How Historic and Structural Racism Have Shaped Central Ohio's Neighborhoods Today", led by Michael Wilkos, Sr. Vice President, Community Impact, United Way of Central Ohio.

Columbus and Central Ohio have both experienced considerable growth over the past decades compared to our nearby cities. We are often on lists of up-and-coming regions in the country. However, our progress has not been evenly felt. Central Ohio has some of the highest rates of income and racial segregation in the United States. Housing costs have been soaring all decade while incomes have not kept pace. Some areas of the region are experiencing rapid gentrification while other areas of the region struggle. This presentation uncovers structural and historic racism and how they have contributed to inequity today. Covering far ranging issues from highways, housing programs, busing, and redlining—and how they have contributed to the inequities of today. Commission for Congregational Life Technology Grant money is still available to Presbytery of Scioto Valley Congregations!

Congregations of the presbytery are invited to take advantage of a \$500 grant that has been approved by the Presbytery Commission for Congregation Life. Some congregations took advantage of the \$500 technology grant when it was offered in 2020, but many of our congregations did not. This round, we have also included re-opening expenses in addition to technology expenses as eligible for up to \$500 in reimbursement from Presbytery. The intention of the grant is to help equip our congregations with technology for ministry or with resources for reopening their buildings in the midst of Covid. As many churches are discovering, we will likely be utilizing technology for worship, learning, fellowship, and administration for the indefinite future, and we certainly have much to do to ensure the safety of those who enter our buildings when they reopen.

One way to take advantage of the grant would be to purchase equipment that allows your congregation to stream worship and other activities as your congregation re-opens. Persons who wish to take advantage of the grant for technology or reopening expenses should make their purchases and submit their receipt(s) to the presbytery for reimbursement no later than September 1, 2021. Fredericktown First Presbyterian Church

The village of Fredericktown was first plotted in 1807. In 1808, the first church in this pioneer village was the Presbyterian Church. This church held its services in the log cabins of various members, and then in the schoolhouse which was on the village square. After the war of 1812 services were held in the blockhouse on the bluff on East First Street. In 1840 the first permanent facility was built. Membership thrived and by 1845 Fredericktown First Presbyterian church helped organize two new churches in nearby communities. In 1885 a new and larger facility was constructed at 17 S. Main Street. That brick building is now a national landmark and is still in use.

In 2006, hoping to meet the needs of the community and to grow the church, Fredericktown First truly stepped out in faith to build a new addition with bright Sunday school rooms and a beautiful fellowship hall where community and congregation alike could gather for some of the most important events of human life. Celebrations of life and birth, meals and weddings, and gatherings for police and fire personnel are frequently welcomed. Commissioned Pastor Christine Burns says the church family wants to be known as more than just building history and tradition in the Village of Fredericktown. Seeking to be a church of today has led them down new paths. When faced with COVID-19, they found new ways to reach out to

Gahanna Mifflin Presbyterian Church

Mifflin Presbyterian Church, founded in 1840, is located in a fast-growing family community on the East Side of Columbus, Ohio. Once a small rural town, Gahanna is known for its active churches. Mifflin Presbyterian Church is the second oldest. Its name comes from the township. Membership continues to grow due to the large number of families who are moving into and around the Columbus Metropolitan area. The many members who have been received in the past several years represent a cross-section of the community. They have included married couples, families with young children and/or teenagers, as well as some retired and senior citizens.

Presently, the church is enjoying the fruits of its evangelism and ministry. The expansion of the facility began in 1990, which doubled the existing space to more than 30,000 square feet. The result is a glorious fellowship hall and additional classroom and meeting space to fill the needs of a growing congregation. The building is an excellent facility, planned and built to serve the community in which it is located. Over the years, the church has supported many outside organizations as well as church related functions. Mifflin prides itself in reaching out to all ages and interests.

As a result of the steady growth in the Gahanna area, the Reverend David Bubb,

both the congregation and those who might be looking for hope in challenging times. The efforts of the members to build up an online presence with streaming and social media was part of an article in the September 2020 issue of "Presbyterians Today"! pastor, along with talented staff and energetic volunteers, continue to faithfully serve the Mifflin Presbyterian Church family and the community through this challenging time.

To Register: https://synodofthecovenant.org/leadership-development-workshops Our Synod, the Synod of the Covenant, in cooperation with its presbyteries, is offering high quality leadership training to members of our presbytery. Racial Justice Training is one of these.

In this day and age, we can't afford to ignore the impact racism has had on our country and in our churches. Each of us needs to do our own work. In this program, each participant will take the Intercultural Development Inventory (IDI), which is the premier assessment of cross-cultural acumen, have a 1:1 debrief with a LeaderWise psychologist, and then participate in a ½ day workshop for the group led by 2 LeaderWise staff members who are certified to administer and teach the IDI. During this Zoom workshop, participants will learn more deeply about cross-cultural competence; constructions in in diversity, equity, and inclusion; reflect on their own opportunities for increasing competence; and begin to create their own development plan for increasing their competence.

You can receive a refund grant of \$75 (that is half the \$150 fee for the testing and individual consultation) if you also take part in a follow up meeting to discuss how to share what you learned with our presbytery. A Personal Comment: "This testing and consultation was part of a recent transitional ministry class that, I, Rev. Katie Kinnison, completed. Having interpretive feedback about my own inclinations allowed me to process the information in a much deeper and targeted way than

had I only learned the terminology. We need help to see our blind spots and this test is a valuable resource to do just that."
