#### Presbytery of Scioto Valley Congregations To Be Lifted Up in Prayer

We will begin alphabetically to share about our 88 congregations. As we share and celebrate our wide variety of congregations, we hope you and your congregation will join with us and lift them up in prayer too.



The Amanda Presbyterian Church began life as the Clearcreek Church. The Reverend William Jones, was the first pastor. He was

also the first moderator of the former Columbus Presbytery. On April 4, 1834, the Columbus Presbytery voted to divide the congregation of the Clearcreek Church into two churches. The church of Amanda and the church at Tarleton were then formed. From 13 original members the congregation grew to 90 within a year. A frame house of worship was erected but was later abandoned as a church in 1879. On February 10, 1878, during the pastorate of the Reverend McMillen, the congregation voted to put up a new building on land given to the congregation in 1845 by John and Charlotte Bogle. The building was completed April 19, 1879. A chancel was added in 1896, and a new Christian



The Amesville Presbyterian Church was organized March 26, 1892, under the leadership of Charles R, Fisk, a

mission worker who became its first pastor. Leaders from the Athens Presbyterian Church and the Canaan Presbyterian Church assisted in the organizing process. The first building was a 30 by 40 foot brick structure in what was known as Mudsock, an area just west of the present village of Amesville. In 1858, the congregation moved to the Amesville Academy which was located across from the present building into which the congregation moved in 1867. For much of its history, the Amesville congregation has been linked with the New England congregations and with the Amesville United Methodist congregation. In February 1987 this long-time working relationship was formalized in the

Education unit in September of 1957. A new carillon unit added a spiritual element to the entire community of Amanda. This small membership congregation is currently served by Liz Tietz, Commissioned Pastor.

establishment of the Amesville-New England Ecumenical Cooperative Parish. The Amesville congregation has been involved in the larger work of the denomination both through financial support and involvement of its leaders.

Beginning last September, Worthington Presbyterian Church (WPC) has been offering TWO "At Home" Sunday School options for K-6<sup>th</sup> graders. The curriculum we are using is "Growing in God's Love" A Story Bible Curriculum

The Director of Children's Ministry records a 15-minute video with song, prayer, Bible story, wonder questions and a short activity. Parents can add to the lesson with "At Home" supplemental activities, ideas and book and video recommendations, which are emailed to the families each week. Families can watch the video alone, just do the "At Home" lesson or do both pieces. Families can do one thing one week and a different thing next week. Families can do Sunday School on a Tuesday night or a Friday afternoon....whenever it works best for their family. Each week is a stand-alone lesson, you do not have to do the lesson before.

The Nominating Committee is pleased to announce that they are unanimously recommending the Reverend Bill Gause, pastor of the Columbus Overbrook Presbyterian Church, as their candidate for the position of the PSV Stated Clerk to be elected at the February 16 Presbytery Meeting. This part-time position of Stated Clerk for our Presbytery is currently being filled by elder Jim Wison, who has been graciously and effectively serving as the Temporary Stated Clerk. The Presbytery of Scioto Valley Stated Clerk serves as the Presbytery corporate secretary and parliamentarian. The Clerk also provides support to the Presbytery Commissions, committees and other entities of the Presbytery.

#### Per Capita Relief Policy...

Under this "relief policy", the Presbytery will grant immediate relief to any congregation who has experienced a 10% or more loss of membership during 2020 and will base 2021's per capita on your year 2020 membership. If you have had a significant loss of membership in 2020, you can apply for relief under this policy and your 2021 per capita will be based on your year-end membership as of 2020 – not 2019 as under the current policy. If you want

to request relief under this new policy, please email either Bob Gustafson, Temporary Treasurer; John Wyckoff, Financial Assistant; or Dagmar Romage, Administrative Assistant. This relief will not be automatic.


