

#### Columbus Christ Presbyterian Church

As Columbus was growing to the north and east,

seeds for two churches were planted. In 1890, two lots at the corner of St. Clair and Leonard were donated and a chapel was built. The chapel was dedicated the following year, and services were under the direction of First Presbyterian Church (Broad Street). In July 1894, St. Clair Presbyterian Church was formally organized. Meanwhile, a congregation was organized in the Linden area in 1905. The first building was located at Myrtle and Greenwich. A retired Presbyterian minister, Dr. Kohr, served for twelve years. Kohr Presbyterian Church was dedicated in 1915. In 1925, St. Clair moved to Leonard and Hamilton. In 1951, a changing neighborhood and the construction of I-71, forced St. Clair to move. They chose a site just south of Oakland Park and Cleveland Avenue. Ten years later, they built at a new site, on Cleveland Avenue, near Morse Road. The name was changed to Northview, in 1976, Kohr Memorial and Northview merged to form Christ Presbyterian Church. In 1988, a new sanctuary was built. Christ Church continues to faithfully serves its community under the faithful leadership of Commissioned Pastor Elder Pam Patterson.



#### Columbus Covenant Presbyterian Church

Covenant Presbyterian Church in Upper Arlington,

Ohio, began in 1953, after a study determined the need for a church in the area. Worship services were held in a theater, with church school classes in the upstairs of a nearby restaurant. In 1964 the church moved to its present site which has had many additions in recent years.

Covenant is an accepting, welcoming community sharing the glory of God's love with all. Its people are deeply involved in the mission of the larger community through many organizations such as food pantries, Habitat for Humanity, Meals on Wheels, Hoge Memorial ministries, support for mission ministries in the area and other far-reaching activities. The breadth and depth of programming offers Bible studies and community programs, including Covenant Presbyterian Women, and other ministries.

Covenant's members throughout the history of the congregation have been dedicated to a caring and nurturing ministry as well as to educating themselves. The Reverend Joel Esala serves as the Pastor.

#### **Continuing Guidance for our PSV Congregations**


From Your Presbytery Coordinating Team (CT)
