Presbytery Meetings on Sundays...

As those of you who attended the November Presbytery meeting know, at the recommendation of the PSV Coordinating Team, the Presbytery voted to hold meetings twice this year on Sunday afternoons. One of the ongoing concerns of the Coordinating Team has been the apparent inability of ruling elders whose jobs or family responsibilities do not permit them to attend weekday afternoon meetings of the Presbytery. Coordinating Team believes that increasing the diversity of elder commissioners at Presbytery meetings, as well as their number, is a value we all share. A little more than a decade ago, for a couple of years, the Presbytery tried several Saturday meetings. This experiment did not lead to increased attendance or diversity in elder commissioners. The feedback we received was that Saturdays were full of family responsibilities, and not ideal for attending Presbytery meetings. The proposal brought in November is another attempt to address the same issue. It is an experiment we hope folks will try to allow to succeed. We also welcome your ideas on other approaches to increasing attendance and diversity at Presbytery meetings. We look forward to this conversation!



January is always an exciting time. We kick off the new
year with high hopes that it's going to be better than last
year. However, it's also a time to "look back" at how we did
last year. January is when John Wyckoff, the Presbytery's
Financial Assistant, and Bob Patterson, Presbytery

Treasurer, close out our books to end the prior year (2021). This year we have good news to report - the Presbytery was able to close out 2021 with a small budget SURPLUS as opposed to the projected deficit of just over \$50,000. How did we do this you might ask. Thanks to the generous support of our member congregations, we collected 80% of the budgeted (allocated) per capita for 2021. This compares with collections that have historically ranged in the 75% range. Thanks to all of you who so generously supported per capita this past year – despite the challenges of the ongoing pandemic. You were also generous in your support of Missions during 2021 and while we didn't set any records for giving, we did have very strong support of Mission giving. Again, despite the challenges of the pandemic, we, as Presbyterians, continue to support those who are less fortunate than us. On behalf of the Commission for Presbytery Operations (CPO) and the Presbytery of Scioto Valley, we thank-you all for your generous support during 2021. Let's pray that we get back to some sense of normalcy during 2022 and that we have a great year ahead of us.

Film critic selects his top 10 films for 2021...

Dr. Edward McNulty's annual list is rich with films imbued in moral and spiritual content | Special to Presbyterian News Service

The COVID-19 pandemic continued to disrupt or postpone the releases of some films during 2021. With theaters closed during part of the year, some new releases were viewed on various platforms via streaming video. Although this has meant that I have not been able to catch all the new films, I have seen enough to compile a long enough list of candidates that still make paring down the list to 10 a pleasantly painful process. As in the past, the films below do more than just entertain us. They explore the life worth living, celebrate the human spirit, challenge accepted norms, open our eyes to new beauty and truths, and maybe warn us of or show us "the wages of sin." Several will be on the lists of the secular critics, but others will be less familiar. Although aesthetics and popularity are considered, the moral/spiritual content of the film is the main consideration. The Bible references are from my original reviews,

intended to help the reader make a connection between insights of the filmmaker and the ancient wisdom of the Scripture writers. To explore a film further, click on the title, and the embedded link will take you to the full review.
