Columbus Korean Presbyterian Church In 1969, God

gathered the



Korean immigrants and students in the Columbus area and started the first Korean church. It was the non-denominational Korean Church of Columbus. During the '70's and '80's, the number of Korean immigrants increased as a result of changes in the immigration laws that opened doors for Korean immigrants. Many denominations started Korean churches. Columbus Overbrook Presbyterian Church Late in 1912, the



Columbus Presbytery decided to establish a church at the north end of Columbus. Land was purchased at Oakland Park Avenue and Broadway Court. A chapel was built, and the first service held September 27, 1914. In 1915 Oakland Park Presbyterian Church was formed. The congregation outgrew the building after World War II. In 1950, a new church was planned at North High Street and Croswell Road. With the move to the Even though the Presbyterian Church is the largest denomination in Korea, it was the last one to start in this area. The Korean Presbyterian Church of Columbus offered its first worship service at the St. Andrew Presbyterian Church in October 1991 as a new church development of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). Reverend Bok Sun Kim served as the first pastor from November 1991 to May 1992, and the Reverend Sung Koo Yoon, as the second pastor from November 1992 to August 1994.

On October 10, 1993, the church was organized as the 113th church of the Presbytery of Scioto Valley. In November 1994, the congregation moved to the Worthington Presbyterian Church and was graciously housed there for several years.

As this new congregation grew, they found land and built a lovely church building in Southern Delaware County. The Korean Presbyterian Church of Columbus is faithfully led by the Reverend Joon Won Lee as pastor. Joon also serves on the Presbytery's Commission for Church Professionals. new location in 1953, the congregation voted to change the name to The Overbrook Presbyterian Church.

Overbrook PC continues to be a caring community of disciples of Jesus Christ. The church welcomes and celebrates all. They are a community of God's people who serve the needs of God's diverse creation through worship, community outreach, education and fellowship.

Overbrook pastors, members and leaders faithfully work to be a center for worship, action and support in the heart of the Clintonville Community in the Columbus area. The church has an excellent and highly respected weekday preschool. A few years ago, this welcoming congregation remodeled classroom spaces to make a home for the offices of the Presbytery of Scioto Valley.

The Overbrook congregation serves both world and neighborhood as they live out their commitment to local and global mission and ministries. Overbrook is faithfully led by Senior Pastor Reverend William Gause and Associate Pastor Reverend Mary Gause.

The Seven Marks of Vital Congregations...

As part of our Matthew 25 initiative, the PC(USA) has named Seven Marks of vital congregations. The second one is **Intentional Authentic Evangelism**. How do you scare off a Presbyterian? Mention *evangelism*. No, that's not true of all of us, but there is a certain kind of sharing the gospel that feels like a hammer. Having a

formula for talking about Jesus is artificial, and it simply does not work for most of us. And... if God is at the center of our lives and we profess Jesus Christ as Lord, how can we not reveal that to those around us? We need to help people find their "God language" – words to express their experiences of the holy and their commitment to kingdom-building justice. Intentional Authentic Evangelism is all about relationships. We get to know people because we want to know them, because becoming closer is already bringing God's dream for the world closer. In the context of those relationships, we cannot help but reveal our love for God, our commitment to Christ, our life in the Spirit. May it be so. Lenten Laments for Racial Injustice...

According to the Rev. Dr. David Gambrell, associate for worship in the PC(USA) <u>Office of</u> <u>Theology and Worship</u>, the practice of lament is an appropriate form of worship and prayer for the season of Lent. "The psalms of lament provide a model for us — a way to acknowledge the contrast between the evil, injustice and violence of this world and the promise of God's realm of righteousness, justice and peace," he said.

In the illustration below, you can see what Spring Church came up with for the bi-weekly worship services during Lent and Easter. In each lament, Spring Church prays from **Psalm 90, in the Message.** The opening and closing words sound the same from week to week: "God, in sadness we come to you. We all end up in the same place — we all come from the dust, and we all return to the dust."


