Grant available to Presbytery of Scioto Valley Congregations!

Congregations of the presbytery are once again invited to take advantage of a \$500 grant that has been approved by the Presbytery Commission for Congregation Life. Some congregations took advantage of the \$500 technology grant when it was offered in 2020, but many of our congregations did not. This round, we have also included re-opening expenses in addition to technology expenses as eligible for up to \$500 in reimbursement from Presbytery. The intention of the grant is to help equip our congregations with technology for ministry or with resources for reopening their buildings in the midst of Covid. As many churches are discovering, we will likely be utilizing technology for worship, learning, fellowship, and administration for the indefinite future, and we certainly have much to do to ensure the safety of those who enter our buildings when they reopen.

One way to take advantage of the grant would be to purchase equipment that allows your congregation to stream worship and other activities to social media platforms. Congregations who wish to take advantage of the grant for technology or reopening expenses should make their purchases and submit their receipt(s) to the presbytery for reimbursement no later than September 1, 2021. The PSV Commission on Nurture and Outreach (CNO) is offering an online event Saturday, May 1, 10:00 -11:30 am "Understanding How Historic and Structural Racism Have Shaped Central Ohio's Neighborhoods Today", led by Michael Wilkos, Sr. Vice President, Community Impact, United Way of Central Ohio.

Columbus and Central Ohio have both experienced considerable growth over the past decades compared to our nearby cities. We are often on lists of up and coming regions in the country.

However, our progress has not been evenly felt. Central Ohio has some of the highest rates of income and racial segregation in the United States. Housing costs have been soaring all decade while incomes have not kept pace. Some areas of the region are experiencing rapid gentrification while other areas of the region struggle. This presentation uncovers structural and historic racism and how they have contributed to inequity today. Covering far ranging issues from highways, housing programs, busing, and redlining—and how they have contributed to the inequities of today.

Delaware First Presbyterian Church

First Presbyterian Church of Delaware was founded in 1810 under the leadership of Joseph S. Hughs, a Presbyterian from Pennsylvania. The congregation worshiped alternately in three locations - Delaware, Liberty, and Radnor until 1836.

The Delaware church met in the county courthouse until 1825. It was there that Rutherford B. Hayes was baptized as an infant and President John Quincy Adams attended services. In 1825 a small stone structure was built on the present site in downtown Delaware. A large brick sanctuary was built in 1834.

The church has a long history of involvement in civic life and world-wide mission and has generously supported missionaries throughout the years.

Delaware First is a welcoming and sense of family intergenerational church that values relationships with God, one another, the community and the world. This faithful congregation is currently led by the Reverend Deb Patterson as pastor.

Delaware Liberty Presbyterian Church

Near the birthplace of Tecumseh, in the year 1810, a handful of white settlers met to organize Liberty Presbyterian Church. Rev. Joseph Smith Hughes was called as the first Minister of the Gospel in 1815.

The style and spirit of the church was set by the ministers and elders who served Liberty Church in its formative years. They possessed "liberal education and oratorical powers" plus a



penchant for festivity and sport. Ministry with and for increasing numbers of settlers grew and flourished through the years. The first building was erected in 1820 and still stands today.

This large and lively congregation continues to be committed to passionate preaching and living out the Gospel in it mission and ministries. Liberty is currently in a time of transition as the congregation begins to search for the next called pastor. This faithful congregation is currently led by the Reverend Kemper Huber as transitional pastor and the Reverend Kyle Doebler as Associate Pastor.

Scioto Valley Presbytery is a Matthew 25 Presbytery! Matthew 25 is a PC(USA) initiative that has three focuses -

As part of our Matthew 25 initiative, the PC(USA) has named seven marks of vital congregations. **The fifth mark** of congregational vitality is **Spirit-Inspired Worship**. Worship doesn't just make us "feel good." It is not rote or mechanical. It is not entertainment. Our worship should thrive on wonder, gratitude, and hope. Yes, we hunger and thirst for God: may our worship be sites of God experiences, of

connection with the Holy and with Mystery. All are invited into active participation with the Spirit of the Living God. We offer praise, lament, thanksgiving, stories and questions, as we seek salvation for our wounds and those of the world. We search the scriptures, sing our faith, and sacrament our way into new life. We find comfort, wisdom, call, challenge, and transformation. The truth is that God longs to be in relationship with us, and worship needs to open us to the One in whom we live and move and have our being.
