WESTSIDE URBAN MINISTRY COAT DRIVE

Thanks to the collaborative efforts of a number of PSV congregations, Westside Urban Ministry (WUM) had another successful coat drive. During October and November 2020, Broad Street, Covenant, and Overbrook hosted drive-by coat drop-offs; other congregations collected coats and delivered them to Hoge PC.

In late November, over 650 coats were sorted and bagged for distribution to schools on the West Side of Columbus: 24 bags for elementary schools; 16 bags for middle schools; and 10 bags for high schools. On December 3, 2020, school personnel drove to Hoge Memorial Presbyterian Church and collected the coats for their schools.

After the first of the year, more coats were donated, including some from First Community Church that had come through Burlington Coat Factory. These coats have been distributed to schools, including the Hilltop Learning Extension Center.

WUM thanks all the congregations and individuals who helped make the coat drive successful. In a year that has been difficult for many, school children on the West Side have warm coats.

Columbus Crestview Presbyterian Church

Crestview

Presbyterian Church was organized in 1915 and incorporated in 1922.

The church faithfully serves the Clintonville area in an area between Arcadia Avenue and East North Broadway. The church continues to host many local groups including Alcoholics Anonymous.



Columbus Glen Echo Presbyterian Church

In April 1916, a group of thirteen

members of the First United Presbyterian Church on Long Street decided to start a church in the north end of Columbus. The congregation was formally organized in May 1918 with twenty-four charter members and was served by students from Xenia Theological Seminary until September when Crestview Church is actively involved in local mission including the Community Resources Center and Faith Mission. A yearly Strawberry Festival is held for the neighborhood during the month of June. There are Sunday School classes for children and adults and adult choir, bell choir and children's choir.

The church is faithfully led by Elder Carol Bogaards. Reverend Lee Platt, a neighbor pastor, serves as the Session Moderator and celebrates the sacraments with this small, but strong, congregation.

the Reverend Harry A. Thompson was appointed by presbytery to supply the congregation. He remained pastor until July 1927.

In 1930, the cornerstone of the present building was laid at the corner of Calumet Street and Cliffside Drive. The stone building, on the edge of a cool, shaded ravine, blends with the beauty of the forest trees.

This small membership congregation is faithfully led by the Reverend Lee Platt as pastor. Over the years and continuing into the future, this congregation welcomes and hosts a variety of community ministries and services.
