The Reverend Donald Pendell, Honorably Retired PSV Minister Writes a Letter to the Columbus Dispatch...

March 21 marked not only the end of winter and the beginning of spring, but also my 92nd birthday, and a great cause for celebration and gratitude. How is this possible, considering my two replaced hips, diabetes, heart attacks, COPD and the threat of Covid-19? While all of these have kept me in the house (excluding doctor visits and afternoon strolls with my walker and my son), during this past year, I have actually been healthier than I have been for years. Not even a cold – masking works. My social life has increased: electronically. Our church services are available online 24/7, as are Zoom Bible studies and telephone conference prayer groups. My church's four pastors are busier than ever, and membership is growing. Our food pantry ministry has grown, and our deacons have "every member monthly phone calls." My church, Worthington Presbyterian Church, announced that last year we paid off all the hospital bills of some of Ohio's poorest in 29 counties. That really makes my "winter of most-content" one of real gratitude. Thank you Jesus!

The PSV Commission on Nurture and Outreach (CNO) is offering an online event Saturday, May 1, 10:00 -11:30am "Understanding How Historic and Structural Racism Have Shaped Central Ohio's Neighborhoods Today", led by Michael Wilkos, Sr. Vice President, Community Impact, United Way of Central Ohio.

Columbus and Central Ohio have both experienced considerable growth over the past decades compared to our nearby cities. We are often on lists of up-and-coming regions in the country. However, our progress has not been evenly felt. Central Ohio has some of the highest rates of income and racial segregation in the United States. Housing costs have been soaring all decade while incomes have not kept pace. Some areas of the region are experiencing rapid gentrification while other areas of the region struggle. This presentation uncovers structural and historic racism and how they have contributed to inequity today. Covering far ranging issues from highways, housing programs, busing, and redlining—and how they have contributed to the inequities of today.

Presbytery of Scioto Valley Congregations Lifted Up in Prayer

Columbus Westminster Presbyterian Church

Westminster is a church where everybody knows your name. Small and friendly, Westminster is a congregation that cares for one another and reaches out to feed the hungry and minister to the homeless in the neighborhood, city, and God's world.

The first worship was held on Dec. 4, 1955. The first group organized at Westminster was a group called the Westminster Winners to make calls for 10 weeks. Over 100

people attended the first social event which was a "Get Acquainted Night" covered dish held on Feb. 18, 1956 at the local school.

A groundbreaking ceremony for the church building at the corner of Amesbury Way and Schoolhouse Lane in Lincoln Village was held on Easter Sunday, April 1, 1956. The church was officially organized on April 8, 1956 with 100 members. The first worship service was held on October 4, 1956. By Nov. 1959 the membership was 398. A 3-year building fund campaign was launched on Oct of 1960 to add an additional church school facility. The area around the church continued to grow with many more houses and churches in the area.

A building campaign ensued in the beginning of the 21st century when decisions were made to revamp the sanctuary and the church entrances to make the church more accessible for anyone with mobility challenges.

Today this faithful, nurturing congregation under the leadership of the Reverend Doug Browne continues to emphasize a sense of belonging to the community, with a commitment to mission throughout the world.

The Seven Marks of Vital Congregations...

As part of our Matthew 25 initiative, the PC(USA) has named seven marks of vital congregations. **The fourth mark** or quality that alive congregations embody is to **Empower Servant Leadership**. This is both about *who* is doing the leading and about *how* it is being done. Each member, of all ages, learns to name and claim her spiritual gifts. Each is valued for what he brings to the community. It isn't merely the pastor's job to create a church that others value. Power isn't something to be assigned and hoarded. The power of the Spirit is available to all, and the fruits of the Spirit can be seen among people who honor one another and share both burdens and responsibilities. Ideas for ministry – and the resources for fulfilling them – come from the congregation and not just the staff. We can do so much more – with lighter hearts and deeper joy – when many gather together to create beloved communities that go out into the world with God's healing love.
