### Grandview Heights Boulevard Presbyterian Church

Boulevard began in a typical formula: a

growing community, a desire for a church in its midst, committed individuals and help from the Presbytery and neighboring churches. As a result, the "little white church" was built on the present site and dedicated November 15, 1925. The Rev. I. Marshall Page first served the 138-member church.

As the church grew and mission outreach expanded, a new sanctuary was dedicated in 1951. At one time Boulevard was the largest church in the Presbytery. It's members have contributed significantly to the wider church over the years and continue to serve in key

### Granville First Presbyterian Church



The First Presbyterian

Church of Granville is one of the oldest churches in the state of Ohio. The settlers who founded the village of Granville organized a church before they left Massachusetts in 1805. One of their first tasks on reaching Granville was building the sanctuary and finding a minister. Inspired by the Second Great Awakening, these settlers saw themselves as part of a missionary movement. This spirit has shaped the history of the church and the village of Granville since the beginning.

The present church was built in 1860-61, and the Christian Education building was dedicated in 1968. In the autumn of 1997, a Capital Campaign was held and raised 1.2 million dollars in pledges to cover the continued building changes needed as the positions. Many members have followed a call into ministry.

Through efforts by several members of Boulevard, retirement centers were developed, including the establishment of National Church Residences.

Today, Boulevard continues its mission of "Reaching out to make Disciples" as it serves its congregation and the growing surrounding community. The Reverend Charlotte O'Neil is faithfully serving this congregation as the Transitional Pastor. congregation continues to serve its growing community.

This nearly 500-member active, welcoming and accepting congregation seeks to bring every age into discipleship, nurtures all of God's people, listens for God's call in the midst of all of life, and witnesses to the presence of God's Kingdom in the world. The Reverend Karen Chakoian, pastor, is faithfully serving this vibrant congregation in the midst of the delightful Granville community.

#### Commission for Congregational Life Technology Grant money is still available to Presbytery of Scioto Valley Congregations!

### Racial Justice Training Available for Scioto Valley...

Racial Justice Training is one of these. In this program, **each participant will take the Intercultural Development Inventory (IDI)**, which is the premier assessment of cross-cultural acumen, have a **1:1 debrief with a LeaderWise psychologist**, and then participate in a <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> day **workshop for the group led by 2 LeaderWise staff members who are certified to administer and teach the IDI**. During this Zoom workshop, participants will learn more deeply about cross-cultural competence; constructions in in diversity, equity, and inclusion; reflect on their own opportunities for increasing competence; and begin to create their own development plan for increasing their competence.

You can receive a refund grant of \$75 (that is half the \$150 fee for the testing and individual consultation) if you also take part in a follow up meeting to discuss how to share what you learned with our presbytery. Like many churches across America, First Presbyterian Church of Lake Charles, Louisiana, had long been on a downward spiral, struggling with an aging congregation, declining membership and dire financial concerns. Each year, the budget deficit expanded, insurance costs for the large gothic-style church building escalated and pledges plummeted. Cultural and demographic changes had also seeped into the social and spiritual fabric of their neighborhood, instigating a slow decline of the once-vibrant community of faith. #### We can do ministry together in ways we cannot do alone...

*by Chris Roseland, Lead Mission Engagement Advisor, PC(USA)* — Recently, the Office of the General Assembly released the **2020 annual statistics report** showing a decline in membership last year at just over 56,000, which is about the same loss rate as has been reported since 2016. For 2020, the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) counts a total membership of about 1.24 million members, with the total number of congregations at 8,925. Reflecting on the report, the Rev. Dr. J. Herbert Nelson, II, Stated Clerk of the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), said, "We are in the midst of rethinking what it means to do ministry in a rapidly changing landscape. Some people have been hurt by church, so there is a continuous struggle over what church should be. This is not just a PC(USA) problem. This is a challenge for all Christian denominations."

As we continue to grapple with the pandemic and how it will forever alter the church landscape, perhaps we should focus on some possible positive outcomes. As unprecedented energy continues to grow across the PC(USA) around the Matthew 25 invitation, I think now is the time for us to reflect on the abundance of God's grace and the possibilities of doing church in new ways. What better time than now to focus our attention on God's mission, perhaps even on the very vision given to us by Jesus Christ himself in Matthew 25. One of the best things about Matthew 25 is that we can do ministry together in ways we cannot do alone. The new and digital ways of doing ministry have also redefined for us and for everyone what community means. Immanuel Presbyterian Church in Los Angeles took out its pews to feed the hungry. That's community. First Presbyterian Church of Tecumseh, Michigan, dedicated the local share of its 2020 Pentecost Offering to seed a new ministry in Lenawee County for the advancement of BIPOC (Black, Indigenous and People of Color) youth and young adults. That's community. Nearly a year ago, I was invited by the Commission for Nurture and Outreach of the Presbytery of Scioto Valley to do a two-hour workshop on "Becoming a Matthew 25 Church." Since that time, the hunger has only grown for Matthew 25 resources, programming and best practices that congregations and presbyteries can emulate and follow. Let us together inspire our PC(USA) congregations and mid councils to think about how they can focus their attention on the goals of Matthew 25 so that their energy may flow. And flow abundantly!
