordinary times for all of us, and all of you have taken extraordinary and creative measures to continue to grow in faith amid a time when worship in person has been unsafe and nearly impossible for many, maybe most, congregations. Along with our Presbytery Coordinating Team, I encourage you and your congregations to carefully consider the challenges and dangers of returning to in-person worship too soon. In these days when we imagine that everything has changed, it is difficult to remember that the one constant we have is that it is in the midst of change that God and the Holy Spirit abide most closely with us. As churches, there are other things that will always remain part of our work as God's mission in the world. There will always be needs to attend to. And there will always be changes in leadership in our churches at the most troubling and inconvenient times. As your presbytery executive, I keep you in my thoughts and prayers, and am always available to help you navigate these changes in leadership. In other times, when a pastor left a congregation, regardless of the circumstance, I treasured the opportunity to come to be with you and lead worship as a reminder that you are an integral part of our presbytery and always in my work and prayers especially during transitions. It always enriches me to visit with you all. Unfortunately, as the COVID-19 threat continues to loom as an aggressive enemy, I must follow the guidance of our denomination and our Presbytery Coordinating Team. Therefore, I will not be able to fill the pulpit as I once would have, even though I wish I still could. We share the frustration of these circumstances, and, with the help of the Commissions for Congregational Life and Church Professionals and all of us on the presbytery staff, we want to keep you moving forward and embracing the future with energy, intelligence, imagination, and love. I continue to regret that I cannot accept invitations to worship with you in-person in this time. However, as you may have read, I am preparing a Matthew 25 video worship service that you can use to fill the absence of a pastor, whether you are in transition or are just giving your pastor a day off to say thanks for their leadership during this extraordinary time. Or, you may choose to use it in November when Matthew 25 shows up in our lectionary. I wish each of you God's peace and surprising blessings as we journey through this extraordinary time together...Jeannie
