From the Planning Team...

We give thanks to God for more than 60 participants at our first seminar on January 23rd. You, as an individual, or as a church team, can still join us for the remaining sessions. For more information, or to register, email Les Sauer at **lessauer@hotmail.com**.

During our first seminar, Cynthia Holder Rich talked about "What is Mission? Why do we do mission?" giving historical background on *missio dei* and the 1910 Edinburgh mission conference, and how the PC(USA) has changed its way of following Matthew 25 and Acts 15 as we do mission. A highlight of the first seminar was to hear Mission co-worker Michael Ludwig speak about "Community Health Evangelism" training 90 pastors in Niger, reaching out with both physical and spiritual help in a country that is 97% Muslim.

As a follow up to this first session, you might engage your congregation's prayer teams by inviting committees to open their meetings with a devotional from the Mission Yearbook for Prayer and Study (**presbyterianmission.org/yearbook**).

You are especially invited to join us on February 20th when we will hear about "New Testament Models of Mission" and visit with Mission co-workers Mark Hare and Jenny Bent, serving in Costa Rica.

PSV Self-Development of People program grants awarded...

As your congregation begins to prepare for the 2021 One Great Hour of Sharing Offering (OGHS), please note that our Presbytery's Self-Development of People program was able to

award two grants to organizations in this presbytery last year as a result of our unified giving through the OGHS.

The Mid-Ohio Workers Association received \$4,999.00 for outreach to the Hispanic community (see their "thank you" video: **SWAP2021 ok.mp4**), and the Franklin County Youth Council was awarded \$3,000.00 for its "Keep It Moving" project.

Grant applications are received throughout the year and funded, based on national SDOP criteria, to any group within the bounds of our presbytery that are:

- Presented, owned, and controlled by the group of economically poor people who will benefit directly from it.
- Address long-term correction of conditions that keep people bound by poverty and oppression.
- Be sensitive to the environment while accomplishing its goal(s) and objectives.
- Not advocate violence as a means of accomplishing its goal(s) and objectives.

Presbytery of Scioto Valley Congregations Lifted Up in Prayer

First Presbyterian Church

Continuously since

its organization in 1817, the Bloomingburg Presbyterian Church members work to serve its community and follow Christ's teachings.

Influenced by its first pastor, "Father" William Dickey, members supported the anti-slavery movement; their homes were often stations on the Underground Railroad. Later they took a strong stand on liquor and local option.

This small membership congregation recently received a presbytery congregational mission grant supporting their faithful involvement and service to their community.



Bremen-Bethel Presbyterian Church

The Presbyterians came to the Rushcreek Valley during the early settlement of this

area. In 1806, a log church was built north of the Village of Bremen. Reverend John Wright, from the Presbytery of Pittsburgh, was sent to serve Lancaster (then Hockhocking) and the Rushcreek churches. In 1824, the Bethel Church was organized. The records of Licking Presbytery show that the Bremen Church was organized in 1844. In 1932, the two congregations of the Bethel and Bremen Churches merged to form the Bremen-Bethel Presbyterian Church. The present building was constructed during 1907, and the first service in this building was held on Palm Sunday in 1908.

A World of Thanks to our Congregations...

An article by Commissioned Pastor Christine Burns, former member of PSV Operations... 2020 was filled with unprecedented difficulties for congregations everywhere. In the midst of a pandemic, when many of our PC (USA) congregations were unable to worship or became stretched beyond what they believed they could do, new ways to worship had to be engaged and celebrated.



Amid financial hardships, the faithful members of the worshipping communities of our presbytery rose to extraordinary measures to support the connectional nature of our denomination through the payment of per capita. Many of our churches paid all of their per capita despite the difficulties because it is just that important that we keep our commitment to our sister churches across the denomination. In fact, 61 of our Presbytery of Scioto Valley congregations paid 100%, or more, of their per capita, with many others paying a large portion to support the mission and operations of our denomination and our presbytery. A total of \$406,463.00 was contributed for per capita, with an additional amount of \$158,098.00 in generous funds donated through mission fund commitments. Thank you for your support of the ministry and mission of our presbytery, our synod, and the General Assembly through your dedicated contributions of per capita. In a year that was fraught with potential barriers, we worshiped and worked our mission in new ways to stay always connected, always faithful, and always listening for the reforming work of the Holy Spirit to speak her wisdom. Well done, good and faithful servants!
