Highlights from the May 18 Presbytery Meeting...

The 258th Stated Meeting of the Presbytery of Scioto Valley gathered nearly 100 elders and pastors for the Zoom Meeting the afternoon of May 18. The meeting was convened with an inspirational prayer by Moderator Kae Merold.

In the midst of presbytery important business items, Commission reports, and inspiring worship, the Presbytery unanimously voted to move Bruce Miller from an inquirer to a candidate for the Ministry of Word and Sacrament. Bruce is a member of the Grove City First Presbyterian Church where he was baptized and raised.

The minimum compensation guidelines for pastoral leadership were approved for 2022.

Certified Ruling Elder Ann Moody was commissioned to serve congregations in the Hanging Rock Area of the Presbytery. Ann, an elder in the Gallipolis First Presbyterian Church, will be available for pulpit supply, celebrating the sacraments and moderating sessions in the southern (Hanging Rock) area of Scioto Valley.

Guests included the Reverend Chip Hardwick, Synod of the Covenant Executive, and the Reverend Doug Portz, PCUSA Board of Pensions Regional Liaison. Both guests brought greetings and gave interesting and informational reports.

For more information about this full meeting of the Presbytery, minutes will be available. A special word of thanks goes to the Reverend Bill Gause, newly installed Stated Clerk for the Presbytery. Bill carefully organized this meeting of the Presbytery. Gratitude also goes to Vice Moderator Bob Gustafson, and Reverend Doug Browne, technology support.

Presbytery of Scioto Valley Congregations Lifted Up in Prayer

The Commission for Congregational Life is committed to helping congregations promote and nurture healthy, faith-filled relationships and ministries in their congregations and communities. Our weekly Email news is highlighting our 88 congregations, celebrating their beginnings, histories, stories and ministries. We hope you and your congregation will join in celebrating our congregations and holding them in your prayers.

Grove City First Presbyterian Church

The first religious services in the Grove City community were conducted by the Reverend R.K. Davis, a Presbyterian minister, who came here with Mr. William Foster Breck, the village founder, in 1846. It was a part of this inter-denominational group that later formed the First Presbyterian Church in Grove City. The strength of integrity and determination thrives in the present, tempered by a warmly inclusive community with diverse outreach and mission goals.

The church was formally chartered in November 1858. A group of about sixteen members of the German Reformed Church, met in 1856 to petition the Presbytery of Columbus to allow them to organize a Presbyterian Church. Various church buildings housed this faithful congregation, including the "Highland Mission" (services first held in this log building), the "Old Brick Church", the Quonset hut, and the present building.

From at least 1931 through 1949, this was a joint pastorate with Galloway. The pastor lived most of that period in Galloway and had services every other Sunday in Grove City. The times were very lean, and it was hard paying a pastor, so there were several months between pastorates. In 1949 it was decided to try it as a single pastorate. With the help of National Mission aid to the supplement the minister's salary.

in 1997, the latest addition to the church, a new fellowship center, kitchen, additional classrooms, restrooms, overflow space at the rear of the sanctuary, and a large entry hall was dedicated.

The congregation has historically enjoyed strong lay leadership. Today the members of this vibrant congregation are faithfully led by the Reverend Robert Tolar.

Groveport Presbyterian Church

The history of the Groveport church can be traced to a home meeting held early in 1853. The meeting was held to organize a Presbyterian congregation in Groveport, and was attended by eleven people. What was lacking in numbers was made up in determination since the congregation was organized at this meeting.

The news spread rapidly, and within a short time, additional members were enrolled. A Presbyterian Church building was erected and dedicated in 1853. The site for the church was donated by the Reverend Fleming Solomon. The brick sanctuary portion of the building on College Street stands today as originally constructed and features lovely art glass windows. It is the oldest church in Groveport.

The cornerstone for a social hall was laid in 1949, and the facility was first used for the annual Easter Supper in 1951.

In 1959, the first full-time minister in the history of the church was called, the congregation previously sharing ministers with the Lithopolis, Greencastle and Madison Presbyterian Churches.

Groveport Presbyterian church has served its mission as a village congregation with a global perspective. Through the years, this congregation has provided Sunday morning worship services, a full range of youth and adult classes, women's associations, choral worship, bible study, support activities, mission outreach, and opportunities for community involvement. Today this historic and faithful small membership congregation with Commissioned Pastor Chris Piper and the assistance of the Presbytery will be celebrating the many years of serving the Groveport community.

Racial Justice Training Available for Scioto Valley...

Our Synod, the Synod of the Covenant, in cooperation with its presbyteries, is offering high quality leadership training to members of our presbytery. Racial Justice Training is one of these. In this program, each participant will take the Intercultural Development Inventory (IDI), which is the premier assessment of cross-cultural acumen, have a 1:1 debrief with a LeaderWise psychologist, and then participate in a ½ day workshop for the group led by 2 LeaderWise staff members who are certified to administer and teach the IDI. During this Zoom workshop, participants will learn more deeply about cross-cultural competence; constructions in in diversity, equity, and inclusion; reflect on their own opportunities for increasing competence; and begin to create their own development plan for increasing their competence.

You can receive a refund grant of \$75 (that is half the \$150 fee for the testing and individual consultation) if you also take part in a follow up meeting to discuss how to share what you learned with our presbytery. Changes are coming to Triennium, a lifechanging event for thousands of Presbyterian youth and young adults

A new venue and new way of being in small groups are designed to enhance the beloved event, which takes on a Matthew 25 focus by Mike Ferguson | Presbyterian News Service

LOUISVILLE — The 2022 version of Presbyterian Youth Triennium will feature <u>a Matthew 25 framework</u>, activities that will extend a full year following Triennium and enough innovation to send thousands of high schoolers and young adults scurrying to register — once registration goes live this winter.

Among other changes, organizers are moving the popular every-three-years event, set for July 24-27, 2022, from the campus of Purdue University, which has hosted Triennium since 1983, to a place where everyone involved can enjoy around-the-clock air conditioning: the <u>Indiana Convention Center</u> in Indianapolis, as well as at least eight nearby hotels, most of them connected to the convention center by pedestrian walkways. All attendees will enjoy their meals together in a large assembly hall at the convention center. Meals together will also include Bible study, games — and one of PYT's signature components, music.
