The southern portion of the presbytery is distinguished by an Appalachian culture, where there are many small towns and much rugged open country. Scioto Valley Presbytery is represented in 21 Counties: Athens, Delaware, Fairfield, Fayette, Franklin, Gallia, Hocking, Jackson, Knox, Lawrence, Licking, Madison, Marion, Meigs, Morrow, Pickaway, Pike, Ross, Scioto, Union, and Vinton.

**EARTH CARE CONGREGATIONS...** *"The earth is the Lord's and all that is in it"* Psalm 24:1 Earth Care Congregations is a project of the PC(USA). For information about becoming an Earth Care congregation, visit: [PCUSA.org](http://PCUSA.org). Is your church active in being stewards of God's earth? Four congregations in the Presbytery of Scioto Valley are currently certified as Earth Care Congregations: First Presbyterian Church of Granville, Circleville Presbyterian Church, First Presbyterian Church of Jackson and First Presbyterian Church of Delaware. Circleville Presbyterian Church members are pleased to share their journey in becoming an Earth Care Congregation.

**Circleville Presbyterian Church** began the pursuit of becoming an Earth Care Congregation in 2019. Jenna Acklin, a church member knowledgeable about green products for the home and a deep interest in ecology, agreed to lead a Green Team to explore Earth Care programs in four categories: Worship, Education, Facilities and Outreach. The Green Team completed a full audit of the church's activities and applied for Earth Care certification in January 2020. A facility audit and an energy plan with guidance from Ohio Interfaith Power and Light led a

project to upgrade interior lighting to LED technology. A water softener system was installed to make dishwashing in the commercial kitchen more effective, reducing the disposable products used. A Memorial Garden in front of the Sanctuary is being maintained by church volunteers. Composting was begun. The Green Team, comprised of ten volunteer members, continues to identify ways to include the whole congregation in Earth Care. We are recycling medicine bottles for world mission, bottle caps for our local Head Start program, and have begun an Equal Exchange coffee project. Church recycling has grown, and we are posting daily Earth Care messages and devotions on the church Facebook page. All committees are asked to consider the impact of work they do for worship, education, building and grounds, finance, hospitality, mission, and social justice. We believe the pledge we affirmed, that the earth and all creation are God's, and we are called to be stewards of this earth. With Christ we will celebrate a new creation, reconciled, restored, and renewed. *Story by Donna Solovey*

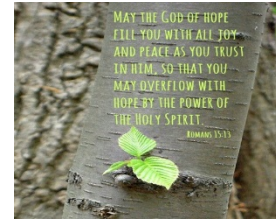

The PSV Commission on Nurture and Outreach (CNO) is offering an online event Saturday, May 1, 10:00 -11:30 am "Understanding How Historic and Structural Racism Have Shaped Central Ohio's Neighborhoods Today", led by Michael

Wilkos, Sr. Vice President, Community Impact, United Way of Central Ohio.

Columbus and Central Ohio have both experienced considerable growth over the past decades compared to our nearby cities. We are often on lists of up-and-coming regions in the country. However, our progress has not been evenly felt. Central Ohio has some of the highest rates of income and racial segregation in the United States. Housing costs have been soaring all decade while incomes have not kept pace. Some areas of the region are experiencing rapid gentrification while other areas of the region struggle. This presentation uncovers structural and historic racism and how they have contributed to inequity today. ### **Commission for Congregational Life Technology Grant money is still available to Presbytery of Scioto Valley Congregations!**

Congregations of the presbytery are invited to take advantage of a \$500 grant that has been approved by the Presbytery Commission for Congregation Life. Some congregations took advantage of the \$500 technology grant when it was offered in 2020, but many of our congregations did not. This round, we have also included re-opening expenses in addition to technology expenses as eligible for up to \$500 in reimbursement from Presbytery. The intention of the grant is to help equip our congregations with technology for ministry or with resources for reopening their buildings in the midst of Covid. As many churches are discovering, we will likely be utilizing technology for worship, learning, fellowship, and administration for the indefinite future, and we certainly have much to do to ensure the safety of those who enter our buildings when they reopen.

One way to take advantage of the grant would be to purchase equipment that allows your congregation to stream worship and other activities to social media platforms. Congregations who wish to take advantage of the grant for technology or reopening expenses should make their purchases and submit their receipt(s) to the presbytery for reimbursement no later than September 1, 2021. ### **Presbytery of Scioto Valley Congregations Lifted Up in Prayer**

The Commission for Congregational Life is committed to helping congregations promote and nurture healthy, faith-filled relationships and ministries in their congregations and communities. Our weekly Email news is highlighting our 88 congregations, celebrating their beginnings, histories, stories and ministries. We hope you and your congregation will join in celebrating our congregations and holding them in your prayers.

### **Dublin Presbyterian Church**

The Beginning: In 1998 a small group of residents established a Presbyterian Church (USA) in Dublin. The Scioto Valley Presbytery joined with these residents to search for a minister to organize the new church. The organizing minister, the Reverend Dr. Stanley Hall, conducted services at Scottish Corners Elementary School on Easter Sunday in 1991. On that Sunday, forty-eight adults signed a charter recognizing their commitment to join the Dublin Presbyterian Church. As a sign of commitment and support, The Presbytery of Scioto Valley

purchased five acres of land in 1991 for the future church building, which is the location today. The Dublin Presbyterian Church (USA) was officially chartered by the Scioto Valley Presbytery, Presbyterian Church (USA), in April 1992 with eighty-six adult members. As the Church family grew, they needed a permanent home. In January 1996, the ground was broken and on December 8, 1996, the first service at 5775 Dublinshire Drive took place. Today the Dublin Presbyterian Church is faithfully led by the Reverend Jennifer Eastman Hinkle as Pastor and Elder Peggy Holcomb as Commissioned Pastor.

### **Frankfort Presbyterian Church**

Plans to organize a Presbyterian Church in Frankfort got under way in the early 1840's. and was authorized by the Chillicothe Presbytery in 1851. In those years before the Civil War, the intentions of the congregation and the presbytery were made plain in the name of the church: The Free Presbyterian Church. From its origins, the Free Church was closely tied to the anti-slavery position of the Chillicothe Presbytery and to the other Presbyterian congregations in western Ross County at Concord and Buckskin. Starting from only nine members, the congregation grew over the years instilled with a loyalty to God, Christ and liberty, which inspired the first members. The current Sanctuary was built in 1893 and was one of the very first models of high ceiling coal furnaced sanctuaries built in small towns and cities all over the country and ingrained in the American psyche as the way a church is supposed to look. The Frankfort Church maintains an active mission serving its community with the leadership of Commissioned Pastor Elder Todd Thomas.

### **Frankfort Concord Presbyterian Church**

The Concord Presbyterian Church, established in 1805, is one of the three oldest congregations in Ohio still worshipping at the original site of their sanctuary. The current sanctuary was constructed in 1823. Concord is a beautiful country retreat situated on top of a hill in a grassy field with a wood of high maple and sycamore trees. Although the congregation has never been large the building served as a stop on the Underground Railroad during the years preceding the Civil War.

The congregation at Concord continues to be filled with enthusiasm for Scripture and service which mark all Christian congregations. Concord shares pastoral services with the Frankfort Church. Commissioned Pastor Elder Todd Thomas faithfully serves both congregations. In accord with the merciful acts of those who risked life and freedom to maintain the Underground Railroad, the benevolence activities of Concord Church continue.



### **The Seven Marks of Vital Congregations...**

As part of our Matthew 25 initiative, the PC(USA) has named seven marks of vital congregations.

The seventh mark of a congregation's vitality is ecclesial health. We often speak of our churches as families - and some family dinners are best avoided. What does it feel like when you walk into your occupied building? Is there a sense of acceptance and welcome? Is your congregation united - not do you all think the same way, but do you come together with common purpose and commitment? Healthy congregations emanate the fruit of the Spirit. They are complex and far from perfect, and it is evident that they are on the path of Love, working to follow Christ with generosity, love, and kindness. There are many elements under the category of church health: prayerful discernment, stewardship, pastor health, clarity in mission and ministries, and building use. Today we are a camp and retreat center serving public and private school groups, non-profit organizations, youth groups, sports teams, music and art associations, churches and faith-based groups of all denominations, families, businesses, and individuals. Our goal is to provide you with a renewing camp, outdoor education, or retreat experience. Kirkmont – "church on the mountain" – is located in Logan County near Bellefontaine, OH and consists of 278 acres nestled among gently rolling hills and pine groves. The site boasts a natural fen, two ponds (one for nature study and one for canoeing and fishing), cliffs and natural ravines. Kirkmont Center is classified by naturalists as one of



the most unique parcels of land in the State of Ohio, and offers many opportunities for school groups, universities, and adult education. Kirkmont Summer Update: During the summer of 2021 Kirkmont Center will continue to offer a \$50 discount to each weekly camper from PC(USA) churches in the four presbyteries Kirkmont serves. Kirkmont Center has not increased rates for three years and continues to be one of the lowest priced summer camps. Kirkmont also will continue to offer respite to clergy staying in the Habitat House Sunday night through Friday night at \$40 a night. The house is near the labyrinth and hiking trails, air conditioned with a kitchen, living and dining area, bathroom with shower, and two bedrooms. ## Committee on the Office of the General Assembly (COGA) approves docket for the 225th General Assembly

The docket for the 225th General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) has been confirmed and conversations continue about what happens for the 226th gathering in 2024. Thursday was a busy final day for the Committee on the Office of the General Assembly during its virtual three-day spring meeting.

While the logistics and other Assembly planning are still in the works, the hybrid model is set, allowing for in-person committee meetings and online plenaries that will take place between June 18 and July 9, 2022.

Staff from the Office of the General Assembly will be working with mid council leaders in an effort to move the process of electing commissioners along so that training and preparation for the new hybrid model can begin.
