Personally, like many others, I've grown a bit tired of so many online Zoom meetings, so I decided not to lead an online class, even as I'm grateful to John and Jack for doing so. However, I have been looking forward to a time we can get back together to renew in-person adult education opportunities at Westminster.

It also helps, in my experience, to meet with others to discuss this important book, as the discussions I've been a part of with this study tend to be very personal and honest.

Due to the ongoing nature of the pandemic, we will be following current masking guidelines.

On a final note, I have not forgotten about the Acts class we began just at the start of the pandemic. I would like to begin that again, but it may follow sometime after Job.

Thank you for your interest, and again, we'll let you know when the class begins.



MEMORIAL CROSS WALL IN WPC

We are happy to tell you about a new ministry of WPC-a Memorial Cross Wall which will be located in the hallway before reaching the South X. This will become a sacred space in the church as we remember loved ones who have died-A remembrance of Saints. This will be an ongoing ministry of the church. Here are some guidelines about the Cross Wall:

- The crosses are not just for church membersyou may have a cross hung for a parent(s), siblings, spouses, loved ones. The person may have died many years ago or recently.
- Please make sure crosses are easy for us to hang and no bigger than 18 inches. You get to pick and purchase your own cross.
- 3. There are 4 of us who will be hanging the crosses and we will be writing in a memorial book which will be in the hallway. Each cross will be assigned a number and this number will be on the back of the cross. The number will coincide with the same number in the memorial book so folks can read the memorial about the cross.
- 4. If you would like to bring a cross to be hung on the Memorial Wall please bring it to the church office with your name on it. Also, include what you would like written in the book. Some examples would be: In memory of my husband, Kenneth, from Ruby McLeland. Please remember that we will be hanging the crosses and we will be writing in the Memorial Book. This will keep our Cross Wall organized. You may start to bring crosses in August and we will start hanging them soon after. If you have any questions please contact one of us.
