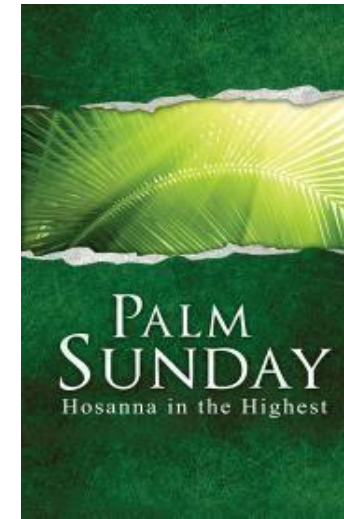

## SCRIPTURE READINGS

*Old Testament Reading: Psalm 118:1-2, 19-29*
