Hot! Hot! Every day I hear something about the hot weather. I watch the weather forecast at least once and sometimes three times a day. "Everyone talks about the weather but no one does anything about it," was contributed to Mark Twain. However, research indicates that Charles Dudley Warner, editor at the Hartford Courant, may have used it earlier than Mark Twain. Reference to Twain was in 1905 whereas Warner used it as early as 1889.

Regardless, we have weather all the time and we (humans) like to complain about things we have no control over.

That sounds like me! I remember those July and August hot days in the tobacco fields. One year, dad's rows of tobacco seemed like they were 5 miles long. Actually, they were only about 6 blocks long. The flowers in the top were to be removed, called topping. In between each leaf another little tobacco plant grew which needed to be removed in order to produce quality tobacco. Of course, many of you know removing this little plant is called "suckering."

As we began the task of topping and suckering (which I thought was crazy) it appeared we would never reach the other end of those long rows. Looking at the other end of the row and across the field was a daunting feeling—we will never get there, so I thought.

I have since discovered if I focus only on the outcome then I miss the importance of the journey. The journey may be difficult at times but necessary to have the desired outcome. For example, the weeks and months planning a vacation often brings more joy than the vacation itself.

As a church family, it's important to remember the journey (living today) is where we find the meaning of life. A pastoral transition for churches creates anxiety and could lead to unhealthy shortcuts. I am convinced that if we do our work appropriately, we will have the right outcome.

I needed to be reminded how important the tedious work on each hill of tobacco was for quality outcome. Likewise, trusting the leadership of the Holy Spirit will guide us in our journey. I am thankful to be in journey with you at this time and place.

- Jack Perry and Ike Amerson along with two representatives from Covenant Homes came to discuss the many needs at Covenant Homes. They requested that the Church make a donation to Covenant Homes.
- The Mission Tithe Committee made a recommendation and the session voted unanimously to donate \$25,000 from the Mission Tithe portion of the capital campaign to Covenant Homes to use for updates to the property including new windows, heating and air upgrades, roofing repairs and renovations.
- The Nomination Committee met Sunday, July 23 at 3:00 to nominate church officers for the Diaconate and Session
- The Interim Pastor Search committee reported that they have met and are finalizing the paperwork to submit to the presbytery so that they may begin searching for a permanent interim pastor. The committee consists of Beth Steed, Joe Brown, Sylvia Phillips, Betsy McLean and Tim Hathaway.
- Further discussion was had regarding the special gifts committee and the best way to use those funds to further the mission of the church. Should you have any recommendations for the special gifts committee, please reach out to Clif Hayworth. If you have not completed your survey, you may do so online or pick up a hard copy from Dionne at the church office.
- The Property committee reported that the majority of the work being done to the sanctuary, narthex, vestibule and chapel is complete.

PW Circles and their Leadership

Presbyterian Women meet at the congregation level in "circles." No matter what the activities, as long as women meet to build community, support mission, nurture faith and/or work for justice and peace, those women are forming a "circle." No matter how many or how few activities a women's circle undertakes, if they do it on behalf of the PW Purpose, they are a PW circle. Leadership in single-circle groups at the congregational level ideally consists of a moderator (to provide

leadership to the circle and ensure communication among the members and with the congregation and session); a secretary/historian to record the work of the circle; and a treasurer to maintain the financial records of the circle. But PW is flexible! Circles don't have to be called circles and a team can have leaders who "wear more than one [leadership] hat."


- The Presbyterian Women Coordinating Team will meet on Monday, August 7 at 10:30 a.m. in the History Room.




