Tar River Academy

The following supplies are appreciated: school supplies, non-perishable food items, hygiene items, and baby supplies. Donations can be placed in the blue tote labeled Tar River Academy found in the Narthex.

A student who attends Tar River Academy recently lost her home to fire, including everything in the house. There are multiple generations living together including a one-year old and a 2-month old. The family is living in a motel until they find another house to move into. Tar River Academy is accepting donations of the following items for this family: all new kitchen and bathroom supplies. Pots, pans, glass cooking bowls that can go into a microwave, a microwave, utensils, towels, washcloths, cleaning supplies, pillows, linens, etc. The 1-year-old wears 12-24 mos. clothes and size 5 diaper. The infant is in 3 mos. clothes and size I diaper. They could use some microwavable food items and easy to eat items such as pop tarts etc. Items can be brought to the church volunteer office—please mark TRA family.

Annual reports are not always easy, but when you see the positive things PW are doing, it is a delight to be a part of such an awesome organization.

- We co-hosted, with the help of the other four (4) RMT churches, the Area Fall Gathering with the largest attendance of all three (3) gatherings.
- We co-hosted the Spring Gathering, also with the other RMT churches helping, one of the most successful gatherings we have had in some time. To quote one of the many positive evaluations, "the Best Gathering I have ever attended."

Some people think of Christmas as a "Season of Giving", but PW are always in a "season of giving".

- Our Thank Offering, Birthday Offering, and the Fellowship of the Least Coin offering, are well supported in our church.
- Our CWS medicine kits are a world wide relief support
- Children's Hope Alliance is a personal touch to children in NC
- We have been made aware of Human Trafficking as a problem in our own area, state and nation and we are working with agencies to help these victims to readjust their lives.
- In RMT, Nash and Edgecombe counties, we support My Sister's House, Communities in Schools, Tar River Academy, Conetoe Family Life Center.
- We use the sale of Easter lilies to support our Littrell-Thorpe Scholarship. This helps provide scholarships for our college bound youth. Only three applied this year and all three were granted a scholarship.
- The Prom Closet has been a big success in our local schools for both young boys and girls.

Our Bible Study from Hebrews has been exceptionally good, thanks to Bettie Kirkpatrick, Chris Feno, Mary Lou Fountain, Mary Perry, and Betsy Newton. The faith, the joy and the energy present was astounding! The love of God and our Lord was felt strongly. Also, the feeling of community was emphatic. We are grateful and appreciate the honor even through we felt it undeserved.

Your assistance throughout the year is beyond measure. With your support, we graduated 26 students in January and will graduate 46 at the end of this week. This includes 11 teen parents; 8 students who are homeless; 31 who are identified EC (exceptional children with an individualized educational plan due to a learning disability, cognitive limitation, emotional/behavioral diagnoses, etc.); 3 who are ESL (English as a Second Language); I who was moved here due to being a victim of human trafficking; 39 who are overage and behind their graduating cohort (34 are 19 years old and 5 are 20 years old). We have 4 students who have enlisted with the military, 16 enrolling with the community college, 1 enrolling at Livingstone College, Salisbury, NC, and a large number who have found employment in the community. These are all students who were at risk for dropping out of the traditional high schools but now have a diploma.
