Saturday, May 1, 10:00 a.m. -11:30 a.m. "Understanding How Historic and Structural Racism Have Shaped Central Ohio's Neighborhoods Today"

The PSV Commission on Nurture and Outreach (CNO) is offering an online event Saturday, May 1, 10:00 -11:30 am "Understanding How Historic and Structural Racism Have Shaped Central Ohio's Neighborhoods Today", led by Michael Wilkos, Sr. Vice President, Community Impact, United Way of Central Ohio.

Columbus and Central Ohio have both experienced considerable growth over the past decades compared to our nearby cities. We are often on lists of up and coming regions in the country. However, our progress has not been evenly felt. Central Ohio has some of the highest rates of income and racial segregation in the United States. Housing costs have been soaring all

decade while incomes have not kept pace. Some areas of the region are experiencing rapid gentrification while other areas of the region struggle. This presentation uncovers structural and historic racism and how they have contributed to inequity today. Covering far ranging issues from highways, housing programs, busing, and redlining—and how they have contributed to the inequities of today.

Grant available to Presbytery of Scioto Valley Congregations!

Congregations of the presbytery are once again invited to take advantage of a \$500 grant that has been approved by the Presbytery Commission for Congregation Life. Some congregations took advantage of the \$500 technology grant when it was offered in 2020, but many of our congregations did not. This round, we have also included re-opening expenses in addition to technology expenses as eligible for up to \$500 in reimbursement from Presbytery. The intention of the grant is to help equip our congregations with technology for ministry or with resources for reopening their buildings in the midst of Covid. As many churches are discovering, we will likely be utilizing technology for worship, learning, fellowship, and administration for the indefinite future, and we certainly have much to do to ensure the safety of those who enter our buildings when they reopen.

One way to take advantage of the grant would be to purchase equipment that allows your congregation to stream worship and other activities to social media platforms. Congregations who wish to take advantage of the grant for technology or reopening expenses should make their purchases and submit their receipt(s) to the presbytery for reimbursement no later than September 1, 2021. Delaware Old Stone Presbyterian Church

The Old Stone Presbyterian Church of Delaware was founded in 1810 by the Reverend Joseph Hughes. The current sanctuary was built in 1835. In the early 1970's, the church had

dwindled in numbers and was forced to consider closing its doors. Through the financial support of the Presbytery, the church was able to call a full-time pastor in 1977. An educational wing was completed in 1988 which gave the church the much-needed Sunday School and fellowship space. In August of 1989, a fire destroyed the sanctuary and central portion of the church. The educational wing was saved from fire destruction but suffered smoke and water damage. The congregation united in the determination to rebuild the church using the stone walls that had been left standing. The church was rededicated in 1991. The church grew and became self-supporting again. Today, the Old Stone Presbyterian Church is a lively, mission-oriented, friendly and welcoming faith community in the continuing growing Delaware County, just west of downtown Delaware. Old Stone Presbyterian Church is an intergenerational community of faith rooted in the love of God. Worship is not only centered in prayer, it is expressed in everything the church family does. This congregation is deeply rooted in the Holy Scriptures, life's only guidebook, and is a welcoming community for everyone!



Delaware West Berlin Presbyterian Church

The West Berlin Presbyterian Church (Delaware County) was founded on January of 1876 by 18 members of the Berlin Station community. The building in which this small membership congregation worships was built in 1877 at a cost of \$1,700. An annex was added in 1957, and two purchases of adjacent land provided a four-acre site. In 1933, Gladys McNamara was elected an Elder in the church and was the first woman Elder to represent a church in the Presbytery of Scioto Valley. The mission of West Berlin

Presbyterian Church is to follow God's law and act in true faith by being a welcoming place where community members come to learn, take part in worship, find fellowship and serve those in need for the glory of God. This faith community is delightfully and effectively led by Commissioned Pastor, Doctor Robert Gustafson.

The Seven Marks of Vital Congregations...

As part of our Matthew 25 initiative, the PC(USA) has named seven marks of vital congregations. The sixth mark of congregational vitality is **Caring Relationships**. We talk about church families a lot – how evident is it that people love each other within your church family? Church can't be a social club or clique. Despite our reputation in the culture, followers of Christ are called to forego judgment and to outdo

one another in giving each other honor. Is it safe to ask questions in your congregation? Can you talk about controversial and complicated subjects without dividing into factions? What is the level of trust? We all need to feel worthy of love and to feel like we belong; this is true for members who have been there all their lives and for someone walking in who has never been to a church before. Does *everyone* feel included? Is it safe to be vulnerable? Radical hospitality, journeying with folks through hard things, telling the truth of our lives and moving beyond forgiveness to reconciliation are all part of communities that prioritize caring relationships.
