Dear Presbyterian Women,

I was truly overjoyed with the registration count of 53 for the Summer Gathering and 19 from our presbytery (out of a total of 91) – which is more than any other presbytery – for the PW Synod of the Covenant Gathering. We have now completed the past four gatherings via Zoom and will have at least two more (Fall and Winter) before we possibly get back together in person. Keeping everyone healthy is the bottom line.

From conversations among CT members, we know that not all of you have email or internet connectivity. And this is especially true for many of our older population. So I want to encourage you to seek out younger folks in your church who have the equipment to Zoom and ask them to either help you get Zoom working or to share their equipment with you so you can participate in our gatherings. Maybe your church has those capabilities and someone there could get zoom working for you. Those of you who have internet capabilities but have never zoomed before, please let me help you learn how. I am willing to work with you individually to connect and get comfortable with this technology. Please let me know that you want to learn how to Zoom!

I also want to reiterate the fact that this newsletter goes out to women all across our presbytery and some of your churches have disbanded your PW groups over the past few years. This does NOT mean that you can't be part of our PW/PSV Gatherings and support PW in various ways. You many still make a PW Mission Pledge (see the form on the PW webpage or contact me for a form), work through the Bible study on your own and support our PW Presbytery Mission Project (stay tuned for this forthcoming information). If you are close enough to another church you might inquire as to whether or not they have a PW group and ask to join with them.

I miss seeing you. I miss worshiping with you. I miss having lunch with you. Yet, we can still have meaningful gatherings that bring the needs of the world to our doorsteps. We couldn't have zoomed our gatherings 10 years ago, or even 5 years ago. Thank you, God, for Zoom and how it allows us to keep meeting!

INVITATION TO FALL GATHERING

It was the last Wednesday in Lent prior to Holy Week just a few years ago. Dr. Julie Faith Parker had been leading classes for three weeks during Lent and this was the only one I was able to attend. She spoke of her work in Sing - Sing Prison in NY, teaching classes and getting the prisoners to write, and how transformative it was for them and her. Then she spoke of her

work right here in Orient, OH at Pickaway Correctional Institution. She was teaching her Old Testament Class from Trinity Lutheran Seminary to the prisoners at PCI and asked for volunteers to help with small groups. For much of my adult life, I'd wondered if and how I might do prison ministry. It was a calling that I heard repeatedly from Matthew 25: 36: I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me. I signed up and I was hooked. The men knew the Bible better than I did. They could quote chapters and verses and recite like I never could. It was truly the Word that sustained them. Here I thought I could help them, but I found them helping me!

When Julie left Trinity, three of us carried on her work spending time with the men, reminding them that they're not forgotten; that people on the outside do care; that God loves them and forgives them no matter what; that no matter what might have happened in their lives, they were and continued to be children of God. We read Scripture together, prayed together, studied together, sang together. All came to a screeching halt due to Covid in March of 2020. We haven't been able to return to our work or communicate with any of our brothers since then lest we be permanently forbidden to return. So, we continue to worry and pray about our brothers – who might have died, how are they carrying on without any of the volunteers from the outside allowed to visit?

Since the gates of PCI are closed to us both literally and figuratively (reaching out to the chaplains proved fruitless), it was a true Godsend to learn through Muriel Ballou of Lancaster First of Steve Telfer's ministry at the Multi-County Juvenile Detention Center in Lancaster. Steve will speak to us at our Fall Gathering of his life's work in juvenile justice in Central Ohio and how we can make a difference in the young people's lives who, like the men in PCI, have been largely thrown away by society. Muriel will also speak on a more personal note.

Muriel Ballou, Ruth Cooper, Alice Harker, and I, the members of the Mission Interpretation Committee, invite you to attend this year's Fall Gathering. May we share Shalom with our young people who have lost their way but are still, most definitely, God's children!

- ★ The Gathering Team will then purchase the books (*The Case for Christ*, Goosebumps, Holes, Diary of Anne Frank, etc. a total of over 50 books in very specific quantities for each site), games (Jenga, Yahtze, Rook, Uno, Trouble, etc.), and Cheryl's Cookies requested very specifically and in specific numbers.

Once purchased, the items will be disseminated with Steve's help to the three centers during the month of November.

AND THIS IS JUST THE BEGINNING! As part of an on-going all PW/PSV Mission Project, we will have in-gatherings at all three of the Spring Gatherings during this Triennium of Martha Pool's leadership. We will be collecting backpacks and toiletries for the young men and women as they are released. More details as to size of backpack and specific items to be included will follow, but we thought you should know so you can begin to prepare to be part of this special work!

Youth at our Southern Border - Martha Pool, Moderator

Since our Fall Gathering is focused on youth detention centers in our presbytery, it seemed appropriate to also check in with the larger church to see what was happening to unaccompanied youth at U.S./Mexican border. Susan Krehbiel, Associate for Refugees and Asylum for Presbyterian Disaster Assistance, has provided the following ways to hear those stories.

I think the best overview of what happens to unaccompanied children at the border is shared through this webinar by Lutheran Immigration & Refugee Service. It was done in March 2021, but much of what they describe and address continues. And it gives an excellent overview of what is supposed to happen.

Lutheran Immigration & Refugee Service (<u>lirs.org</u>), US Committee for Refugees & Immigrants (USCRI) and others provide post-release services to unaccompanied children.

USCRI also has a video from May about their work that also describes the types of shelters that serve children after they are released from the Border Patrol stations/border offices.

Like a lot of women, blogger Osheta Moore loved the idea of shalom: God's dream for a world that is whole, vibrant, and flourishing. But honestly: who's got the time? So one night she



whispered a dangerous prayer: God, show me the things that make for peace... In Shalom Sistas, Moore shares what she learned when she challenged herself to study peace in the Bible for forty days. Taking readers through the twelve points of the Shalom Sistas' Manifesto, Moore experiments with practices of everyday peacemaking and invites readers to do the same. From dropping "love bombs" on a family vacation, to talking to the coach who called her son the n-word, to spreading shalom with a Swiffer, Moore offers bold steps for crossing lines between black and white, suburban and urban, rich and poor.

SHALOM!

Thanks to all who participated in the Summer Gathering! Both of our speakers provided us with good information about AND insight into this year's Bible Study, "What My Grandmothers Taught Me". Here are some of my "Seeking Shalom" thoughts.

As I listened to Cody Miller, the artist for the Bible study, he says that he creates a life-like, playfulness in his art, as well as, sadness, letting God guide and direct him. As he spotlights Tamar in Lesson 2, her eyes say "don't judge me"! *She is seeking Shalom!* He told us that he uses string and yarn and birds and butterflies to represent the journey of life. In Lesson 7, his work shows Mary and Joseph and the baby Jesus, "happy" in bed, like one of those Saturday mornings, with a butterfly! *Shalom!*

Rev. Katie Kinneson gave us a snapshot of each of the 9 Bible Study lessons, and tips for discussion, reflection and on ways to Seek Shalom right here PW/PSV! In Lesson 1, she told us to study AND use the opening prayer to Seek Shalom. Even a suggestion to play Joni Mitchell's song "Woodstock"! In Lesson2, suggestions included researching "Catch Court", as well as "John's Court", both involving prostitution in the Scioto Valley. Seeking Shalom! Prostitute, sex worker, sex slave, trafficked women—What kind of God do we have? Words and a question for Lesson 3, Rahab: Socially Unacceptable Outsider—Seeking Shalom!

I'm excited about this year's Bible Study. I want to dig into the tips, the suggestions, the questions for further discussion and what else can I see in the art work! And, as I tabulated the Summer Gathering evaluations, more words in *Seeking Shalom* were revealed:

It's Not Your Grandmother's PW Anymore - Louise Davidson

Did you know that Presbyterian Women's groups don't all look the same? Well, of course not, because, well, they never did. But there was a certain structure - coordinating team (board), leaders (officers) in positions such as moderator (president), vice moderators (vice presidents) of studies, mission, and justice and peace, treasurer, secretary, gathering planner, circle leaders, and others. And usually, circles studied the Bible study and helped with mission projects and events in their churches.

But honestly, this is not working for most of us anymore. There is too much structure for most of us with women juggling families, jobs and homes. The Churchwide PW knows this and has an updated manual (\$6, link below) to assure you that about anything is possible for PW today.

What might the women in your church be interested in doing together, especially given the COVID situation? Get together for lunch regularly outside in good weather or indoors when it is safe again? Knit prayer shawls? Read and discuss books? Horizons publishes a book list. Have a girls' night at the movies? Have a retreat when we feel safe again? Exercise together regularly? Choose a mission project to support regularly?

While it is traditional to have the structure and a pattern of what we do together, what we really care about is being together in community. Because we have a loving, ever-present God, it is in community we can experience that love most clearly. Your "coordinating team" might be someone to get everyone together, another to keep a list of activities, and if there are funds involved, another to keep track of that.

It is important, too, to support the Mission Pledge, PW's annual fund. Be sure to connect with your Presbytery PW and the Synod PW. They offer programs to expand our horizons to see our connectional church is making a difference all around us.
