

Meet our program presenters.....

Cody F. Miller's paintings have been exhibited in solo and group exhibitions in galleries, art festivals, and museums. His work has been shown at the Toledo Museum of Art, the Columbus Museum of Art, the Dayton Centre Gallery, the International Arts & Music Festival in Los Angeles, the Viewpoint Gallery in Schenectady, New York, the Ohio Art League Gallery in Columbus, Ohio, the Johnson-Humrickhouse Museum in Coshocton, Ohio, the Gates of Eden Gallery in Peoria, Illinois, and the Artworks Gallery in Newark, Ohio. He



has also given lectures and shown his paintings at Adrian College in Adrian, Michigan, Grace Fellowship Church in Mansfield, Ohio, and Monroe County Community College in Monroe, Michigan.

Mr. Miller is the recipient of numerous awards and honors. He received an Ohio Arts Council Individual Artist Fellowship Award in 2002. He was awarded "Best of Show" at the Riverfront Art Festival in 2009 and "Award of Merit" in 2010, Third Place at the Art on the Mall Art Festival in 2009, First Place at Art by the Falls in 2004, "Best of Show" at the Westerville Music & Arts Festival in 2012 and 2001, First Place in Keybank's Accessible Expressions Exhibit in 2000 and "Best of Show" in the 1998 Exhibition.

Three of his paintings were published in "New Creative Collage Techniques," by Nita Leland. He designed and coordinated a community mural at the Vineyard's Urban Ministry Food Pantry in 2009; and he painted a mural at the Vineyard Community Center in 2007. He also collaborated on murals in a Chinese hospital for orphans in 1997. Cody Miller was born in Columbus, Ohio, in 1972, and resides there with his wife and two sons. He received his B.F.A. in 1995 from the Columbus College of Art and Design in Columbus, Ohio. Mr. Miller was the art instructor at Art Bridge Studio, a division of United Cerebral Palsy of Central Ohio for 16 years, and is currently a resident artist at the Goodwill Art Studio and Gallery.

Rev. Katie Kinnison is a familiar face to PWPSV which is our good fortune. She is an ordained Presbyterian pastor who has spoken at many PW events at Presbytery and Synod Gatherings, particularly to introduce the Horizons study. Formerly an Associate Pastor at Covenant, she provided monthly training for Bible study and constant encouragement for PW.

Bystander Intervention Training

(Free via Zoom, multiple days/times) - The one-hour, interactive training will teach you the 5D's of bystander intervention methodology. It will begin by talking about the types of disrespect that Asian and Asian American folks are facing right now — from microaggressions to violence — using a tool we call the "spectrum of disrespect." You'll learn what to look for and the positive impact that bystander intervention has on individuals and communities. Five strategies for intervention will be shared: distract, delegate, document, delay, and direct; and how to prioritize your own safety while intervening.

There will be time at the end of the training for practice, and you'll leave feeling more confident intervening the next time you see Anti-Asian/American harassment (or harassment towards anyone) online or in person.

MISSION INTERPRETATION - VM Lynn Coons

Mission: From the Latin word *mitto*, *mittere*, *missus*, meaning to send or sent. Specifically, a body of persons sent by a church to carry on religious work, esp. evangelization in foreign lands, and often to establish schools, hospitals, etc. (The Random House Dictionary of the English Language, Jess Stein, Editor in Chief, 1967)

I've been thinking a lot about mission since I volunteered to serve as VM for Mission Interpretation. Frankly, I've been doing a lot of remembering. How did I come to care so much about mission?

I've been exposed to mission since I was a child. One of my mother's childhood friends was a missionary to the Congo during the 1950's and early 1960's and Mom sent some of our gently used clothing to Marianne. The Levais were members of Old First Reformed Church in Passaic, NJ, the church where Mom (and I) grew up. Their son, Blaise (a good friend of Mom's though older), and his wife Marian, a doctor, went to India as missionaries. They'd come back from time to time and my brother and I got to play with their four towheaded kids while Blaise and Marian and Mom and Dad would talk – I'm certain about all their mission work. Though at the time I didn't really understand what any of them did, it clearly made a big impression on me. Mom and Dad gave me a biography about Ida Scudder, to my knowledge the first female medical missionary in India.

I was never privileged to go on a mission trip as a child as our kids were. However, I was encouraged to volunteer in our community. I worked as a candy-striper the summer I was 15 in a charity hospital in Paterson, NJ. I also tutored kids at a nearby church. I never thought of it before, but isn't that mission?

Mission. When did you first become aware of mission? When were you first involved with mission? Typically, we Presbyterians went abroad to plant schools and hospitals in order to turn people to God. We even did mission work here in the States. Today, I sense mission is much broader and more peace-filled. There are no more *Poisonwood Bibles*. At least I pray there are not. Rather than imposing our ways, we attempt to come alongside, to nourish people where they are and perhaps turn them to God by our love. And more and more I sense we're learning that those with whom we're in mission have a lot to teach us. Mission, a twoway street. God's love directs the traffic.



Some Solutions for Addressing Poverty -VM for Justice and Peace ,Susan Imel

I struggled with finding a topic for the Justice and Peace column in this newsletter. Issues related to justice and peace cover a broad spectrum: should the column address racism, voting rights, poverty, the continuing effects of the pandemic, gun violence, wrongful convictions, or another area? We read or hear about these areas and frequently don't know how we can make a difference. What actions can we take to address them?

A goal of a recent book, *Broke in America: Seeing, Understanding, and Ending U.S. Poverty,* is to help readers **see** poverty and then address it. The authors, Joanne Samuel Goldblum and Colleen Shaddox, begin the book with a chapter designed to "throw out the caricature" that many of us have about people in poverty. They maintain that poverty has been invisible to those who are not experiencing it. Goldblum, founder of the diaper project, and Shaddox, a journalist with a long history of "writing too many stories about poor people," have produced a book that examines the role of discrimination, sexism, and racism in trapping people in poverty.

The voices of those affected fill the book. Shane Ward, a former truck driver who had to give up driving due to a disability and to become his mother's full-time caregiver, says "I just want people to read this book to understand that we're not losers. We're not lowlifes. We're human beings that want everything in life just like everybody else." These voices put a face on poverty and the situations that create it.

Each chapter of the book ends with a section titled "What Can I do?" that contains a list of concrete steps that can be taken to address the chapter's topic. Suggestions range from making contact with policy makers to advocate for changes to providing direct services. One of the suggestions at the end of the hygiene chapter, for example, is to start or support a basic needs bank. This suggestion could be implemented by adding hygiene products to an existing food pantry, which some churches already do.

Covenant, the church I attend, has a food pantry that delivers and, after reading the chapter on hygiene, members of the book discussion group approached the food pantry coordinator about adding children's and adult diapers and feminine hygiene products to the pantry. Hygiene items were collected through a special drive and repackaged into a 3-day supply. Now when clients are contacted about their food delivery, they are asked if any of these items are needed. One client was nearly in tears when she learned she could get some adult diapers.

Broke in America can be used by individuals or groups seeking ways address issues related to poverty. Ask your church or local library to order a copy and/or form a book discussion group to talk about the book with others.

Survey – We want (need) your opinion!

PW/PSV understands that many PW groups were not able to meet last year and had no way to do the 2020-2021 PW Bible study on Lament (*Into the Light: Finding Hope through Prayers of Lament*). We would like to offer that study to any woman in our presbytery via Zoom this coming year. Although a start date has not been set, details about the time and frequency of the bible study will be based on the responses from those interested.

We would also like to offer the 2019-2020 PW Bible study on the Ten Commandments (*Love Carved in Stone*) if there is enough interest. This would probably not start until early 2022. Again, a start date has not been set and details about the time and frequency of the bible study will be based on the responses from those interested.

We would also like to offer the use of our PW/PSV Zoom account to PW groups to use for regularly scheduled meetings.

Another idea is to offer book discussions via Zoom. We would like to do three or four of these throughout the year to connect women across our presbytery. Once we decide on books and leaders, we would advertise a time for these. If there is enough interest we might offer both daytime and evening groups.

We would like to bring special speakers to our presbytery via zoom for conversation and questions. There may be a small cost to attend these depending on the cost of the speaker. Or maybe bring someone in to do a program that they have offered elsewhere (such as portrayal of a biblical woman or a specific bible story).

We're even thinking about an overnight retreat. Cost for room and board would be charged at minimum. We would probably look at March 2022 on a Friday evening until late afternoon on Saturday for the retreat.

The CT (PW/PSV Coordinating Team) is interested in finding ways to get more women interested in PW. Forming a task group to focus on ideas is one way to approach this.
