Are You Ready to Recycle Plastics Again?

Starting November 14, after church, Creation Care Ministry hopes to offer monthly collection of clean and washed #2, #4 and #5 tubs, jugs, bottles, lids and beverage handles CLEAN and free of debris. Collection day details will follow.

Here are Lane County's requirements: Clean and label-free plastics must be sorted into the following five categories: #2 bottles & jugs; #2 tubs and lids, #2 beverage handles; #4 bottles, tubs & lids; #5 bottles, tubs & lids. Dirty plastic or plastics other than #2, #4, and #5 will not be accepted. All material must have a stamped resin code and labels must be removed. If you can't read the code, rub it lightly with a pencil and use a magnifying glass. If you can lift the corner of a label with your fingernail, it needs to be removed, along with the adhesive. Some

paper and plastic labels require soaking. The best method is to apply a generous coating of cheapest cooking oil to the label and let it sit overnight on a tray. By morning it is easier to remove the label. Any tubs or jugs that have 'heat stamped' labels (e.g. laundry detergent) cannot be and do not need to be removed. Clear labels like those found on shampoo bottles need to be removed. Some yogurt cups have shrink wrapped labels that must be removed. For more detailed
